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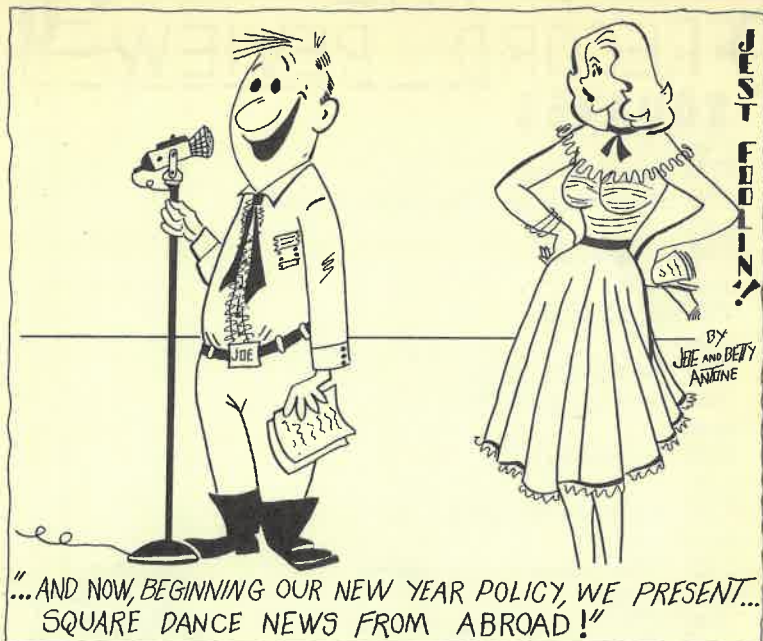

THOUGHTS & COMMENTS !!

Interesting reading in the last issue of *Where?* Don Atkins, local caller, came out with not one but two articles picking to pieces new callers and the financial status of clubs.

He asks why it is that "brand new dancers ALWAYS (caps are mine) have to learn and dance to the newest callers and teachers." Donny Boy - I just can't believe this! How about when you are teaching a beginners class? How about some of the real good old timers such as Ed Looney, Nonie Moglia, Skip Graham, and Lee Helsel - just to name a few. I'm sure that if you were to make a check on beginners classes you would find that practically all of them are being conducted by callers who have been around for a long time and - their finished product is as good or better than any group turned out in any section of the country.

Now, with reference to a club hiring a caller for a hoedown. The only criterion I can use as to what callers are being hired for hoedowns is the advertisements in *Square Dance-Where?* Have you looked lately? The clubs do not have to ask if these callers have good voices, can carry a tune, have good equipment, etc. They know they fill the necessary requirements, otherwise they wouldn't be hired. As to whether they can "teach good" - no caller worth his salt will spend hoedown time teaching - the dancers come to dance.

Then we come to the new callers. Don, have you ever stopped to think that maybe the ratio between the number of callers and the number of dancers is getting out of hand in favor of the callers? If every new caller aspires to a club, and they do, where will they find the dancers? Haven't you heard, Don, that the number of Dancers is decreasing?

Let's go a little further. Don's remarks about callers for the newer dancers hoedowns. He asks the question "Who is it that teaches at least half of all our classes that

get started, or AT MOST OF OUR NEWER DANCERS HOEDOWNS?" (Again the caps are mine.) He then answers his own question by stating "The beginner, or newer, UNQUALIFIED, INEXPERIENCED caller, that's who" (my caps)

Don, just two little questions. How come this type of caller is graduated from a callers class? You should be able to answer this question - you teach one. Once again, read the ads in *Where?* Do the callers named in the ads for Newer Dancer Hoedowns fit your description?

I do believe that a new caller should have an opportunity to work under an experienced and proven caller until he has earned his spurs. Maybe I'm wrong - but I have been laboring under the impression that this was a duty the Callers Association took upon themselves a couple of years ago. If they haven't, they should. If they don't, then maybe such a class as Don suggests might be good. At least he should be commended for thinking of it and offering to help.

Now for Article No. 3, pertaining to club finances. I believe that before anyone talks about the poor condition of the club treasury they should take a look at what is causing this depletion. I'm sure that they will find that a lack of cash in the treasury is caused by a lack of members in the club. I believe that if there are not enough dancers in a club to maintain the club without exorbitant dues then that club should fold. There are plenty other clubs for the dancers.

Hoedowns should not be a means of keeping the club intact and solvent. Putting on a hoedown means putting a lot of dancers to work and quite often the work goes for naught and a further slice into the bank balance. Hoedowns should be an extra curricular activity and not a prerequisite for a shot in the arm of an ailing treasury. Any proceeds from hoedowns should be used to provide "extra" fun for the workers, such as picnics, bus trips, etc.

I further believe that I should not be required to "work" for my recreation. I work

so that I might live. I pay my dues in a Square Dance Club so that I may enjoy this recreation. By the above I do not mean that dancers should not participate in the work involved in running the club. Being an officer in your club is not only an honor it is part of the fun of being a member of a club.

The first time my caller gave me a batch of raffle tickets for a ham and suggested I sell them to the "milkman, the insurance man, neighbors, or my relatives" so that the club could survive I'm afraid I would look upon him as a reject from outer space.

Don, The Dancers Association did make an honest attempt to set up a schedule of hoedowns for its member clubs. It failed because the clubs were not receptive to the idea. There are many people who will agree with you on this subject and I believe the Association should make another attempt.

Last but not least Don, you mention the "complaint of too many basics." You state "I think the problem is not too many new basics but rather that the club callers do not analyze the new basics good enough and cannot weed out the good from the bad." Here you hit the nail right on the head only it should not be the decision of the individual caller as to what new basics might be called, but rather, it should be the decision of the Callers Association working in conjunction with the Dancers Association so that all dancers would be taught the same thing.

Is the subject of too many new basics important? Are too many new basics one big reason dancers are leaving the fold (resulting in depleted treasuries)? This is not only a local problem it is national in scope.

Nationally known caller Harold Bausch states in his column in the Square Dance Reporter that at the last meeting of their Omaha Area Callers Association they discussed the "one problem that has plagued Square Dancing from coast to coast. What do we do with all the new basics?" Harold's suggestion is they call them gimmicks and bring them in gradually - don't expect the dancers to memorize them. This might be good but - gimmicks, gammucks or gum-micks, they will still be new movements and unless a dancer wants to be given a lesson before each tip he will still have to memorize them.

Before I close a special note to a couple

of other correspondents to Where? I would not want to be in their shoes. You know what they did? They criticized the ladies! They are now prime candidates for the cutty stool!

To "Mac the Knife (I'll bet many a Gal would like to stick one in your back), women are not the only "snobs and compose(rs) of cliques." Look around, you may find a man or two who would fit this category.

And to Martin Parl. I have heard the girls mention the fact that there are some men who are not "light and supple," instead they are "cumbersome, sort of heavy-weight." I'm glad it's you that said it, not me!

- 2. Teacher:** Teaches one or more folk or square dance group and is actively interested in improving square dance teaching. Voting member. Membership fee \$4.00 per year.
- 3. Subscriber:** Either a caller or teacher as defined above but resides outside of the Northern California area. Has no vote. Membership fee \$4.00 per year.
- 4. Associate:** Does not qualify as a caller or teacher as defined above. Prospective or beginning callers or square dance teachers qualify as associates. Has no vote. Membership fee \$4.00 per year.
