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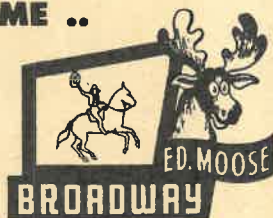
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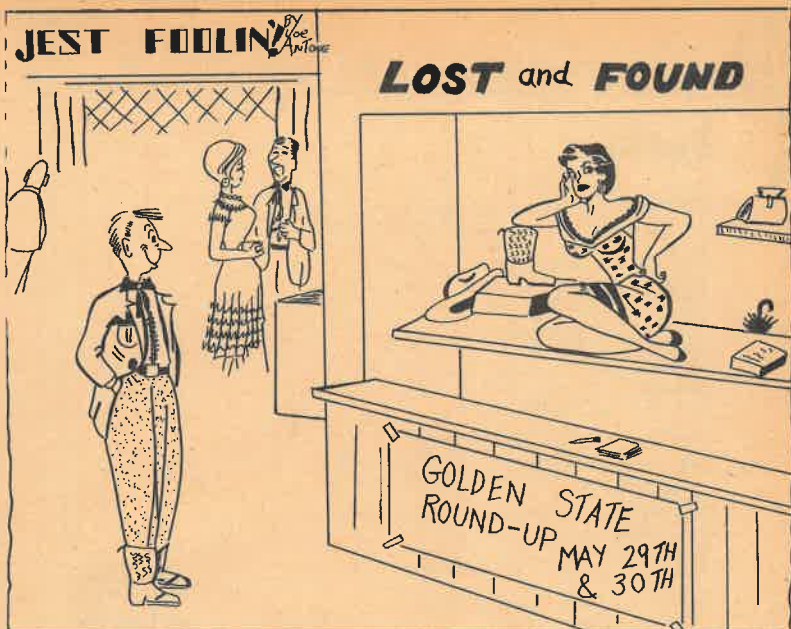

IT'S ROUND UP TIME AGAIN!!

WHEEZES LARRY BUTZER

It's Round-up time again! Square Dancing time in this area is measured by the Annual Golden State Round-up and, believe it or not, another year has passed. For those responsible for the 12th repeat of this nationally famous event the year has probably been far too short. As curtain time nears there will be many last minute chores, many questions to answer, and many final decisions to make. Then as the overture is played, calling all Square Dancers, and the first of the many fine local callers takes the mike, this grand production is underway and, as usual, it will proceed to the grand finale like a well oiled machine.

Have you, the average Square Dancer ever taken time out to wonder what goes on behind the scenes? What goes on each year that results in a Square Dance event that is continually listed among the top three in the nation? Let's take a look at part of a typical year.

First, you must realize that even though the production is professional in every sense of the word, it is put on by a group of dedicated amateurs. Amateurs who gain their experience by working on various committees for three or four years before they finally take charge.

The Round-up is sponsored by the N. C.S.D.A. and its President accepts full responsibility for all the details of organization. Normally a meeting of the Executive Board of the Association is held shortly after each Round-up for the purpose of picking to pieces the dance in an attempt to improve on the next one. This is the first of many meetings but, as a rule, all future meetings will include all Chairmen of the various committees.

The first major decision of the President is his choice of a Program Chairman, picked from the N.C.S.D.A. This office is filled with responsibility since he is assigned the task of contacting name callers across the nation, listening to numerous tapes, and finally with the approval of the President, selecting the four principal callers for the two evening dances. In addition he aids in selecting the Round Dance teams and sets up the list of local callers for the daytime dancing.

Next the President names the Chairmen of the several committees, such as Decorations, Breakfast, Reception, After-Party, etc. Each of these Chairmen will hold several meetings with his crew and of course the President will be in attendance.

In the meantime each board member has been assigned a duty. Two of the most thankless jobs are those of the Hall Manager and the Program. The Hall Manager is the one who makes all the arrangements for the Auditorium and the various and sundry things that make the dance complete. Displays by merchants? He arranged for them. Bottled water? He set them up and keeps full ones in the rack. Seating arrangement, stage, rooms for panels, first aid—you name it and you will find the Hall Manager has already taken care of it.

The program that you get is the final result of hours of arranging and proof reading. It has the latest deadline of all. The chewed fingernails and nervous tic of the left eye are caused by last minute changes before it goes to press. Then, the most horrible thought of all—will the printer get them out on time? He will!

Arrangements must be made for tickets for advanced registration and sales at the door. Then the Breakfast, a mammoth job in itself. Location must be picked, menu decided on, decorations made, seating planned and a must—plenty of coffee.

Friday night after the Trail Dance the Decorations crew moves in and goes to work. Several hours later in the wee small hours of the morning they crawl out leaving an auditorium that will put you in a Square Dancing mood.

To try and detail every single thing that is done by those on the Round-up Committees would be foolish—there isn't enough room. To try and show the number of hours that is put in would be just as foolish—I don't know a number that big. After it is all over Sunday night all the individuals who worked so hard won't ask for thanks—all they are concerned about is—"Did you have a good time?"

To all those wonderful people who gave of their time and talents and particu-

lary to Dick Crooke, Florence Roberts, Mark & Fran Bates may we from Square Dance-Where? wish you success in your endeavor to put on the "Best Round-up yet."
