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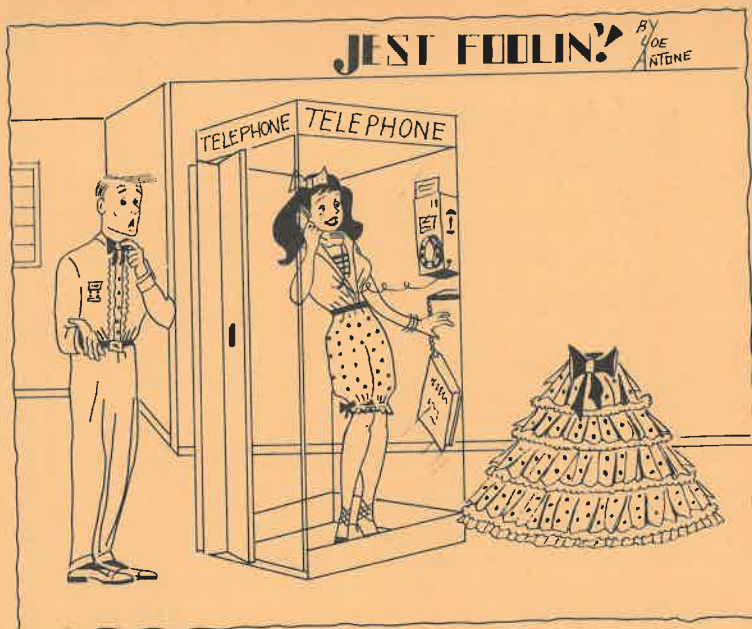

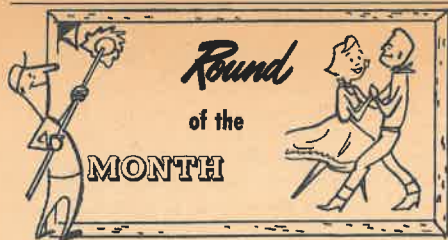

RECORD: "Pearly Shells" - Decca 31659 (Burl Ives)

POSITION: INTRO: Open Facing LOD; DANCE: Semi-Closed facing LOD

FOOTWORK: Opposite (Take small steps to create Hawaiian movements)

MEASURES

INTRODUCTION

1 - 4 3 PICK UP NOTES, WAIT; WAIT; TWO-STEP FWD; TWO-STEP FWD;

In OP wait 3 pick up notes and 2 meas.; Starting M's L do 2 fwd two-steps LOD turning to face ptr on last two-step assuming BUTTERFLY POS.

5 - 8 SIDE, CLOSE, SIDE, POINT; SIDE, CLOSE, SIDE, POINT; APART, -;

POINT, -; TCH, -; TCH, -;

Step swd LOD on L, close R, step L, point R toe twd RLOD; Step swd RLOD on R, close L, step R, point L toe twd LOD; Bal apart (M twd COH) L, hold 1 ct, pt R twd ptr, hold 1 ct; Step tag into SCP on R, hold 1 ct, tch L to R, hold 1 ct.

DANCE - PART A

1 - 4 FWD TWO-STEP; FWD TWO-STEP; TWO-STEP AWAY; TWO-STEP TO FACE

(L-OP FACING);

In SCP facing LOD do 2 fwd two-steps; Releasing hold do a small circle two-step turning away M to L & W to R; Continue turn with a two-step to face ending in L-OP fag;

5 - 8 (TAMARA) TWO-STEP FWD (to BJO); TWO-STEP AROUND (to face);

(TAMARA) TWO-STEP FWD (to BJO); TWO-STEP AROUND (to CP);

TAMARA POS (W places L hand behind bk at waist so palm is out & near R hip) ptrs two-step fwd to BJO POS & M places his R hand in W's L hand keeping M's L & W's R hands held high; Release M's L & W's R hands keeping joined hands low and do a two-step M turning RF (W LF) to face ptr; REPEAT TAMARA - M now places his L hand behind his bk at waist with palm out & near R hip as ptrs two-step fwd to BJO POS & W places her R hand in M's L hand keeping M's R & W's L hands high; Release M's R & W's L hands & do a two-step M turning LF (W RF) to face ptr assuming CP M's bk twd COH.

9 - 12 (BOX) SIDE, CLOSE, FWD, -; SIDE, CLOSE, BK, -; (REV BOX) SIDE, CLOSE,

BK, -; SIDE, CLOSE, FWD, -;

(Box) Step swd LOD on L, close R to L, step fwd twd wall on L, -; Step swd RLOD on R, close L to R, step bwd twd COH on R, -; Step swd LOD on L, close R to L, step bwd twd COH on L, -; Step swd RLOD on R, close L to R, step twd wall on R, -;

13 - 16 (SCISSORS) SIDE, CLOSE, CROSS, -; SIDE, CLOSE, CROSS, -; TURN, TWO-STEP; TURN TWO-STEP;

Remaining in CP step swd L, close R to L, L XIF of R (W XIB), -; Swd R, close L to R, R XIF of L (W XIB), -; Blending to CP do 2 RF turning two-steps ending in CP M's bk to COH.

PART B

1 - 4 SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE, FRONT; SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE, FRONT; WALK, -; 2, -;

WALK, -; 2, -;

In CP starting M's L & moving to L side LOD do a quick 8-step grapevine; Assuming SCP starting M's L take 4 slow walking steps (R ft directly ahead of L, L directly ahead of R) both turning in to face ptr assuming CP M's bk to COH.

5 - 8 REPEAT ACTION OF MEAS 1-4 OF PART B ENDING IN SCP FACING LOD TO REPEAT PART A.

BRIDGE

1 - 4 SIDE, CLOSE, SIDE, POINT; SIDE, CLOSE, SIDE, POINT; CHASE TWO-STEP; CHASE TWO-STEP (turn 1);

In BFLY POS repeat action of Meas 5-6 of INTRO; Releasing hands M turn 1/4 LF & do 2 two-steps twd COH with the W chasing the M turning 1/2 LF on the completion of the second two-step to reverse the Chase Pos.

5 - 8 CHASE TWO-STEP; CHASE TWO-STEP; SIDE, CLOSE, SIDE, POINT; SIDE, CLOSE, SIDE, TCH;

M now chases the W out twd the wall in 2 two-steps (W turns 1/2 LF on the second two-step to end in BFLY POS); REPEAT Meas 5-6 of Intro except to end with a tch in CP to repeat all of PART B

SEQUENCE: INTRO - A - B - A - BRIDGE - B - A - ENDING.

ENDING: FWD TWO-STEP; FWD TWO-STEP; WALK, -; 2, -; WALK, -; ROCK/BK, PNIT; In SCP do 2 fwd two-steps; Walk 3 slow steps LRL rock back in RLOD on R & point L ft twd LOD. (Walking steps are taken 1 ft in front of the other on balls of foot.)

HE CARES!!

says

CORINNE O'NEAL

I admire Larry Butzer. He cares. He cares about square dancers and square dancing. He gives of himself in thinking about what could and should be and, he is greatly concerned about the present downward trend of the square dance movement...and all the pretenses which have great similarity to the ostrich who denied reality by burying his head in the sand.

There are so many disturbing things like our great apathy, little people with a big mike, honest monetary motivations hidden under the cloak of public benevolence and long past due is that the square dance movement must be approached realistically, that past concepts and procedures are no longer functional for the present. After all, this IS 1965!

Yes, Larry cares. He cares enough to have the courage to expose many problems to the square dance public.

Now I consider the square dance public to be both the dancers and the callers. I consider this combination to represent an integrated whole (for the compatible continuance of the square dance movement) but at this point comes a strong dividing line with the dancers representing 2/3 of that combination. I say this because of the dancers' responsibilities. Let's take a good look at both the responsibilities and objectives.

First of all, a dancer, as an individual, club member, club officer, District officer, member of the State Board or the Dancers' Association, is performing a taxing public relations job from the outset. It is never ending.

For each social activity there are certain standard props. For square dancing there must be halls and schools and public buildings, and parking, area for the serving of refreshments and good acoustics and a danceable floor. Behind all this many people are involved in obtaining the best for their club and the square dance movement and, the square dance public. These people devote much time in obtaining these necessary props. And, that is not all. They commit themselves by making sandwiches, baking cakes, etc., and then follow through in both the hospitality and cleaning. In between they are doing many other things

... they are public relation people between themselves, within their club, between the various clubs, with the non-dancing public, with their District officers, the school board, the Park and Recreation Boards, with the custodian of the building and, yes, with the Dietician, when required. They are also planners and organizers. When the time comes for a beginners class they become publicity agents and again they are doing a big public relations job...the assistance in establishing a class and then following through with encouragement and friendship. Graduation does not see the end of this responsibility...for then the new class members must be absorbed into the club membership and the necessary encouragement to branch out to hoedowns. And at that time the whole procedure starts all over again.

They are also business people. They are responsible for the indebtedness of their club and therefore it behooves them to carefully plan the future so that all monetary obligations are met. They are also contractors...leasing halls and schools and booking callers months in advance.

Now I think of callers in this manner. A professional caller is one who devotes his full time (and it is his livelihood) to the art, knowledge and development of the square dance. He also studies people and has that intuitive knowledge about any group of dancers and can, without hesitation, change an entire evening's program. They have the skill of making a dancer dance even beyond his own known capacity and, they are so versatile they can create extemporaneous patterns easily and properly. They are usually recording artists and their knowledge and services are muchly sought after...and profoundly needed.

There are also part-time callers (after 5 PM) and there are part-time traveling callers and also would-be callers and callers who are teachers. There are callers who know and understand and adhere to the principle that any organization is only as strong as the membership participates and accepts responsibility...for it is from this kind of participation and leadership that enthusiasm and new ideas come into being...for a person who is contributing becomes a partner for success.

There are also callers who pretend to

love but the affection lies mostly in the monetary gain. Now I have no quarrel with the remuneration for this is as it should be, only with the manipulation, the pretense, and the use of the mike to surround themselves with prestige oftentimes forgetting the club itself.

And, there is the almost prohibitive cost of the education of the beginning square dance caller. So you completed caller instructions and where do you go from here? You need to practice and practice and practice. (And not in front of a mirror.) You need and require real live dancers. Where do they come from? Other than a few well-wishing friends who are willing to assist through the ordeal of your private education you, from necessity, usually start a beginners class to develop a vehicle for your self-education.

I am not being critical of you, ambitious though you are, but rather of the system because so many fine, potential dancers are victimized for your personal advancement. You should pay them! but most of all they should be informed of the circumstances...that you desperately need them. To become a fatality as an innocent or, to become a fatality knowingly is the difference between honesty and dishonesty...either a contribution to the welfare of the square dance public or a disservice to square dancing.

I have been taught, and I acknowledge its wisdom, that if one criticizes or expounds a new idea or procedure, be prepared to back it up.

As depicted by the 2/3 dancers and 1/3 caller combination, this is also the same critique between the Dancers' Association and the Callers' Association. The function of the first is one of liaison of all facets for a compatible coordination...the function of the other is to meet the needs of the dancers...for which there are many compensations.

Square dancing is a business. Big business. You think not? Let's take a look at just one facet of it. A "side-line" caller for a progressive club, both workshop and beginner class, averages \$2000 yearly. This does not include special party nights, hoedowns, plus additional clubs or outside calling dates (expenses are income tax deductible). (Have you ever figured it out on an hourly basis?)

How I would like to see the dancers

demand, and the Dancers' Association establish, a twice-a-year seminar for club officers to review standard club procedures, to expose the expectations and responsibilities of their officership and how best to accomplish it (constructive education vs. trial and error) and, perhaps the Callers' Association might just take a new look at their somewhat private role and develop more stringent qualifications for their membership, their role, and inaugurate a program whereby a fledgling would-be caller may have the assistance of a standby "old pro" throughout every step of his development.

Most of us like the numbers game... but I feel greatly concerned about the number who didn't make it...and every time we lose those at-one-time interested people we help raise our black flag.

Yes, square dancers are terribly important people...just ask any caller.
