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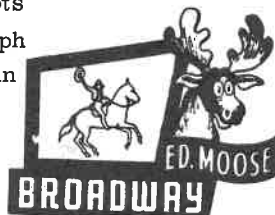
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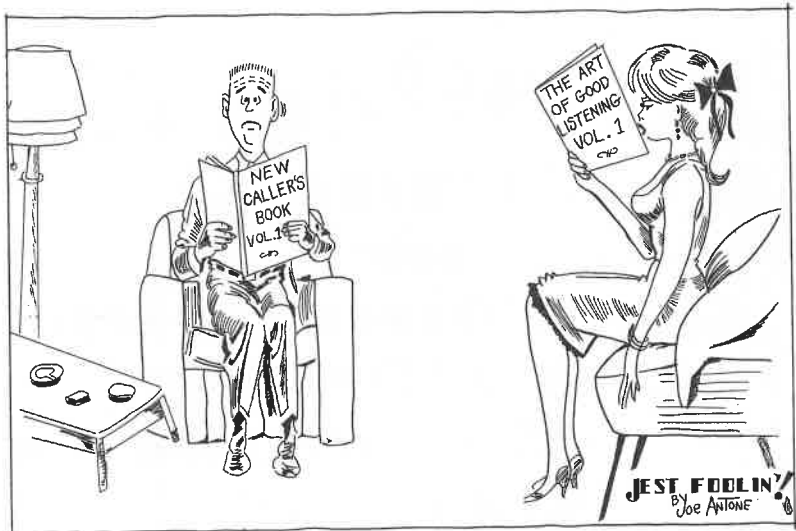

WHAT YOU SAID, BILLY !!!

An open letter to William Penn Mott, East Bay Regional Park Superintendent.

In the April 20th issue of the Contra Costa Times a report was made of a speech you gave at the Spring Lecture Series presented by the John F. Kennedy University.

The headline of the report was "More Conservation, Less Square Dancing." The lead sentence of the article stated "Instead of spending so much time and money on square dance classes, park and recreation departments should devote more effort to teaching conservation and the appreciation of the great outdoors." It was indicated that the statement was taken from the speech you made.

First, to set the record straight, we who live in the East Bay consider ourselves fortunate that a man of your calibre is at the head of our Regional Park System. We are indeed pleased with our parks and the efforts made by yourself and your office in the creation and maintenance of these parks.

But—when you feel that you and your parks are being slighted by the Recreation Departments, why choose Square Dancing as the reason for this slight?

The Recreation Departments, bless 'em, provide facilities for numerous activities and Square Dancing is just one of them. There are other types of dancing, such as folk dancing, modern dancing, social dancing, and teen-age dances. Other activities include facilities for the rock-hounds, bottle collectors, the older age group, etc. So—why pick on Square Dancing?

It is my understanding that the Recreation Department exists for only one reason—to provide recreation for all the people. This they are doing to the best of their ability. They are providing a varied recreational program designed to attract as many individuals as possible and Square Dancing is just one of these programs. So—why pick on Square Dancing?

You are further quoted as stating "that

during 1965 the State of California spent \$4 million on acquisition of new park and recreation lands. In that same time nearly \$5 million was spent on picking up cans, bottles, and papers left by the users of existing parks." How much have you spent on picking up after Square Dancers?

On May 28th and 29th the Northern California Square Dancers Association will present their 13th Annual Golden State Round-Up at the Oakland Auditorium. This nationally known Round-Up is the third largest Square Dance activity in the nation. Each year the registration book lists dancers from several states and Canada. Why don't you take a minute of your time and contact the law enforcement agency in the City of Oakland and find out how much "trouble" they have had in the twelve previous Round-Ups? If you don't have the time, I'll tell you—none! Each year there are in attendance an average of three thousand Square Dancers and there has never been one single incident where police action was necessary.

Each week approximately 200 Square Dance Clubs meet in various schools throughout the Bay Area. Most of them pay a rental fee for the use of the schools. They all pay the salaries of their own callers and they are highly respected by anyone who has the opportunity of doing business with them.

If you are beginning to get the impression that I feel that Square Dancers are fine, respectable people entitled to use the recreational facilities just as much as any other group or organization, you are so right!

Mr. Mott, I resent your statement! I feel that it was entirely uncalled for!

Mr. Mott, I hereby extend to you an invitation to come with me to any Square Dance meeting at your convenience. I want you to see first hand the enthusiasm of the dancers, the fun they have with their dancing and their friends, and the respect and admiration they have for the Recreation Departments.

Mr. Mott, isn't this the ultimate desire of the Recreation Department? To provide recreational opportunities for ALL the people? So—Why pick on Square Dancers.

THE ROUND-UP CORNER

As this issue goes to press the 13th Annual Round-Up is just around the corner. If you haven't made advance registrations you may purchase tickets at the door for any and all of the various activities.

What do these activities include? Just the best dancing to our own local callers and three of the nations leading recording callers, Billy Lewis of Texas, Don Stewart of California, and Gaylon Shull of Kansas. And—Round Dancing led by Bill and Dolly Barr of Sacramento.
