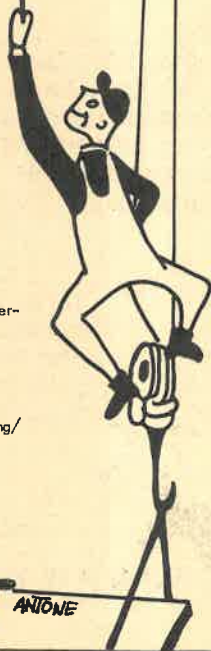

The contest for the "Average Square Dance Couple" is over and we have a winner. We also have a winner for the couple from the farthest distance from Alameda and also a caller.

The total number of returns did not cause the mail man any deep concern, in fact they were on the light side. But—we did get enough to come up with a fair sampling of what makes up our square dancer.

The two items that were of particular interest to me, and I hope you, were the questions asked about getting started in square dancing and the one feature that the individual liked best.

About getting started. Over 90 per cent of the people indicated that they got started in Square Dancing at the suggestion of friends or relatives who were already enjoying this fine recreation. So—if this one factor is indicative of what it takes to get more people involved I would suggest that we get busy. If each of us put on a personal advertising campaign we would probably be agreeably surprised at the results. Why not try it?

The couple that sent in a return from the longest distance was Bill and Ethel Esen of Modesto. When you consider that Square Dance Where? has subscribers from all over the world this doesn't seem to be too far. Even though the distance is not great they did come up with another fine reason for starting. They indicated they wanted something that was "good, clean fun and easy on the pocketbook." How true.

Many people answered the question about the best liked feature in various ways that all pointed to one important feature of square dancing. I think if I used the answer of the Average Couple it would just about be a good "average"—"The fun of dancing and the association of such." I interpret this as meaning the fun they have in dancing and the enjoyment they get out of the people they dance with. Again, how true.

A surprisingly large number stated they liked the singing calls best of all. May I

ask another question? Do you suppose these dancers feel this way because dancing to a singing call does not involve getting all tangled up with a mess of non-directional basics that only a small percentage of dancers know? Just thought I would ask.

As to the caller winner. He came closest to the average of callers but almost lost out because he weighs all of 200 pounds. If we ever do this again Bill Jonas, may I suggest you go on a diet before sending in your answer? Also Bill—thank you for your very interesting letter that accompanied the answer, I couldn't agree with you more.

I also received a letter from a true critic. One who had a valid complaint. He asked why I did not include a prize for the average single dancer. This was a goof on my part and I hereby offer my sincere apologies for not doing so. Everybody knows that the singles clubs are tremendously active in Square Dancing. They and their callers are filling a large void. They have only one problem—they lose dancers not so much because of basics as they do from marriage. But—one clubs loss is another clubs gain and just think, in a few years we will have a new stock of teen-age dancers.

To try to right this wrong we will run another contest real soon for the single dancer—both Paw and Taw. Maybe we can bring the winners together and the singles clubs will lose another pair of dancers and we'll have more teen-agers. Oh well—it's just a thought.

After putting all the necessary information into the computer and then repairing the fool thing after it broke down I finally came up with a picture of the Average S/D Couple. Many couples came close but only one came so close there was no doubt. Let us take paw first. He has been dancing six and one half years and is 49 years old. He stands five feet eight inches tall and weighs 171 pounds. Husky little character, isn't he? His Taw has also danced six and one half years (something wrong if she didn't). She is 47 years old, stands five feet three inches and weighs 133 pounds. I never said a word about "husky!" How close do you come to this average.

Now we are starting something new. After a very serious discussion with the pleasingly rotund individual who edits this magazine we have decided to run a picture and a brief biography of Square Dance couples and singles. This will not be done in every issue but we will try to get them in as often as possible. Why don't you take the time to send us a black and white picture and list all the information you can for us. We are interested in your club name, how long you have been dancing, age, occupation, number in your family, etc. This will not be a popularity contest but we will try to get the information in the magazine on a first come first served basis.

To all of you who did answer the questionnaire—thank you. It was really interesting to read all of them and if I might be downright mean may I suggest to the callers that all of the above information came from run of the mill dancers. Think about those that liked the singing calls best.

No room to complain too much about basics this month—so see you around?

The Square Dance Picture as I See it !!

What is wrong with Square Dancing today as compared to Square Dancing of 7 to 10 years ago? First of all let's start with our biggest and number one problem. The growth rate of our Square Dance activity.

On the whole, our local and national picture has not grown at all, and if anything has fallen down sadly in many areas that were booming with square dancers just a few years ago.

Why is this? We ask over and over. Surely we have not exhausted our area of people from which we draw to start our new classes. Definitely not, as our towns and cities are steadily on the rise in population, we have scarcely reached the amount of people that could be dancing in our clubs now, and helping our clubs to grow in size.

Take the town that I live in for example. We have over 70,000 people now and still climbing. We have three square dance clubs in this town, with an average of 3 to 5 squares in the club. This is a sad thing to only have such a small amount dancing from a list as large as 70,000.

Seven to ten years ago, it was a common thing to see Square Dance Clubs with a membership of 15 squares and a beginners class of another 10 or 12 squares starting every six months to a year.

Now it seems we are doing good if we can get 2 or 3 squares started in a new class and maintain the club size of 3 or 4 squares. Just look around you for instance, I will bet that you can find many clubs of this size in your area and also many more of a regretfully low of 1 1/2 to 2 squares.

Now what can be done to change this situation and help our clubs grow.

As I see it our number one problem lies in advertising. Word of mouth is still the best means of advertising the Square Dance Activity. Since our clubs and classes are now very small in size we no longer have the volume of people to help with the word of mouth advertising. While I am on the subject of word of mouth let me mention, when trying to get a friend interested in a beginners class don't just tell him about it, make it a point to have you and your wife arrange to pick your friends up and personally take them down to the class for the first two nights to make sure that they will not back out at the last minute and not show up at the class.

Tell them a little white lie if necessary and mention that all they have to do is come down and take a look at Square Dancing and watch you dance. Leave the fact that they will have to get up on the floor and try, to the caller. (Callers note:) It is your job as an instructor to get everyone on to the dance floor and try dancing. Do this in a nice way as to not embarrass anyone.

This above method is to be used for friends or couples that we know will be shy and will not want to start right out dancing until they are sure that they will like Square Dancing. We all know and it is a proven fact that nine out of ten people will take a tremendous liking to square dancing, and will look forward to coming back if we can just once get them on the floor.

Now back to the advertising picture. Our biggest downfall is the fact that we do not have enough money in Square Dancing to promote good paid advertising. But for goodness sake let's use some of our extra money that our callers and dancers associations have built up over the years.

It might be fun to spend the association money for picnics and partys and outings and such, but is it helping our main problem of enlarging the clubs and associations so that we can properly grow and remain in a good financial status.

I say let's give this good thought and think about doing away with picnics and partys for the next few years and spend what money we have in advertising Square Dancing.

If and when we grow, to a tremendous size then we can again think about ourselves, and picnics and fun for all.

Let's work hard on building our Square Dance future. Square Dancing should be the biggest recreation to ever hit our country. Where else can a man and wife, or a couple have such a good time together.

We need more advertising thru T. V. , Radio, Newspapers, Magazines, Posters, Flyers thru the mail by the thousands, also more dance exhibitions put on for shopping centers, car dealers, P-TA meetings, etc.

If you look around next time you go downtown shopping, see the advertising that Bowling and Golf get. Every town or city has some billboard showing a Bowler or Golfer drinking a coke or swinging or throwing a ball to help advertise their recreation. Bowl for health, and get blue chip or other trading stamps with each lesson. Why can we not Square Dance for health, and get trading stamps with our lessons. Stamps are very easy to get from the stamp people if we just look into it. I found that for the price of a small \$8.00 advertisement we can purchase 5000 stamps which are plenty for a beginners class, and well worth it if it helps to get people interested in square dancing.

As I travel across the United States and Canada, calling at various places, I look around and try to size up which areas have grown since my last visit, and which have fallen down. I note that the areas and clubs that have the better advertising and leadership continue to grow and square dancing is a number one recreation for the area.

Another thing that is overlooked in our area, is that we have a great potential source of Square Dancers from our Churches which are always overlooked. Another good source is Trailer Parks which down Southern California way seem to be growing steadily with Square Dance Clubs within the Trailer Parks. They have their own Dance Halls which are usually free to use for Square Dancing if enough people from the Trailer Park benefit from the dancing.

Well I will close here and let's all make an all out effort, to help our wonderful Square Dance activity to grow and become America's number one recreation.

BILL CASTNER

This month's featured caller is "Big Bill" Castner, a real busy fella. Bill hails from Napa, California and started his calling career way back in 1939 at the University of California. He has had a big, big hand in the revival of square dancing.

After serving with the Air Corps during WW II Bill graduated from UC with a Masters Degree in Engineering, a Bachelors in P.E. and later on another Masters in Psychology. He has taught grade school, junior high and college and is at present teaching 5th grade in Lafayette.

Bill has called at every (well, almost) Jamboree, Round-up, Festival and Convention from here to there. He was leading staff member for eleven years at the Rocky Mountain Square Dance Camp and last year and this, will be at Asilomar. He has called in forty-three of our United States plus Mexico, Holland, France, Belgium, Canada, Germany, Italy and Spain. He has been on many panel discussions and written articles for national square dance publications, a book on calling for beginners, a Folk and Square Dance Syllabus for schools, and two Science Fiction short stories.

Bill has made about twenty recordings, many of them hits in the square dance field.

Periodically, Bill holds callers classes for beginner callers and weekly he is club caller for the DO-C-DO'S of Vallejo (5 years); SQUARE CROWS of Alameda (17 years); San Francisco 49'ERS (15 years); PALS & SALS of Vacaville and has had the SQUARENADERS exhibition group since 1948. He has also called for the VILLAGERS, B-BAR-C'S, HARMONY HOEDOWNERS, SQUARE DEVILS, and several Folk Dance groups.

Bill was President of the Folk Dance Federation for two years, Vice President for one year and Vice President of Caller's Association for two years. A charter member of the Caller's Association, Bill has also been Research Chairman (2 years) and Program Chairman (6 years).

In his spare time Bill belongs to the National Model Railroaders Society, a garden club, two camellia societies, the American Day Lily Society, Folk Dance Federation, Caller's Association, two stamp clubs, and two chess clubs. He reads carloads of books, is raising tropical fish, birds and four children.

To top it all, Bill has a very long belt made of silver dollars, but he says the face value is top secret.

Bill and Confucius say: Square Dancing will outlive all of the petty jealousies and spitefulness of the few.
