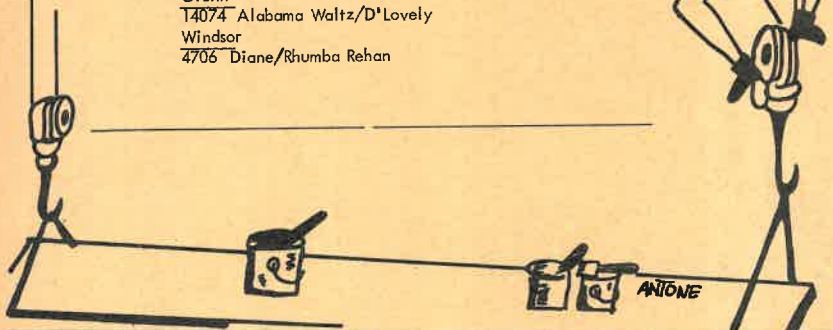

passed on.

The end result of this was that, in most cases, all callers were teaching the same new basics at the same time. A dancer could dance to any caller and know that he would not be asked to do something he had never heard of. But now we have a rather unique situation. The callers have become individualists. In plain English, "I'll teach what I think should be taught."

If on some particular workshop night the caller had a beautiful corn and was wearing new shoes or if he showed up with the great-grandfather of headaches (?), and the dispenser next to the water cooler is fresh out of cups, then he is just as liable to spend a lot of time teaching some intricate basic THAT NO OTHER CALLER IS WORKSHOPPING. What happens then?

The poor guy that pays the freight - you, the dancer, will be just the opposite of the brand new father who, when informed that his offspring was a girl, replied, "That was my second choice". You have no second choice. You can dance the new basic you have learned when your caller is at the mike or louse up the square when some other caller belts out a basic that he alone thinks you should dance, but - you have never heard of it! (How come there are so many basics that Ed Kettwig has never heard of?)

Please! Would it be asking too much of the members of the Callers Association to give back to the dancers an opportunity to voice their opinion as to whether they like or dislike a new basic? By doing this you would be giving us just one more reason for believing that our callers are the "best".

A new President is now behind the wheel of the Dancers Association. He is entirely capable of steering a course that will benefit square dancing and the Square Dancer but he will need the help and suggestions of everyone of you. If I had one wish, Ed and Maggie Kettwig, it would be this - may your year be a happy year. Happy because you have accomplished what you have set out to do and added many more friends to the large group you now have.

SQUARE DANCE ON THE ROAD

WANDA WILLEY

It has been my pleasure for the past year to bring to the public, news of square dancers not only of Marin County, but of surrounding areas in the state. It has been a great deal of hard work, but the pleasure has been even greater.

When Ed Ferrario asked me to write an article for SQUARE DANCE WHERE? about the radio program I really didn't know just what would be of interest to others. But, I will endeavor to put into writing my experiences with the radio program.

The idea of a radio program aimed at the square dancers and prospective dancers was not a new one. For several years I wondered why there was no program for us, but like everyone else, I did nothing about it. Then, last year SETS IN ORDER covered the subject quite well. I thought about it for several weeks and then one day picked up the phone and called Mr. Hugh Tuner, manager of radio station KTIM, and put the idea before him. I never dreamed he would take me up on the idea, but to my surprise he liked the idea. So, here I was with a radio program set up and didn't know the first thing about it!

The first thing I did was contact Lee Monti, then president of the Marin Square Dance Association and discuss the matter with him. Then, contacted all of our local callers. All agreed that it was a good idea and that each would give me their help and support, both moral and physical.

The first program was scheduled for the first Saturday in March, 1964. Lee Monti and Jim Blackwood, caller for the Terra Linda Twirlers, appeared with me on that program. Without them I doubt that I could have gotten through it. I do not believe I have ever been so frightened in my life.

Soon though I lost the fright of the mike and now I look forward to Saturday mornings. There must be a little "ham" in all of us!

The one thing that worried me was, "was anyone listening." There is no meter to tell how many people have tuned in to

your program so you have no way of knowing if anyone is really listening! But, make a mistake and you soon find out! One Saturday I started the program out by saying "there is no dance in Marin tonight but for those of you who desire to travel, here are dances in surrounding areas." The phone began to ring and I had a listener! There was a dance in Marin that night! But, what made me feel so good was the fact that someone other than my family was listening. My spirits bolted and gave me a second wind! Even now it still thrills me when I receive cards and letters and phone calls from listeners. I KNOW then that someone is really listening!

When I first started the program, I used my own records and the records of callers appearing on the program. It doesn't take long to exhaust a person's supply, and besides, it was not putting before the public and the dancers the current releases. So, I wrote the record companies and most of them have been very wonderful sending me their new releases. This serves a number of purposes. One is it gives the caller the opportunity to hear the new release before he buys it. Many callers have lots of money tied up in records that he cannot use. Two, it gives the dancers the chance to hear the new releases. If he hears one he likes, then he will ask his club caller to present it. Third, but not last, it lets the non-dancers know the kind of music we dance to. That our music is not "hillbilly". Also they hear the calls and possibly this will intrigue them and give them a desire to learn to square dance.

One elderly lady called me and said she enjoyed the music so very much and looked forward to my program for the lively music. She was in a wheelchair. So, if nothing else, the music brings happiness to those who are not as fortunate as we with our health.

My guests have been from all stations of life. First, all of the callers in Marin County have appeared on the program at

least once, some more often. Recently the San Rafael Recreation Director appeared as my guest. Even though Mr. Rodata was not a square dancer, he encouraged people to join our new beginner's class. Once I had nine pre-teen children on with me. They were from my group of square dancing children. The idea was to let others know that children enjoy square dancing as much as adults. I have had a group of teen agers, the Marin Twirlers, letting teen agers know that square dancing is not for the "squares" but can be a "blast". I was privileged to have Ed Ferrario on the program. Ed drove from Alameda to be on for just 15 minutes. He is a square dance promoter and he was calling in Marin that night so he also brought out dancers who might have stayed at home. This is a shot in the arm for any dance. Also, Bill and Louise Marron from San Pedro of the Blue Engravers was here and told about badge making.

Each guest was interesting and has contributed to the square dance picture in one way or the other.

Of course, without the help of the radio announcers, I fear that I might never have actually gotten over my fright. Each have just been wonderful.

How is the news gathered for the program? From various sources. From clubs who write in letting me know when they are having a special dance; members who write about trips etc.; by visiting clubs when I can; and from SQUARE DANCE WHERE? In as much as KTIM covers a large area, the program is not directed to just Marin County. When on vacation, I heard the program loud and clear in Mendocino County. Your cards and letters are most helpful in putting the program together. Many times a location has been changed and it was too late to get in SQUARE DANCE WHERE? so on the program we let the dancers know of the change.

The square dance family is a large one and it is rather impossible to keep up with everyone. Via the radio program it is possible though to let us know where you are, what you are doing, who had a birthday, who is ill and needs cheering, if you have had a new addition to your family, personal news that brings happiness to another. It is nice to hear of an old friend whom you haven't seen in some time to know that they are dancing with such and such club. This

is one purpose of the program to keep the dancers in closer touch with each other when not able to attend all dances.

Another purpose of the program is to introduce square dancing to our non-dancing friends. Particularly when beginners classes are starting. I do not know how many might have joined a class as a result of listening to the program, but I like to think some have! I have received calls from listeners wanting more information about a square dance class, which encourages me.

In reality the program has many purposes. In my small way, I hope that I have promoted square dancing some and helped bring some back into our family. I hope maybe I have brought news of a friend to someone and brought some cheer into their lives. Set someone's foot to tapping and giving them the desire to get out of the house and learn to square dance and make new wonderful friends.

I have made many new friends as a result of this program. I value their friendship and help very much.

As the program starts on the second year, I would like to thank all of those who have sent me their news this past year, all of the wonderful people who have helped make the program. In particular, I would like to thank Cecil Crowe, president of Marin Square Dance Association, who has substituted for me when I was on vacation. Also, my husband, Ed, who has encouraged me to keep talking (unusual for a husband!) and his helpful criticism.

At the present time the program is on the air for 15 minutes, starting at 10:15 a.m. every Saturday morning on KTIM, 1015 on your dial. We have hopes that we can get 30 minutes and your cards and letters will help toward that goal, also sponsors!

The program is for YOU. Your news is important. Your cards and letters and telephone calls are important. When you have news of your club, your members, a special dance, drop a card to me in care of Radio Station KTIM, 1040 "B" Street, San Rafael, and it will be on the air the following Saturday or appropriate date. I am only too happy to announce your dances and news.

Hoping you will tune in and that you will find something about the program to enjoy.

A benefit dance was to be given on a Sunday afternoon in the San Bruno Armory in behalf of Bud Williams who had a stroke. It was Don Shotwell, the caller, who sounded the clarion. "For as little as one dollar," he said, "we can show we appreciate their efforts, and this, at a time when a man is stricken, is something to which any individual is entitled."

Although the above remarks were made to members of the San Francisco Chapter of Bachelors 'N Bachelorettes on a Friday night during a dance intermission, they applied to square dancers as a whole. For true to form they turned out in full force, filling the Armory to capacity. Many were the compliments to Bud, both as a gentleman and a caller. But one seemed especially appropriate for the occasion. It came from Jack Rowe. Jack was just breaking in as a caller and Bud gave him this advice "Don't expect too much as long as you make people happy." And as you looked about, there—before you was the living testimony of an idea come to reality.

But in a sense, how could it be any different with "over a million dollars worth of callers' talent (twelve in all) coming from near and far to do their part. Bud was ushered in, toward the end of the dance and he was so moved by the enthusiasm that greeted him that standing before the mike, in a voice choked with emotion and scarcely audible, he could only say "I thank you". A fine tribute to a fine man. What a little cooperation will do.

Now to increase the interest of square dancers? Very simple. Just have them participate in what is going on. At least, that is Don Shotwell's idea. Don is caller for the Bachelors 'N Bachelorettes of San Francisco, and has just been elected Vice-President of the Northern California Callers' Association. A big salute to Sparky Sparks, able, hard working President of the Northern California Caller's Association.

Sparky hails from Kansas, via Colorado, and he and his taw, Louise, now call Clearlake home. He cuts a mighty good head of hair providing he's not dreaming up a new call. "Cut" rate for square dancers, Sparky?

In 1955 while living in Marin County, he was bitten by the bug and after beginner class he and Louise danced with the Top Hands, Mill Wheelers, and Flying Wheels, all of San Anselmo.

So, they're at it again. Kicking, scratching, mauling each other all over the place. Right crosses, left hooks and body blows. Too many basics, not enough basics. Clubs folding, dancers quitting. Yet square dancing is healthier today than it has ever been. So why the big fuss?

Beginners are a must if square dancing is to survive. Yet beginners can be the very downfall of a club. After all today's beginner is about fifteen years behind in square dancing. But clubs still insist on graduating them and putting them in the club with the more experienced dancer and trouble soon begins to breed. No wonder the more experienced dancer seeks more advanced groups or the poor beginner drops out. So, please Larry. Take another look at the picture of square dancing.

As for the DeGrafts, I feel sorry for

them. After fifteen years of dancing to the likes of Castner, Page, Moglia, Burgess, Looney and the newer callers such as Peters, Shotwell, Wylie, Jackson and the list could go on and on, they got bored. Along came Pepper and Ward to ease their suffering. Good callers? Yes! Good voices? Yes! Teach any more or better than the bay area caller? NO! The advantage Pepper and Ward have is the fact that everybody at their workshop is an experienced dancer that wants to dance and not sit out and gab.

Should all bay area callers including the ones named above take lessons from Pepper and Ward? I think not. Let Pepper and Ward take a few lessons from the bay area club caller that has kept his club dancing year after year. What is more important to square dancing? The local open club caller or the closed advanced workshop with Pepper and Ward. And what happens when Pepper and Ward get boring? It was once said, "Too much of a good thing is good for nothing."

So thank you Larry Butzer and Alice and Elmer DeGraf. Thank you for taking an interest in square dancing. But please don't try to brainwash me! I believe there is plenty for everybody. Plenty for the club dancer with the club caller. Plenty for the more active, advanced dancer. And plenty for Pepper and Ward with their closed workshops. I say. If we should get in the same square together, let's smile and have fun. After all square dancing is entertainment and we must all seek our entertainment where we like. Hope to see you at a few panels.
