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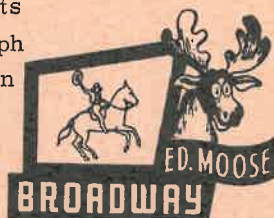

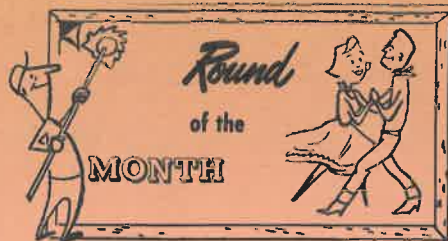

MEASURES INTRODUCTION

1-4 WAIT; WAIT: APART, -, POINT,-; TOGETHER (toSCP), -, TOUCH,-;

In Open-Facing Pos (M's back twd COH, M's R & W's L hands joined) wait 2 meas;; Step apart (bwd) on L, -, point R twd ptr, -; Step together on R assuming Semi-CP, -, touch L to R to end in SCP fcg LOD.

PART A

1-4 FWD TWO-STEP; FWD TWO-STEP (to OP): BWD BOX 1/2 (SIDE, CLOSE, BACK,-); FWD BOX 1/2 (SIDE, CLOSE, FWD, -);

In SCP fcg LOD starting M's L do 2 fwd two-steps prog LOD;; Assuming OPEN POS fcg LOD & retaining joined inside hands (M's R & W's L) M steps swd on L (twd COH), close R to L, step bwd on L (twd RLOD),-; Step swd on R (twd wall & ptr), close L to R, step fwd on R (twd LOD),-.

5-8 CROSS OVER TWO-STEP; FWD TWO-STEP; CROSS OVER TWO-STEP; FWD TWO-STEP (to SCP);

Releasing joined M's R & W's L hands and joining lead hands (M's L & W's R) do a fwd two-step - W crossing IF of M under joined hands diagonally fwd and twd COH (M will cross behind W diag fwd & twd wall) to end in L-OPEN POS fcg LOD inside hands joined (M's L & W's R); Do 1 fwd two-step prog LOD; Joining new lead hands (M's R & W's L) in 1 fwd two-step W will cross IF of M under joined hands diag fwd & twd wall (M crosses behind W diag fwd and twd COH) to end in OPEN POS fcg LOD inside hands joined (M's R & W's L); Do 1 fwd two-step blending to SEMI-CP at the end of Meas 8.

9-16 REPEAT ACTION OF MEAS 1-8 —EXCEPT END IN CLOSED POS M fcg wall & ptr.

PART B

17-20 (BOX) SIDE, CLOSE, FWD, -; SIDE, CLOSE, BWD,-; (Scissors) SIDE,CLOSE, CROSS,-; SIDE, CLOSE, CROSS,-;

In CP M fcg wall do a full box in two meas: M steps swd on L, close R to L, steps fwd on L, -; Step swd on R, close L to R, step bwd on R,-; Step swd on L, close R to L, step L XIF of R (W XIB), -; Step swd on R, close L to R, step R XIF of L (W XIB), -.

21-24 TURN TWO-STEP; TURN TWO-STEP; W TWIRL,-,2,-; WALK,-,2,-;

In CP do 2 RF turning two-steps prog LOD;; M walks fwd LOD L,-,R,- as W does 1 RF twirl in 2 slow steps (R,-,L,-) under leading hands to end in SEMI-CP fcg LOD; In SEMI-CP walk fwd LOD L,-,R,- to end fcg ptr and wall in CLOSED POS.

25-32 REPEAT ACTION OF MEAS 17-24 ending in SEMI-CP FCG LOD.

DANCE IS DONE THREE TIMES IN ALL.

ENDING: On Meas 32 of LAST TIME THRU STEP APART & ACKNOWLEDGE.

STABILIZED BASICS

I have taken my cuts at the Callers Association and still believe I was right in doing it. But now I find that instead of a cut I, along with all the dancers in the area, am happily forced to extend to them a hearty "well done." They have earned a well deserved pat on the back for a pair of deeds that will place square dancing in this area at a new high.

First, for the Keokuk Benefit Dance. This was an idea that was born among the callers and they and their Association are solely responsible for its instigation. The ball was given to Don Shotwell and he did not fumble once.

The organizational problems behind such an event are tremendous. Don could not have done the job alone but part of his ability to get the show started is shown in the people he asked for help, both callers and dancers. To all the people in square dancing throughout the country this group once again proved that Northern California callers and dancers can and do go first class.

In case you didn't read the last issue of Where? let me review what happened. During a square dance in Keokuk, Iowa a gas leak resulted in an explosion that took the lives of several dancers. As a result quite a few families were forever broken up and money was a prime need to help the survivors of the dancers.

Several Benefit Dances were held throughout the country but the one we are interested in is the one Don and his crew so successfully promoted. After the affair was over and the money counted Don was happy to announce that almost one thousand seven hundred dollars had been collected!

I know Don, that the recipients of this windfall will be unable to express their thanks - that would be impossible. But they will try, and when you hear from them, please read between the lines for it is here that you and your gang will find how much they truly appreciate your efforts. Once

again Don and the Callers Association and the Dancers - thank you!

The second item of importance that came from the Callers Association is their agreement to put basics back where they belong. This has been a long time coming but they have finally seen the light.

As I understand it basics will be reviewed by the callers and those that are danceable will be taken back to the clubs and workshopped. Now here is the important thing! The dancers, the individuals who make square dancing what it is, will have an opportunity to express their will as to what basics shall be used.

They can either approve or disapprove of the new basic. The callers will then either accept or reject the basic depending on the vote of the clubs. It should immediately be apparent as to the result of this method of handling the overflow of new basics that has resulted in far too many dancers quitting.

First, the dancers will be doing the dances they have accepted and will not be forced to spend hours of workshop time practicing basics they not only do not like but know will not be around for any appreciable length of time. In the past they have been forced to do this if they had any intention of dancing at hoedowns - 'cause who knew what would be thrown at them?

Second, all the callers will be teaching the same basics. Basics that will be called at dances. Let's hope that some caller, trying to prove his versatility, will not take off on a tangent and use basics that have not been accepted. This can and will throw the whole plan out of kilter. If this should happen let's all get together and tell him to get back on the main track.

Now with square dancing back on a level keel as far as basics are concerned I think it would be a good idea if everybody would work doubly hard to get our dropouts back into the fold. You can now promise them that they can miss a night or two and still not feel like a stranger when they come back.

I have just finished reading an article in the California Square Dancer published in Southern California written by Evelyn Johnson. I thought that it was well worth repeating and asking for your suggestions.

SQUARE 'EM UP

"We are sure most of us are proud of being Square Dancers and Round Dancers, to be able to identify with an activity that offers so much in friendships, social contacts and fun. We identify our persons with the very clothes we wear; with name badges; club badges; association badges. We identify our cars with big and little decals of square and round dance figures; with association and club stickers; with bumper strips. one cannot drive far without seeing a car bearing one or more of these designs which tells the world—LOOK! A SQUARE DANCER! So—why is it most of the drivers of

these cars fail to salute one another when passing on the streets? On numerous occasions we have seen the bright reflector square dance figure on the car ahead and, upon passing, we have given a BEEP, BEEP of the horn, just as a friendly greeting. Very seldom have we received a reply in kind. Possibly the other fellow would acknowledge the greeting if he knew it was a dancer honking, but by the time he looks at the car and the driver, the opportunity is past. Some months ago this column carried a suggestion made by one of the local dancers, that some easy signal be adopted, one that could be used nationally, for square dancer to salute square dancer when meeting on the highway. Guess the suggestion didn't register at the time so we offer it again for we feel it is worthy of consideration as it would be one more way of showing how friendly square dancers can be. The suggestion was; that a prescribed series of beeps on the auto horn, such as "BE-E-E-P, BEEP BEEP" would alert the other driver to the fact that another square dancer was in the car and he could answer with a BEEP and a friendly wave of the hand—a "HI-SQUARE" greeting. One needn't know them personally—just the fact they are square dancers makes them friends!

Perhaps one of the Associations will take up the suggestion, maybe have a contest for the signal and soon every one will get in on the act—huh???"

SQUARE DANCER'S PARADE

GOLDEN STATE
Round-Up

The dream of every General Chairman and Program Chairman of the Golden State Round-Up has been to have a PARADE to dramatize the Golden State Round-Up. This year it appears as though this dream is to be fulfilled in present plans for the 13th Annual Golden State Round-Up.

Meetings have been held with representatives of the Oakland Chamber of Commerce, the Downtown Merchants Association and the members of the Parade Committee for the City of Oakland. Approval for the Parade, a tentative line of march, necessitated by the construction plans for BART, and participation by the Merchants Association have been discussed and are in the process of being consummated.

The theme for the parade as well as the Round-Up itself will be; "Happiness is Square Dancing." To make the first parade dedicated to Square Dancing and to the Golden State Round-Up a success is dependent on the support of every square dancer in the Northern California Square Dancer's Association, as well as the support from neighboring Associations. When you realize the wonderful publicity a parade will generate for the Square Dance movement, what else is there to do but give it your whole-hearted support.

As the parade will be limited to fifty vehicles, it will of necessity require an early sign-up to insure your club or organization a spot in the line of march.

"Our" Parade will be on Saturday morning, May 28, 1966. Starting at 20th and Telegraph Avenue at 10 o'clock, the line of march will be south, down Telegraph Ave. to 15th Street. East on 15th Street to Webster Street. South on Webster Street to 9th Street. East on 9th Street to Oak Street — North on Oak Street to 10th Street. East on 10th Street to the east end of the Auditorium. Outstanding Floats will be parked on 10th Street, next to the Auditorium for display all day Saturday.

Present plans also call for the selection of a "Queen" for the parade, a Square Dance platform in the Civic Center with one or two squares dancing, a public proclamation of "Square Dance Week" in Oakland

for the week of the Golden State Round-Up, a reviewing stand for judging the best float, and displays in many of the windows of downtown stores.

"Everyone Loves a Parade." What more fun can a club or group of clubs have than joining together in constructing an entry in the parade. Let your imagination run wild. Secure one of the Square Dance merchants to help sponsor your float. Have your Recreation Department of your city assist in sponsoring an entry. Financially speaking, a real fine float can be prepared for a surprisingly small amount of money. Since neither the parade or Square Dancing is a competitive sport, the basic idea is to have fun and do our best. Entry blanks and information is in the process of being mailed to clubs and organizations. If you haven't received yours, write or phone the Parade Chairman, George Norton, 3232 Randolph Avenue, Oakland 94602, phone 415-261-3812.

In constructing your float, remember size limits are governed by the California Vehicle Code and should be adhered to:

Maximum Height, 13 feet 6 inches;
Maximum Length, 60 feet; Maximum Width, 8 feet.

Floats in excess of these dimensions should be cleared through your local Police Department if transported to parade area over state highways. All Float entries will receive trophies to commemorate their participation. The Parade Committee will assist in working with interested clubs or groups in securing sponsors, or in coordinating groups wishing to join together in sponsoring a float.

Under the direction of Ed Ferrario, Program Chairman, and Ed Kettwig, Dancers

On both evenings the teen-age group, the Stardettes, under the direction of Ed Ferrario and that wonderful adult group the Squarenaders, led by Bill Castner will show you just how beautiful fine exhibition dancing can be.

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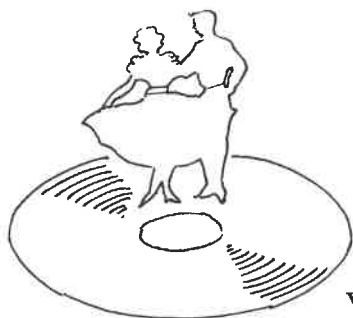
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3. There will be no limit on other basics or figures which may also be taught; it is just guaranteed that the feature basics will be taught and practiced in a uniform manner.
