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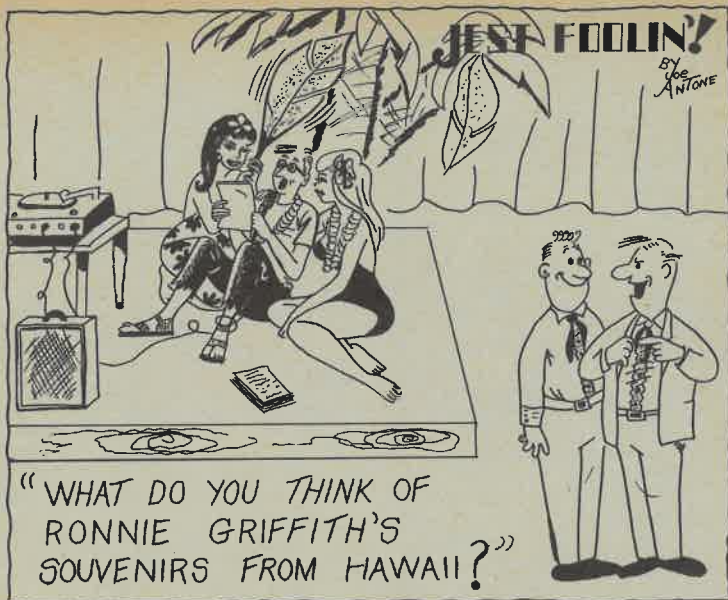

 MEASURES INTRODUCTION

1 - 4 WAIT; WAIT; APART,-, POINT,-; TOG (SCP),-, TCH,-;

In Open-Facing Pos (M's bk to COH) M's R & W's L hands joined wait 2 meas.;;
 Step apart on L, hold 1 ct, point R toe twd ptr. hold 1 ct; Step twd ptr on R,
 blend to SEMI-CP facing LOD while holding 1 ct, tch L toe to R ft, hold 1 ct.

PART A

1 - 4 TWO-STEP BRUSH; TWO-STEP BRUSH; VINE APART,2,3,SWING; VINE TOG,2,3
 (SCP), TCH;

In SCP starting M's L do a fwd two-step and brush R ft; Starting M's R do another

Will wonders never cease? All these years I have been wondering if callers could read. Now, I need wonder no more. We have factual proof that at least one caller, Vic Tolley, can not only read, but he can do a darn good job of writing as well. The consensus of the numerous people who have talked to me about his article is that he has said things that have needed saying for a long time. But—because everyone did not agree with everything he said an answer should be forthcoming.

So—here we go. First, thank YOU Vic, for your interest in Square Dancing and taking the time to give forth with your personal opinions. Your opinions are respected and I would like to believe that you were sincere in stating them and not making an attempt to brainwash me.

I, like you, believe there is plenty for everyone in Square Dancing and that each of us should be free to choose what we like best. But I also believe that a big percentage of the dancers are what we could call an average dancer and he has lost his right of choosing what he wants.

When the minority group, the callers, take upon themselves the privilege of dictating to the vast majority, the dancers, as to what they shall or shall not dance, then Vic, trouble is brewing. Whether you believe it or not, dancers are quitting because of the rat race of basics that are flooding all the callers periodicals. Callers read these new basics, pick out the ones they think their club should learn and proceed to teach them. But the problem is no two callers pick out the same basic. Where does this leave the dancer? Standing in an idle square if some caller other than his own is calling.

He will do this only so long, then he gives up in disgust. And when enough dancers quit some clubs are bound to fold. Why not take the time to check on the number of clubs in this area as compared to two or three years ago. When the Dancers Association undertook a survey of the number of dancers for insurance purposes four years ago it was found that the average number of dancers per club was 65. Are eight squares per club still the average?

I'm sure Vic, that if you talk to enough dancers you will find that when they attend

a hoedown or Stampede they enjoy themselves much more if they can follow all the calls. Witness the last Stampede with Dave Taylor calling. Dave set up his program for the average dancer and he called to a happy floor. The average dancer is one who does not know every new basic and it is this average dancer who keeps Square Dancing going!

Honestly Vic, don't you believe that the dancer should have some say as to what he would like to dance?

You state, Vic, that "square dancing is healthier today than it has ever been." Somehow, after reading articles published in magazines from various locations throughout the country I get a different impression. There is evidence of a growing concern that far too many dancers are leaving for various reasons. Included in these reasons is the problem of beginner dancers, as you mentioned, and the fact that the fun has been taken out of Square Dancing because of the ever increasing list of new basics that are forced on the dancers. Gee! There are dozens of recreational activities that once you learn the rules you can enjoy them for years without having to go to "school" once a week to learn new ones!

You also stated that "... a caller should be a leader. The caller that refuses to face this fact should get down off the stage and become a dancer." Are you intimating Vic, that there are no leaders among the dancers? Just for the record I would like to have you go down the rosters of the Officers and Delegates of the Dancers Association throughout the years. Also include in your reading the numerous list of Club Officers of all the Square Dance Clubs—including your own. Are these people not leaders? I think they are and I further believe that without them a large share of the callers would fold up their equipment and silently steal away. Also, how about the work Wanda Wiley is doing? I agree with you that a caller should be a leader but he should work in conjunction with the DANCER LEADERS.

With regard to beginner dancers being pushed into a club too soon. In the main, this subject I have steered clear of. For the

life of me I can't define a beginner dancer. It seems to me with all the new and continuous learning that is required just to keep up I get the feeling we are all still beginners. If you doubt that this is true just lay off dancing for a couple of months.

But—speaking of the beginner dancer per se I wonder how far any of us would have progressed if the older dancers were not there to give us a helping hand. When you were a spanking new caller Vic, did the older dancers overlook your lack of the kind of ability that comes only with practice? I'm sure they did or you would not have earned the respect that all good callers receive—and you do have that respect. For what it is worth Square Dancing would be long gone if it were not for beginners and these fine people would be perennial beginners if the older dancers did not take them into the fold. To those of you who complain—have you forgotten?

Again Vic, thanks for writing. It is rather refreshing to know that some callers do have Square Dancing at heart and not at their purse. It takes all of us to make it go for all of us so that each of us may enjoy that one particular phase of Square Dancing that brings us the most pleasure. If I should be fortunate enough to get in a square with you Vic, I'll not only smile but I'll laugh with you as both of us are having fun.

The Dancers Association has finally taken a long overdue step. At their last General Committee meeting the Delegates voted into their organization a Teenage group with all the privileges that go with membership. When you see these kids at hoedowns or Stampedes get in a square with them. And—don't for one minute fool yourselves, they can dance and enjoy it every bit as much as we do. Congratulations, kids!

As this is being written returns have started coming in on the Average Dancer contest. Have you sent yours? And—Rosemary, I know that it isn't any of my damn business, but I don't think we could find an "average" if we didn't have that one important statistic!

It so happens that many of our members sit out round dances for want of being better acquainted with them, and thereby lose a great deal of the dancing pleasure of the evening. It is true that we seem to be aware of this state of affairs. Witness, for example the summer course in the basics of round dancing that is now being offered in our old homestead, Noel Hall under the tutorship of the Jones'!

It so happens that round dancing seems to be so simple and yet at the same time can be so elusive. That is, the fundamental basics are so adroitly shifted around, ever so delicately, just sufficient to get you out of line. Thus, the left face spin, the left face twirl, reverse twirl, until you don't know which is which. The consequence is one must do the rounds continually just to

keep abreast of them.

How to go about it? Many clubs have solved this problem by having rounds exclusively from 8-8:30 before the regular square dance commences under the guidance of a competent instructor who watches every move you make, and if you get out of line, has the nack of straightening you out—in ever so gentle manner. And then when the regular dancing does begin at 8:30 you have another crack at the rounds, there being one between each square dance or tip. You are now more or less on your own and are able to put into practice what you have just learned.

It is amazing what comforting results have been achieved in this manner. Witness, for example, the smoothness with which the Square Devils of Oakland who follow such a pattern do their rounds. They all get up on the floor and it is a pleasure to watch them.

I have often wondered if we could not pursue a similar policy. And why not? Fortunately, in this connection we have in our midst as one of our own members, Pearl Preston, a very notable folk and round dance

teacher, has a studio of her own, and renowned in the Bay area for many years as a devotee of the dance movement. And we might ask her for her point of view.

I believe the above suggestion is worth a trial. A lot of good may come out of it and certainly no harm.
