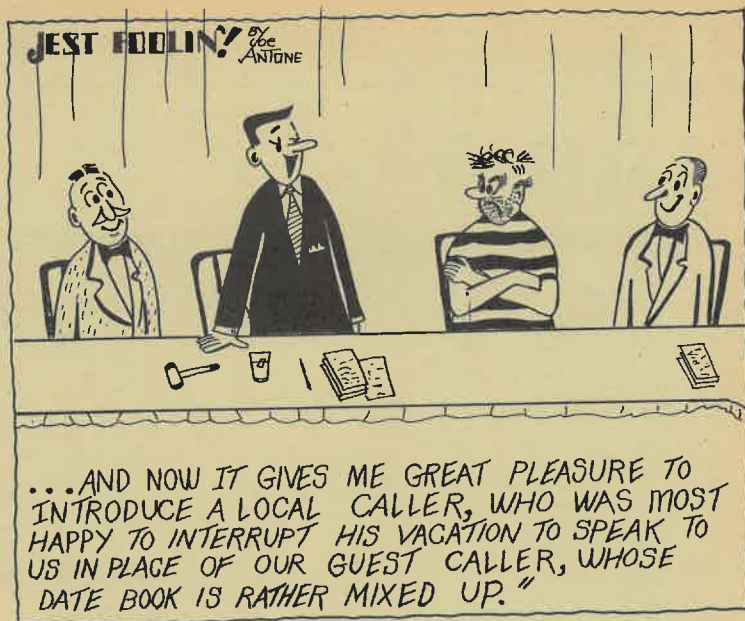

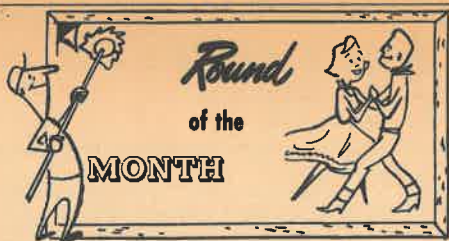

## GOLDIE'S WALTZ

By Ev & Amy Kuhn, Nelson, B.C., Canada

RECORD: "Goldie's Waltz" - Windsor 4703  
 POSITION: Open-facing, trailing hands (M's R & W's L) joined  
 FOOTWORK: Opposite throughout, Directions are for M.  
 MEASURES INTRODUCTION

1 - 4 WAIT; WAIT; BAL APT, TCH,-; BAL TOG, TCH, -;

In Open-Facing Pos wait 2 meas.; Step back from ptr twd COH on L, tch R to L, -; Bal tog & slightly twd RLOD on R, extending joined hands (M's R & W's L twd RLOD, tch L to R, -).

### DANCE

1 - 4 WALTZ AWAY; WALTZ TOGETHER; STEP, SWING,-; SPIN MANEUVER;

Starting M's L ft waltz away from ptr prog LOD swinging joined hands thru twd LOD; Starting M's R waltz tog prog LOD swinging joined hands back down & thru twd RLOD; M steps diag fwd twd COH on L, swing R XIF of L, swinging the joined hands thru twd LOD; Swinging the joined hands back down twd RLOD & then releasing the M starts the W in a solo LF spin - the M then maneuvers to CP (R,L,R) to end with his back twd LOD.

5 - 8 WALTZ TURN; WALTZ TURN; WALTZ TURN; TWIRL (to Open-Facing);

In CP starting bwd on M's L do 3 RF turning waltzes prog LOD; Twirl the W RF as the M follows stepping R, L, R to end in OPEN-FACING POS.

9 - 16 WALTZ AWAY; WALTZ TOGETHER; STEP, SWING, -; SPIN MANEUVER;

WALTZ TURN; WALTZ TURN; WALTZ TURN; WALTZ TURN (to CP);

Repeat action of Meas 1 - 4; Then, do 4 RF turning waltzes prog LOD to end in CP M facing LOD.

17 - 20 TWINKLE OUT; TWINKLE IN; TWINKLE OUT; CROSS, TCH, -;

In CP starting M's L do 3 twinkle steps moving diag out twd wall & LOD then diag in twd COH & LOD (M XIF, W XIB); At end of 3rd twinkle step the M steps R across L twd COH & LOD, tch L beside R, -.

21 - 24 (Bwd) TWINKLE OUT; TWINKLE IN; TWINKLE OUT; CROSS, TCH, -;

Starting M's L repeat twinkle steps moving in RLOD (M XIB, W XIF); At end of 3rd twinkle step M cross R XIB of L, tch L beside R, -(M facing LOD & PTR).

25 - 28 BALANCE BACK, TCH,-; TURN,TCH,-; VINE,2,3; MANEUVER,2,3;

M balances back on L, tch R to L, -; Do 1/4 RF turn to face wall on R, tch L to R,-; Step to side in LOD on L, behind on R, to side on L; Step thru in LOD on R & do a waltz maneuver making a 1/4 RF waltz turn to end with M's bk twd LOD (R,L,R).

29 - 32 WALTZ TURN; WALTZ TURN; WALTZ TURN; TWIRL;

Repeat action of Meas 5-8.

DANCE ENTIRE ROUTINE THREE TIMES THRU. On 3rd time thru, substitute the following for Meas 29 - 32:

29 - 32 WALTZ TURN; WALTZ TURN; TWIRL; ACKNOWLEDGE;

In CP starting bwd on M's L do 2 RF turning waltzes prog LOD; Twirl W once RF under joined leading hands (M's L & W's R); Step apart and acknowledge.

# The Big Area Affairs

## LARRY BUTZER

I have just spent two successive weekends of square dancing. One at the State Convention in Bakersfield and one at the Golden State Round-up in Oakland. If I were to make a comparison I would have to say, speaking from a dancers viewpoint, the Round-Up was far the better dance.

I believe it was better because its format is built around the theme of pleasing the dancer. This format is the result of twelve years of proven results and all the "good" and all the "bad" is passed on from one Round-Up Chairman to the next in the form of a Round-Up book. I believe it was better because it is more or less a smaller "area" dance—it does not depend on the whole state for its crowd. Most people who danced at the Round-Up were dancing with the friends they have made through dancing in this area.

I believe it was better because it is run by a local Dancers Association assisted by the local Callers Association and each of the individuals involved have had several years experience of working on just this one major dance. I believe it was better because it offered a variety of fine local callers plus some of the top talent in the United States in the form of the four featured callers, two on Saturday night and two on Sunday night.

I believe it was better because the dancer did not have to make a six to eight hundred mile trip to attend the dance. But—most of all I believe it was better because we in this area can put on this nationally famous dance in our own way without outside interference.

By outside interference I mean the pressure exerted on the Dancers Association in whose area the dance is held. Pressure exerted by the State Council. Before an Association is GRANTED THE PRIVILEGE of having the State they must first submit a request to the State Council and then submit their plans for approval. These plans must follow a pre-determined format set up by the Council. After the Association has been given permission to stage a State Convention the members of that Association are then ALLOWED to do all the work involved.

As an example—are you in favor of charging a fee for spectators? Why miss a golden opportunity to advertise Square Dancing. Are you in favor of exhibition groups showing their wares on a small stage in the middle of a windblown field? After all, these people spend many hours working to attain the perfection they show and they should be allowed to dance on a respectable floor before an audience. Are you in favor of paying fifty cents for a program? Has the profit

motive overcome the desire to please the dancer?

All the above may not be the fault of the State Council but if they are going to ALLOW an Association to put on a State Convention and set up rules for the running of that convention then they certainly should check to see that it is run in a manner that is good for Square Dancing and the Square Dancer.

Some of the callers should evaluate their integrity. How is it possible for a caller to have his name listed in the program and then not show up? Why is it necessary for an MC to have a full hour program and have to grab any footloose caller to fill it? This may well be one of the reasons some of the callers were calling to as few as two squares.

Maybe the State Convention has outlived its usefulness and purpose. There are several truly good large Square Dance events each year throughout the state. To name a few we have the Fiesta De La Quadrilla in San Diego, the Whing Ding in Santa Clara, the Squar-Rama in Fresno, the Golden State Round-Up in Oakland, and the Harvest Hoe-down in Sacramento. This pretty well covers the state and is one reason the dancers are less prone to travel long distances. Why travel when you have a better dance at home?

So—maybe the State Council should take a long look at the picture of Square Dancing throughout the state and turn the major dances over to the various local Associations. After all, these people CAN put on a successful dance—they have proved it many times.

To those who worked on the Round-Up—  
I know that you were granted your wish!  
See you around?
