"O.K. NOW, LETS ALL PYRAMID!"

Hope you took the time to read the article by caller Don Atkins in a recent issue of this bundle of Square Dance news. Guess maybe I'm going to have to change my mind about callers being able to read or write 'cause Don had a lot to say and did an excellent job of saying it. I get the impression that other people, both callers and dancers, are getting concerned about the lack of dancers and are beginning to make their opinions heard. This is good. If enough of us get on the band wagon maybe we can get Square Dancing back on an even keel.

The first big step has been taken by the Dancers Association. They have gone on record with a recommendation to the Callers Association that new basics be restricted to one per month. Included in the teaching of this new basic would be a review of an older basic. The callers would pick out the new basic, take it back to workshop with their club, get the dancers opinion, and report back at the next Callers meeting as to acceptance or non-acceptation by their club. The opinion of the majority would rule.

This is to be presented at the next Callers meeting. Now—once and for all the dancers will find out if the callers are willing to give Square Dancing back to the Dancers, where it belongs, or whether they will continue to tell the dancers "You dance what we want you to dance."

Let's hope they will agree to the new proposal. Also let's hope that if it passes they will use a little judgment in choosing the new basic. Any caller will tell you that a lot of the new basics can be done by simply combining calls that are familiar to all of us. If this is true, and it is, then why try to confuse the dancers with some newfangled name? Could it be they just can't resist the urge to get their name in print?

If this method of constructing new basics is continued it won't be long until all

the caller will have to do is sing out "A" and the dancers will do a combination of simple basics. Follow this with a "W" and they will do another combination. But the callers had better take heed because when this comes to pass the dancers will do away with callers and buy a computer. This will work fine until some enterprising soul will program the computer to blast out with an "DCXT" and then where the hell are we?

I'm just waiting until some caller calls a "Pyramid." For your information the procedure is as follows. Number one couple kneels down, number two couple kneels on top of them and so on until all four couples are stacked in a Pyramid. Then the caller, with an unholy gleam in his eye, will come out with "Now the number one couple whirl away to a half sashay." Confusion?

Now, back to Don's article. He has a terrific idea about word of mouth advertising to build up the strength of our clubs and beginners classes. I have felt this way all along and have finally arrived at the conclusion that before you can have an effective advertising campaign of this type you have to have a whole horde of people who are enthusiastic about their hobby. And, once started, enthusiastic enough to help new people reach the stage where they can leave the beginners group and take their place in the Square Dancing fold. But—so many people complain about the beginners and refuse to dance with them that it is no wonder so many of them quit before they really get going.

Just a thought—how many new dancers have been brought into Square Dancing by the so called "high level" dancers that believe the only place to dance is at a workshop conducted by some out-of-the-area caller?

Keep up the good work Don. Keep plugging along with your ideas and maybe it will all bear fruit someday. Since it just isn't in me to agree with everything, Don, I would like to take exception to your re-

marks about giving trading stamps to entice new people into Square Dancing. I believe that we have too many good things to give those who join us without giving stamps. Besides—they could join several beginners groups and get enough stamps to turn in for a bowling ball and, there goes another dancer.

I have heard an undercurrent of concern about another matter. It seems as though we are entering into another era of "Badgitis." All kinds of new and sometimes silly badges are making their appearance. Two recent ones are "I have Square Danced in a Bar" and "I have Square Danced in Jail." No one should object if an individual wants to dance in a bar—or a jail for that matter. But why advertise it? It surely isn't doing the image of Square Dancing any good. Do you want our beginners believing that in order to enjoy dancing he has to hang around a bar or spend his weekends in jail? Think it over!

Thank you Corinne, for your nice remarks. My face is almost as red as your hair! Your article was well written and perfectly timed. I hope that everyone reads it over a couple of times so that they can get the full meaning. Do it again sometime soon?

This is Christmas month. Let's all get together and give Square Dancing a nice present by bringing just one couple into our group. Later on they will realize that actually you gave them a wonderful present. May the best of everything come to you and yours during the Holiday Season!

MADELINE ALLEN ERUPTS

Dear Ed,

Remember? I said I'd write you a letter whenever I got mad enough. Well, I am.

Dan and I have been against this 'Senior Citizens Promenade' bit from the beginning, for a number of reasons. We have never liked to see any kind of styling introduced that interfered with the normal flow of the square, and this certainly does. It also sometimes interferes with the next square, when that wide reverse turn runs into it, to say nothing of the heels that get trodden on when an energetic couple, after tramping to the center of the square, backs out again too far. The excuse that it is 'easier' is

ridiculous—us real 'Senior Citizens' simply promenaded home and stop. The worst feature of it—up until now, anyhow—has been that it is obviously being done by those who go to certain workshops, to prove that they do. 'Look at me,' they are saying. 'I am more advanced than you.' So all in all, we have disapproved, and have told people so whenever we were asked.

But now a new dimension has been added, and it touches an old wound. Up until now, the men seemed to use this turn with their own wives, or other 'advanced' friends, but with partners they did not know, they went back to standard styling. Recently, however, I have run into a number of men who are forcing me—and I do mean forcing, with real strength—to do it their way. By means of a firm grip on my left hand, and a strong push on my back, they are making me turn out and away from the square, when all I want to do is to turn toward the square and stay there. At first I could not believe that a good dancer would really insist, by force, on a lady doing a styling bit she obviously did not want to do. Remember the Back-Lash, and the trouble we had avoiding being whipped around willy-nilly? Ever since that time, I have made a point of indicating early in the promenade that I did not want anything fancy done. I got around the Back-Lash by slipping my hands out of his before he had a chance to jerk me off my feet. Now, I try to indicate my preference in the promenade by presenting both hands in front, in the standard position. If this obvious hint is disregarded by the gentleman, then I can only assume he isn't one. 'Oh yeh,' he is saying, 'that's what you think! Here's how us hep guys do it!' and he gives me the works.

So here we are, back at the subject of 'Rough Dancing' again. This simple bit of styling, meant to be 'smooth,' and perfectly acceptable when done by good dancers in private clubs, has been picked up and exaggerated by careless dancers until it is a menace to all of us. This is the story of all 'high level' styles. Look at the extra twirls done so well by the exhibition groups and so awkwardly by everyone else. So I ask you Workshop dancers—please keep all your special styling for your own Clubs, and don't flaunt it at open dances, where it is bound to be copied and misused. And let's face it that is exactly what you have been doing.
