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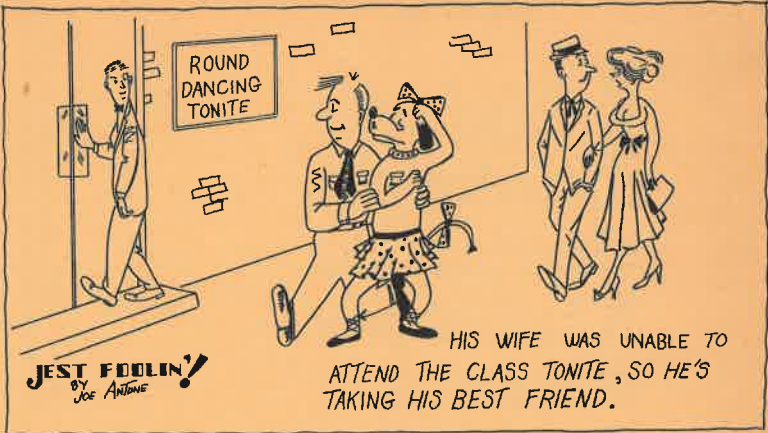

EXHIBITIONISM

What is your reaction to exhibition dancing as put on by any of the several exhibition groups throughout the country? Do you just sit back and enjoy the intricate maneuvers and perfect timing of the group or do you find yourself thinking, "Is this Square Dancing"?

If you have an analytical type of mind, and you would be surprised how many people do, you might well question the validity of a name for a group such as "Square Dance Exhibition Group." When this group is performing are they Square Dancing? Are they doing the same kind of dancing that you, a Square Dancer, can do? Could a group of you and your friends get up and do the same thing?

The obvious answer to the first question is a resounding "No!"

The group is not Square Dancing as you and I know it. Square Dancing is a spontaneous conditioned response to a command or group of commands that show no evidence of pre-arranged continuity. (Gosh! How mistaken can you be? I have always thought that Square Dancing was Fun!) All that is necessary for the average person to Square Dance is a mental file of the various calls and be able to do what is demanded of him by that call. He responds to the call automatically and at the same time his mind is alerted so that, as soon as the next call is given, it can reach into the file box, pull the card, insert it into the proper slot, thereby initiating the motor response which will result in you doing what the caller has asked you to do. Now - isn't that simple?

You who are experienced dancers dress up your dancing with what we like to call styling. You can do this far better than the newer dancer for the simple reason that your responses are conditioned - you don't have to hear the call, figure out how to respond, check which is your left and which is your right, and at the same time try to hear the next call. It isn't too long before the new dancer is a couple of calls behind

and there goes the square.

Are exhibition groups doing the kind of dancing that you can do? Here the answer is a good strong "Yes." Could you and a group of your friends do the same thing? Again the answer is "Yes." This then, leads us to what Exhibition Dancing really is. Exhibition Dancing is not Square Dancing as you and I know it but it is Square Dancing. It is Square Dancing with the spontaneity removed. How many of you can almost get completely through a favorite singing call without any calls? You could go all the way through if you practiced it enough times. When you arrived at that point you would be doing an exhibition dance!

Any exhibition group worth its salt could go through its entire routine without the assistance of the director. The calling and patter of the director does add to the color and overall effectiveness of the routine but it is not necessary.

Why don't these groups need a caller when they are performing? Simply because they have learned the routine through the rote method. They do it, and do it, and do it again until they become letter perfect. When they attain this level they then add the various and sundry frills. The finished product is what we watch. A product that through practice, has been polished and perfected to the point where the performance is routine to the dancers. Why do you think the participants call their dances "routines"?

We who live in the Bay Area are fortunate in that we have two fine exhibition groups, the Squarenaders (Adult group) and the Stardettes (Teen-age group). We who watch them perform very often forget that there has been hours of time and effort spent by the dancers and their directors in getting to the point where they can enthral the audience with their work.

Make no mistake about it! Exhibition dancing is a type of Square Dancing. A type we could all do if we had the time, the patience, and the ability to take directions. But - if we all had that ability we would all be exhibition dancers watching the talented few do just plain Square Dancing.

On March 24, 1966 the Square Rounders of San Francisco and Berkeley (2 groups, but with the same name and purpose) were presented with an award by Lt. Gov. Glenn Anderson. This award was given to the clubs for having contributed most significantly in the Community Volunteer Groups Category to the cause of mental health, during the past year.

Don Black of the San Francisco group and Clyde Blackwell of the Berkeley group traveled to Sacramento to accept the award at the Mental Health - Retardation Banquet.

The Square Rounders are a group of Square Dancers who have been active for over nine years, dancing one night a month with the mental patients at San Francisco General Hospital in San Francisco and the Herrick Hospital in Berkeley. They have also sponsored several Benefit Hoedowns in the past with proceeds used to buy recreational equipment for the Mental Health Rehabilitation Program. There are still several of the original members dancing in the two clubs. Fred Allan originated this program and called for both clubs for six years, for the past three years Don Black has been calling for the San Francisco group and recently Lou Cook has taken over for the Berkeley group.

Doctors agree that Square Dancing is excellent therapy for Mental Health Rehabilitation.

Subject: *By Burt Garner* **SQUARE DANCE BARN**

The end of 1965 brought news that the old Fresno Square Dance Barn was to come to an end. The property on which it was located had been sold. The Barn must either be moved or demolished.

After much thought by members of the seven clubs that used the Barn, it was decided unfeasable to move it, as it was sub-standard in some aspects, and too large to move without splitting it into parts. As these clubs relocated their weekly dances into temporary quarters, officers were busy investigating the possibility of a new Square Dance Hall.

When Mr. Wayne Fischer and Mr. Joe Guisto offered to remodel an old deserted packing shed to the specifications of the square dance clubs involved, the idea was accepted and plans were made and approved in short order.

All the clubs organized and formed a council called "Fresno County Square Dance Council" with two delegates from each club. With the leadership of this council, an old deserted packing house with slatted exterior walls, rough plank flooring and little else was transformed into a beautiful square dance hall. This new hall is a monument to the energetic cooperation, planning, and enthusiasm of the clubs that would use it. Within six weeks from the time the building permit was issued, the first dance was held. This was only possible through the hard work of square dancers from all over the area, working seven days a week, many hours a day volunteering their services. These dancers joined forces with Mr. Fischer and Mr. Guisto to make this hall into the finest of its kind. Participating clubs include the Steppers & Stompers, Lucky Rounders, Hix and Chix, Pairs of Four, 2 Lazy 2's, Skirts & Flirts, and the Valley Callers Association.

The exterior is stucco and inside one will find a 35' x 90' hardwood floor with the satin finish required for smooth dancing. The building is insulated and has the most modern acoustical walls and ceiling. The intricate wiring systems provide various lighting patterns and wired-in speakers. The heating and cooling systems will provide comfort for dancers regardless of outside temperatures. We have a completely equipped kitchen, a large storage area for each club, and a dining area joining the dance floor that can be used for dancing, too, if necessary. The old restrooms were remodeled to please the most discriminating inspectors. Everything, including the lovely color combinations, makes this hall one any group could be justifiably proud of.

The council sponsored the benefit dance prior to completion of the new hall which was a tremendous success. Money raised from this benefit was spent purchasing speakers, kitchen equipment, etc.

Whenever any of you readers are in the Fresno area, or even in California, we invite you to visit us and to dance with us. We are located in the City of Clovis, just a few minutes drive from Fresno. Our new address is 432 Hughes Street. We will be holding a grand opening celebration on the weekend of July 22 and 23 and we hope many of you can join us for this two day event. Friday evening will feature impromptu calling by all the club callers now located at the new hall. Saturday afternoon will include a round

dance program and Saturday evening square dancing featuring Skip Graham from Santa Rosa as caller. Refreshments are being served and lots of fun for all. Most important of all, we are proud of our new hall and want everyone in the country to see it. Maybe our experience can help you and maybe you can do the same thing we have done. It is a wonderful satisfaction to dance in your own hall.

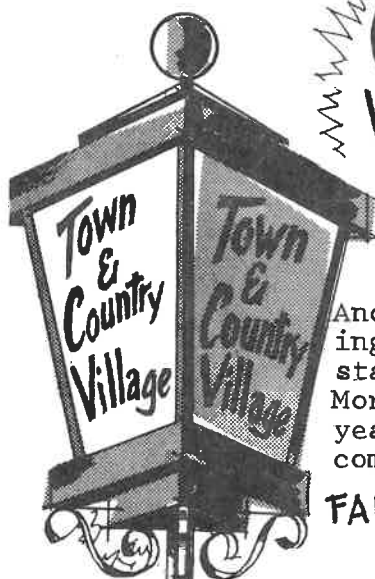
