RECORD: "Alabama Waltz" - Grenn 14074

POSITION: OPEN-FACING for INTRO

FOOTWORK: Opposite; directions given for M unless otherwise indicated.

MEASURES

INTRODUCTION

1 - 4 WAIT; WAIT; APART, PT, -; TOG, TCH, -;

In Open-Facing Pos M's R & W's L hands joined wait 2 meas;; Step apart on L, pt R twd ptr, hold 1 ct; Step twd ptr & slightly twd RLOD on R, tch L to R with joined hands twd RLOD, hold 1 ct.

DANCE

1 - 4 FWD WALTZ, 2, 3; W WRAP(LF), 2, 3; FWD WALTZ, 2, 3; FWD(Face), SIDE, CLOSE(to CP);

Start M's L waltz fwd & slightly away down LOD L, R, L; M waltz fwd LOD short steps R, L, R at same time lowering joined hands to W's waist as W does a LF wrap in 3 steps to end fcg LOD and extending her R arm across in front of her chest - ptrs end in WRAP POS with W at M's R side M's L & W's R hands joined at W's chest & M's R & W's L hands joined at W's waist; In wrap waltz fwd LOD L, R, L; Releasing M's R & W's L hands but retaining others step thru twd LOD on R (W on L) turning to face ptr in CP M's bk COH, step swd LOD on L, close R to L.

5 - 8 BAL BK, -, -; MANUV (1/4 RF), 2, 3; R TURN WALTZ, 2, 3; R TURN WALTZ, 2, 3 (to Open-fcg);

In CP bal bwd twd COH on L (W fwd on R), hold 2 cts; Start fwd on R turning 1/4 RF to face RLOD, step swd twd wall on L, close R to L; Start bwd on M's L & do 2 RF turning waltzes down LOD L, R, L; R, L, R to end in OPEN-FCG POS.

9 - 16 FWD WALTZ, 2, 3; W WRAP(LF), 2, 3; FWD WALTZ, 2, 3; FWD(Face), SIDE, CLOSE(to CP); BAL BK, -, -; MANUV(1/4 RF), 2, 3; R TURN WALTZ, 2, 3; R TURN WALTZ, 2, 3(to SCP);

Repeat action of Meas 1-8 EXCEPT to end in SCP FACING LOD.

17 - 20 FWD WALTZ, 2, 3; TWINKLE LOD, 2, 3(to Rev-SCP); TWINKLE RLOD, 2, 3(to SCP); FWD WALTZ, 2, 3;

In SCP waltz fwd LOD L, R, L; Step fwd R turning to face ptr, swd LOD on L turning to REV-SCP fcg RLOD, close R to L; Step fwd RLOD on L turning to face ptr, swd in RLOD on R turning to SCP fcg LOD, close L to R; Waltz fwd LOD R, L, R.

21 - 24 FWD WALTZ, 2, 3; TWINKLE LOD, 2, 3; TWINKLE RLOD, 2, 3; FWD WALTZ, 2, 3 (to CP);

Repeat Action of Meas. 17-20 EXCEPT to end in CP M's BK to COH.

25-28 (Canter)BK, -, CLOSE; BK, TCH, -; (Canter)FWD, -, CLOSE; MANUV, 2, 3(to CP);

In CP step bwd twd COH on L, hold 1 ct, close R to L; Step bwd L, tch R to L, Hold 1 ct; Step fwd twd wall on R, hold 1 ct, close L to R; Step fwd R turning 1/4 RF to face RLOD, swd twd wall on L, close R to L.

29 - 32 R TURN WALTZ, 2, 3; R TURN WALTZ, 2, 3; R TURN WALTZ, 2, 3; W TWIRL, 2, 3(to Open-fcg);

In CP start bwd on M's L & do 3 RF turning waltzes down LOD L, R, L; R, L, R; L, R, L; M waltzes fwd LOD R, L, R - as W does 1 RF twirl under joined M's L & W's R hands - to end in OPEN-FACING POS to repeat dance.

DANCE IS DONE THREE TIMES IN ALL

END: The last time thru of the 3rd sequence at end of twirl, Bow & Curtsy.

Many thinking Square Dancers and Callers have indicated they are concerned about the gradual decrease in the number of Square Dancers. In the past the normal attrition was more than taken care of by beginners classes. But now, with beginners classes fewer in number and smaller in size we have finally reached the point of diminishing returns.

This is further complicated by the fact that a smaller percentage of beginners are staying with Square Dancing. It would be interesting to know how many dancers who started beginners classes a year ago are still dancing.

I know of no one who would have the exact figures but in my conversations with dancers and callers I gather the percentage of dropouts would be extremely high. Regardless of the reason for the gradual decrease in the number of replacements I firmly believe we are overlooking an untapped source of supply.

I think that that source is the teen-age dancer. For more reasons than one, adult dancers should take a long look at the reasons that most clubs refuse to accept these youngsters into their clubs. To my knowledge the number of clubs that do are scarcer than the number of calls Ed Ferrario can do without a cue sheet.

One of the reasons called to my attention is, "We want an evening away from the kids." Perhaps in this day and age it might be a good idea to spend a little more time in recreation WITH the kids. If more parents did this there is a strong possibility there might be fewer weirdies who are willing to protest against anything and everything at the drop of a hat - also there might be fewer kids who discover, too late, that the cop in the patrol car is their friend instead of their enemy.

Another reason, brought out by far too many dancers, is that the kids put so many extra twirls and frills into their dancing

that they foul up the square. This theory will not hold water. The kids DO have a way of dancing that is not conducive to "good" Square Dancing as we older (chronologically speaking) dancers interpret it. But - they do this when they are in their own squares. They can and do dance as gracefully and as well as most other dancers and far better than some.

In my line of work I am granted the privilege of working with teen-age kids - 220 of them every day. So - I speak from experience when I say that everyone of them not only want a chance to prove themselves they need that chance. And, what better way to give them that chance than to accept them as much as possible into our adult recreations. Don't forget, they will be adults soon - maybe too soon.

One of the teen-age groups in this area who have become well known statewide in two short years is the Northern California Stardettes. This exhibition group, made up of selected members of regular teen-age clubs, rehearse every other Saturday. They give their time and talents so they can do their part in bringing fine dancing not only to other Square Dancers but to other organizations. In addition to presenting their routines at the Golden State Round-up, State Conventions and County Fairs they have performed for clubs and church groups where they have received the finest of accolades - "When can you come back?"

To those of you who believe these kids cannot conduct themselves as you believe they should I ask you to join them the next time they perform. Watch them, after their exhibition, when they take partners from the audience and help them through an impromptu beginners session. It's hard to tell who is having the most fun, the kids or the adults and you are either so proud of them you are ready to bust or there is something wrong with you.

I don't mean to indicate that this group is the only teen-age group, it isn't. There

are several regular teen-age clubs in the area and each time they meet each youngster has a ball. So - how do you get them started?

There are several ways. If your own club is starting a beginners class sign up the kids then get them started in a group at their own age level. If your club does not have a beginners class check the Teen-age Section of Square Dance-Where? Here you will find clubs that show the age groups - all the way from sub-teens to the full fledged teen-ager.

Once they are started and find out how much fun it is, be sure and include them in your own Square Dance Activities as much as possible. You will find they won't want to quit their own teen club because it is here they will have the most fun - among their own kind, talking their own language. This is as it should be because without teen groups where would most of the kids have a chance to learn?

A look at the calendar shows that we have started another new year. Along with making the steps higher, the blocks longer, the weather colder, the newsprint in smaller type, the noises quieter, and the dancing at too fast a beat, does it seem to you they are making the years shorter? Just thought I would ask.

May Faye and I extend to you wonderful people, Square Dancers, this wish for the New Year? May many things happen to you and yours and may each of them be better than the preceding one. Also a special "Thank You" and a special "Best Wishes" to all the fine people who are giving their time to work with "Our Kids."

letter to the editor

Editor:

This will mark the second year for my wife and I in square dancing. We love it. We joined up mainly for the winter season exercise but by now it is the sheer enjoyment of it that keeps us dancing twice weekly. We go to a hoedown almost every Saturday night and thoroughly enjoy the people, the callers and the music.

Upon subscribing to your magazine we find there is a vein of discontent among dancers and callers over the problem of scarcity in numbers. It is true our own club is struggling for survival and in talking with other club members we find the average-sized club these days is four or five squares. This is puzzling to us who find square dancing is so much fun.

It seems to me that the nut of the problem is in the people. The participants. People have the capacity of either attracting other people or of driving them away. And the key to the entire problem is hospitality and sociability, that is sincere and genuine. With these two, any club can be a success.

It is perhaps presumptuous of me, but let me offer my opinions on the negative features of the current square-dance arena, in particular the downgrading people factors in the order of their importance:

One. The cliques. These are formed in the beginner groups and are carried on into the regulars. They are usually formed

by people friendly to one another on the outside who, for this reason, decide they must always dance together. Nothing so disturbs and disgusts other beginners as this one factor. It belies all that they've heard about the sociability of square dancing and it is the duty of the caller to break up these early cliques as soon as possible. Too often he doesn't.

Two. The snobs. These are sometimes your high-level dancers, your perfectionists, who are selective with whom they dance (particularly at hoedowns). The snobs compose your cliques, and it is more than a little disurbing to see some Queen Bee at one end of the floor waving frantically to her little group at the other end to hurry! come dance! - at the same time totally ignoring other dancers standing nearby. Sad to say it is usually the ladies who are guilty of this gross impropriety. Again, it is the job of the hoedown caller to circumvent these situations, if he can.

Three. The loose-jawed callers. Callers should remember - hoedown callers especially - that the dancers come out in numbers to dance, not to listen to their latest jokes or to shouting conversations with some old friend in the crowd. A few jokes are fine (provided they are really funny) but not done to excess. At some hoedowns my wife and I have stood waiting for the dance to begin what seemed a good ten minutes, while the caller discoursed about something he considered funny or important. A little horseplay between two callers is good, again provided it is kept to a minimum.

Four. All callers. The caller is the captain of his ship. He is often the difference between success or failure of a club. As well as an entertaining caller he must be a strong one. By that I mean he must look for the danger signals and be alert enough to spot them. Then do something about it. Quick.

On the positive side is the tremendous opportunity for sociability offered by square dancing. Most of us like squares because we like dancing and we like people. Snobs notwithstanding, we will attend hoedowns because most of the dancers are friendly. For myself, I like to mix and would appreciate more callers who really stir up the groups - the whole floor - so that every male dancer present gets to twirl at least once every female. It's been done. In our brief experience only once, in Boulder Creek. It

was great fun. Everyone enjoyed it.

A mere experience **MARTIN PARL**

I went to the Peninsula Squares last night and the square dancing was all right, but when it came up to the rounds, it was really something. One thing I will say in behalf of the ladies, at least, they admitted beforehand and warned you they did not know them. But who am I to let a little thing like not knowing a dance interfere with my getting on the floor and making a stab at it. The music is just too tempting and I love it so. Of course, it all depends on who the woman is. Some are light and supple and easy to maneuver. Others are cumbersome, sort of heavyweight. Some take to the music easily, others do not. And then also it depends on the dance itself. I have found, for example, that it is very easy to lead a woman through Tick Tock Melody. But when it comes to Hooten' Tooten'- that is something else again. One woman actually told me I was not pressing her back hard enough. We were doing the Tennessee Waltz and I told her, smilingly, that the next time I would really be rough. And that reminds me. The man assumes the lead. And it is his job to give the signal. The delicacy with which he does this is all important. Teachers of folk dancing and the tango have brought out over and over again how important it is not only to have the proper posture, position, but by a movement of the arm, maybe a little pressure, lead a woman into the right pattern.

So all in all I enjoy dancing of this type, because it tests my ingenuity. And, believe me, after last night I found I had lots to learn.

The experience showed I have to know the steps perfectly. There cannot be a pause, a hesitation. You just have to click and harmonize with the music, because you not only have yourself to look after but a fragile partner as well. And that is what really makes for fun. Because this morning I am going over all the round dances of last night, play all the records and see if I can

not perfect myself. At what point, I ask myself, was I in doubt? Did I hesitate?

And so round dancing you find is an ongoing process in which you continue where you left off. Only in this instance the continuation is in your own room. It is sort of a home work as a preparation, a means of betterment when you go out again in pursuit of a dance.

DON ATKINS SPEAKS

Let's start off this article with why the loss of dancers and members of our clubs? Of what I am about to comment on is not in regards to every club or caller in our area or in these United States. However I do mean to point out the fact that there is a large number of clubs in areas that are having a problem with the loss of members, and I think by mentioning some of the reasons that we do lose dancers can help to rectify the situation for some clubs and areas that are affected by a loss of dancers.

First of all let's start out with a beginners class or newer dancers hoedown. Who is it that teaches at least in half of all our classes that get started, or at most of our newer dancers hoedowns? Who! The beginner, or newer, unqualified, inexperienced caller, what's who!

Now I ask you fellow square dancers and callers, why should the brand new beginners always have to learn and dance to the newest callers and teachers. We are all striving extra hard to build square dancing, yet we actually chase people away by having inexperienced or newer callers teach and call to these much needed people whom are the very backbone of our square dance picture.

I say more effort should be made by the regular club callers, and even the top pros could help out and do a little teaching and calling to the newer dancers.

I take great pride in teaching and working with beginners and every year I teach at least one or more new classes. This year I am teaching three new classes along with calling for four regular clubs.

Newer callers! do not get me wrong, I know that you need a place to learn to

call and teach but I do not believe that it is teaching a class just after you have graduated from class or calling a tip or two at a newer dancers hoedown. These new dancers need the best teacher and callers they can get, and this is no place for you to practice on.

I think that our Callers Association or someone should form a special type of new callers club which would serve as a place for our newer callers to call and practice. Maybe they could meet twice a month and with wife and dancing friends, there should be plenty of people to dance to these new callers.

After about a full year or more in such a club we then could graduate these new callers from this club and allow them to teach and call at newer dancers hoedowns and clubs.

While we are still on this subject of newer callers (of which I am responsible for producing many of our new callers in the last few years, and will produce many more to come.) I will gladly help in any way to get started a callers club for these new people to start in and I ask you to write or get in touch with me for ideas on how to get started.

Let's hear from all the newer callers and if they would be interested in such a club. You can write to me at my home address which is 1956 Solano Way, Concord, California.

I think that a lot relies on how good an impression the new dancer receives from his first few weeks and months of dancing.

Whenever a new dancer is discouraged by poor calling, voice, sound, etc., he is not having fun and if he stops having fun he may look to other clubs or quit dancing for good.

We must change some of our methods if we are to improve our square dance picture.

Nowhere in the outside business world can a new worker start working at a specialized job until he has met all the qualifications and has worked his way up to be able to handle the job. Why then should square dancing be different. Let's try to improve by doing away with newer hoedowns that advertise callers from the floor and replace these with just one or two top local experienced callers who can call a dance that will have the newer dancers begging for more, and can hardly wait until the next

dance night.

I would also like to say a little about our local callers as well as the new beginning caller.

Speaking mainly to the square dance club officers of all clubs in general, I ask you, when you hire a caller to call a hoedown for you, or even a caller to call for your club, do you look into the facts about the person you are about to hire? Does he have a good clear voice? Can he carry a tune? Does he have a lot of rhythm and good timing? Most of all, can he learn new material and teach good? Also what about sound equipment, does he have a real old set that does not work good, or a new set with good sound for any hall that he may call in for your club.

Will this caller constantly mix the dancers up and not know how to straighten them out, and will he always repeat the same program, night after night even for as long as a year or more.

If so, it is time to either get rid of this caller or warn him to get on the ball, as he will be the cause of dancers dropping from your club.

I know of a local caller who has been calling for seven or more years and he uses a broken down piece of sound equipment and calls old records of seven years or more. He very seldom buys a new record for the enjoyment of his dancers. He does not seem to care if the people can hear or not but he wonders why they do not come to his dances. I do not ask that a new caller invest in the best equipment when he first starts, but as his clubs and finances build up he should get better equipment and new records for the enjoyment of his dancers. Some callers will disagree with me on this, but I ask you, can a plumber or carpenter start to work at his profession without good tools to start out with. Business people have to invest in equipment to get started with and so does a good caller. Well that's it for now. Look for article three on how callers can help to build your club financially and in size.

Let's start off this final story with how a club caller can help his club if they are in need of financial help.

A club caller can volunteer his services and have the club set-up a special fund raising hoedown. He can also invite members of any other clubs that he may call for and stress to them how important it is for them to support the special dance. If possible the club caller might try to have another buddy caller as a guest caller at this special dance, explaining that he will only receive expense money for his services. Such a planned dance can net a club \$100. or more which can be a big boon to lifting a club back on its feet. Now don't get me wrong, I do not say that all the callers should donate their services for nothing all the time, only at a special dance for the benefit of the club that has financial problems.

When a club drops down in size and financially it is time to take fast action to try to save it. Another successful method for raising a club's treasury is to sell tickets on a raffle. Some of the items to raffle off could be a turkey, ham, fishing pole or cash.

Now let's not just sell our raffle tickets to square dancers only, we can sell to the milk man, insurance man, neighbors, and best of all our relatives.

Closing this subject I would like to say it is much better to have a fund raising dance or raffle than to assess club members extra money and have them quit for good.

I would like to say a little about the complaint of too many new basics. I think that the problem is not too many new basics but rather that the club callers do not analyze the new basics good enough and cannot weed out the good from the bad. Also enough time is not spent in teaching new basics to make sure everyone in the club understands them.

I think that our number one problem with clubs not having enough money in their

treasury is because most clubs constantly lose money by having too many hoedowns.

Let's face the facts, there are just too many hoedowns on the same Saturday. If we want our club to build then I strongly urge the callers and dancers associations to get together and set up a schedule for each separate district that will plan and control all Saturday night Hoedowns so that most clubs would be limited to only four Hoedowns a year.

By doing this we will be able to guarantee that when a club has a Saturday night dance that there will be no other competition in that area, and then there would be a successful dance every Saturday night with the sponsoring club making money instead of losing, as is now the case with most clubs.

If we continue at this present pace we cannot survive as the competition is too great, and we are trying to build a good strong square dance future, not tear one to pieces.

We need better organization and now is the time to start. It might be rough on some clubs and callers at first, but in six months to a year square dance clubs will show a marked increase financially.

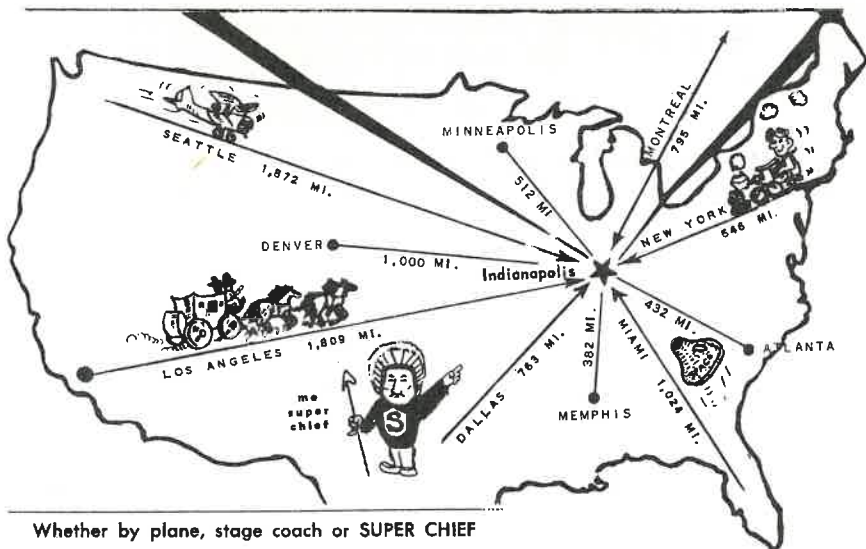
A club with money in the treasury can move, and grow and stay together. I think that it would be very easy for all association clubs to turn in a list of their hoedowns and callers that they have booked for the coming year, and for a special committee to take charge and set-up the hoedowns for the coming year. Sure some of the callers and clubs might get mad, but I say square dancing is for the people and not for callers or larger clubs to always make the money and never give others a chance to grow.

I ask you callers reading this article, would you rather call fewer hoedowns for your club with 15 to 20 squares in attendance or call every month to 4 or 5 squares simply because there were too many other hoedowns going on on the same night.

We will have all the bookings we want in the future if we just try to build ourselves a future in square dancing.

A club in poor financial condition, hangs on for a long period of time, making the dances and caller come each meeting night feeling obligated to come down, but no longer having fun.

Remember, square dancing is supposed to be fun and not an obligation.
