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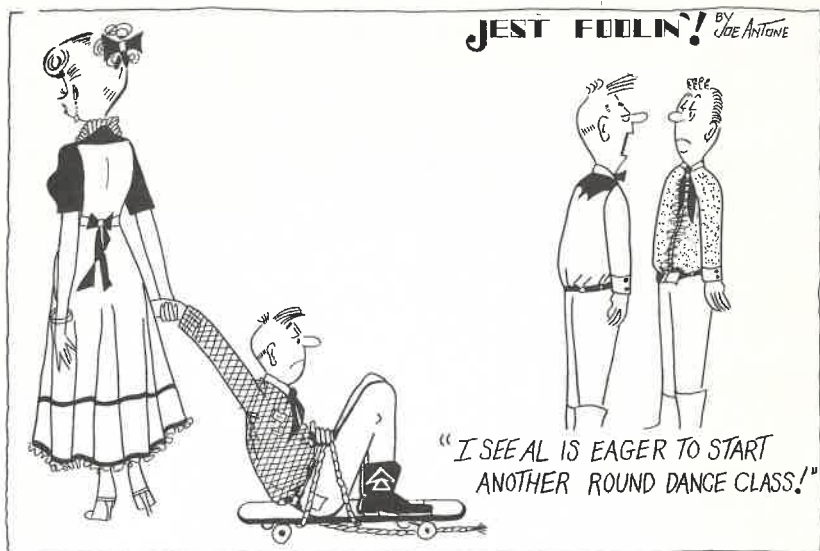

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SOMETHING DIFFERENT CORINNE N. O'NEAL

Perhaps both dancers and callers noticed the inauguration of the San Francisco Chapter of the Bachelors 'N' Bachelorettes, International, Incorporated in the Bay Area in 1963. The San Francisco Chapter is now sponsoring its third Anniversary Dance and the San Jose Chapter its second Anniversary dance.

There is quite a story behind the WHY of this square dance organization...and a philosophy which is new to Bay Area dancers; an organization designed to meet the needs of the single square dancer. And, this may come as a surprise to many...IT IS THE WORLD'S LARGEST S/D CLUB!

The story begins in 1949. No, it started before that year. Let's see what happened prior to the actual beginning.

The locale is the Los Angeles area. The time element extends over many years. The desire of single square dancers to have a club of their own...a club to meet their particular needs and to fulfill their demands and, so, such a club would originate; however, the results were always the same. They started as a singles club, the members would marry, they would remain with the club and soon there was established a club for married dancers, a ready-made vehicle for the club caller while the single dancer became the minority and his and her efforts were soon forgotten and lost from the original purpose. This situation repeated itself over and over again.

In 1949 something new happened. There appeared in "Sets In Order" a letter from Carole Green who said that she had appointed herself as "a committee to go around getting the stray guys and gals together" and invited single dancers to contact her concerning a club designed for single square dancers. The response was tremendous! Their first dance had a registration of 127 single dancers!

By 1950 a second group had formed. In 1951 there were four clubs and, at this time the officers were called together and they talked much of organization and affiliation and perpetuation "where single dancers

think nothing of coming to these dances alone as they know they are needed to make up a square with seven other dancers."

In 1949 (their first year!) the name of Bachelors 'N' Bachelorettes was established; in 1951 the insignia was adopted; in 1956 the organization was incorporated under the State Laws of California; by 1958 there were 19 chapters in existence...in Mexico, Canada, Michigan, Massachusetts and there were ten in the Los Angeles area.

Why the incorporation? Why be international? Why the affiliations? Why do single square dancers need to be identified as apart from, but an addition to, square dance clubs primarily designed for the married dancers?

The incorporation was of necessity...to perpetuate the organization for the single dancer. To become international was to fulfill the needs of all single dancers...those on vacation, our military, and "for the promotion of goodwill and fellowship among its members and to the dedication of friendship of all people."

We hear much discussion about the many difficulties confronting the continuance of the square dance movement in the Bay Area (and elsewhere). As with all social activities, which rely upon community support and small monetary contributions, the going is rough. In order to survive under our present Bay Area system there must be interest and enthusiasm and much effort on the part of the dancers, understanding and de-personalized attitude of the remunerated club caller but, most important of all, there must be understanding and the backup by all to the elective officers of the club...for there is the constant change of leadership which in most instances stems from the desire to be of service rather than from particular abilities. All clubs have these survival problems but the survival of a single square dance club has even more difficulties...and here is the "why" of affiliation.

Because of the concentration of many Bachelors 'N' Bachelorettes chapters in the Los Angeles area let's analyze the possibilities. They usually start their beginner classes simultaneously thereby permitting beginner dancers to visit other classes and, then, upon graduation a mass dinner-dance is held which is a beautiful and most inspiring affair.

Workshops, which are also fun nights,

are scheduled for different nights of the week thereby permitting chapter visitations.

For the most part chapters in the Los Angeles area book a different caller for each workshop night. Why? It stimulates visitations; it tends to eliminate a possible "take over" by an ambitious caller; it exposes members to variety in new calls and patterns; voices and tempos. It is the practice in this area that the beginner instructor is NOT a caller for workshops and hoe-downs.

Perhaps all this may sound most harsh to you concerning callers. Such is not the case. First of all, there is recognition that a teacher is a teacher, a caller a caller, and that a professional caller is a professional. Because of the many chapters, and the large membership and constant activities, many fledgling callers have been greatly enriched and rewarded because of the Bachelors 'N' Bachelorettes' self-perpetuation policy. They recognize the newer caller and, because of so many opportunities in both calling dates and experience in calling to different groups and in many areas, they have greatly benefited from this policy. Many of the Los Angeles callers booked by Bay Area clubs got their start with the Bachelors 'N' Bachelorettes...and that is why, when they have their yearly Building Fund Dance in Los Angeles the callers who voluntarily participate are mostly those who remember!

There are so many remunerations of being "united" or "affiliated" within and without the Los Angeles area. For example, both the San Francisco and San Jose chapters have visited many times in Los Angeles and Santa Barbara...and the visitations have been returned by the busloads! And, both San Francisco and San Jose have hosted a monthly International dance in Los Angeles, which included refreshments, decorations and hospitality!

Did you find the statement that "single square dancers need to be identified as apart from, but an addition to, square dance clubs: primarily designed for the married dancer" provocative? I do hope that you did, for this is so important to both single and married clubs. Square dancing is a "couples" activity. This is easily solved by those who are married but not so with the single dancer. But most important is the realization that single square dance clubs constantly

contributes to the square dance movement and also to married clubs for so many single members have found happiness that there is a constant change in club memberships!

I trust that I have been able to adequately tell a part of the wonderful story of the Bachelors 'N' Bachelorettes. Truly there has been, and are, many dedicated people. There has been idealism and love. Certainly here is a strong story that a new idea, a new concept can be accepted and made to work.

It just takes people . . .
