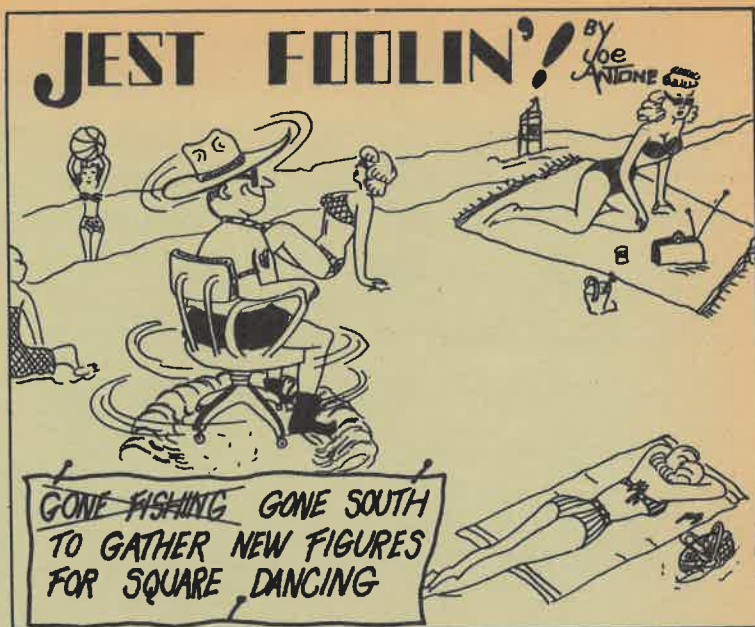

## Desert Blues

**Dance by:** Clark & Maxine Smith, Palo Alto, California

**Record:** Columbia 43425 "Big Chief Buffalo Nickel" (Desert Blues) Skeets McDonald

**Position:** Intro: Open-Facing M's back toward COH; Dance: Semi-Closed pos. face LOD

**Footwork:** Opposite except where noted.

### INTRODUCTION

- 1-5** WAIT; WAIT; APART, -, POINT, -;  
TOGETHER (SCP), -, TOUCH, -;  
WALK, -, 2, -;

In Open-Facing position M's back toward COH M's R & W's L hands joined wait 2 meas; Step apart on L, -, point R toward partner, -; Step together on R assuming SCP facing LOD, -, touch L to R, -; Walk fwd 2 slow steps L, -, R, -;

### PART A

- 1-4** FWD TWO-STEP; FWD TWO-STEP (to CP); (Limp) SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE, BEHIND, (SCP); WALK, -, 2, -;

In Semi-Closed position facing LOD do 2 fwd two-steps LOD blending to Loose-Closed position at end of Meas 2; M facing wall step L sideward LOD, step R XIB of L (W XIB), step L sideward, step R XIB of L (W XIB); Blending to Semi-Closed position facing LOD walk fwd LOD 2 slow steps L, -, R, -;

- 5-8** (Scissors) SIDE, CLOSE, CROSS, -;  
SIDE, CLOSE, CROSS, -; TURN TWO-STEP; TURN TWO-STEP;

M faces wall to do a "Scissors Step" Side L, close R to L, Cross L IF of R, - (W facing LOD does a Hitch Fwd, close, back, -;) ending in SIDECAR position M facing RLOD; Both Scissors: M turning to face wall in CLOSED position steps sideward R, closes L to R, steps R XIF, - (W XIB); Adjust to Closed position M facing wall & do 2 R-face turning two-steps progress LOD ending in Semi-closed position facing LOD.

- 9-16** FWD TWO-STEP; FWD TWO-STEP (to CP); SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE, BEHIND (SCP); WALK, -, 2, -; SIDE, CLOSE, CROSS, - (W Hitch) SIDE, CLOSE, CROSS, -; TURN TWO-STEP; TURN TWO-STEP;

Repeat action of Meas 1-8 (Part A) ending in SCP for BREAK

### BREAK

- 1-5** FWD TWO-STEP; FWD TWO-STEP; AWAY, -, TOUCH, -; TOGETHER (SCP), -, TOUCH, -; WALK, -, 2, (to Bfly), -;

In Semi-Closed position do 2 fwd two-steps progress LOD; Step sideward toward COH on L (W toward wall) blending to Open position, -, touch R to L, -; Step sideward on R assuming Semi-Closed position facing LOD, -, touch L to R, -; In SCP walk fwd 2 slow steps progress LOD L, -, R (blending to Butterfly position for Part B), -;

### PART B

- 1-4** FACE TO FACE; BACK TO BACK; ROCK FWD, -, RECOVER TURN, -; (Hitch) FWD, CLOSE, BACK, -;

In Butterfly position M's back to COH step sideward toward LOD on L, close R to L, sideward on L (drop lead hands) pivot ½ L-face turn to back to back position, -; With M's R & W's L hands joined M steps sideward on R toward LOD, close L to R, sideward on R pivot ¼ R-face to end in Open position facing LOD, -; Rock fwd L, -, recover on R turning in toward partner to LEFT-OPEN position facing RLOD inside hands joined, -; (hitch) Step fwd L, close R to L, step back on L, -;

- 5-8** ROCK BACK, -, ROCK FWD, -; SIDE CLOSE, THRU (CP), -; TURN TWO-STEP; TURN TWO-STEP;

In LEFT-OPEN facing RLOD rock back on R, -, rock fwd on L, -; Turning in to face partner & wall step R sideward RLOD, close L to R, step R thru toward LOD (W XIF), -; Blending to Closed position M facing wall do 2 R-face turning two-steps progressing LOD ending in Butterfly position ready to repeat PART B.

- 9-16** FACE TO FACE; BACK TO BACK; ROCK FWD, -, RECOVER TURN, -; (Hitch) FWD, CLOSE, BACK, -; ROCK BACK, -, ROCK FWD, -; SIDE, CLOSE, THRU (CP), -; TURN TWO-STEP; TURN TWO-STEP (SCP);

Repeat action on measures 1-8 (Part B) ending in Semi-Closed position for BREAK

**BREAK:** Same as Above—except end in Semi-Closed position to repeat dance.

**SEQUENCE:** AA Break : BB Break : AA Break : BB Ending

**ENDING:** Repeat Measures 1-4 of Break; Step Apart (face partner), -, point R (W's L) toward partner, -; Acknowledge.

America is on one of the biggest recreational flings in history. Bowling, skiing, fishing, hunting, camping, boating and dancing. You name it and millions are doing it. According to a recent newspaper article this is only the start. A behavioral scientist predicts that soon play will be our work. With automation looming larger and larger on the horizon man will have much more leisure time.

In order for Square Dancing to take its proper place among the recreational fields, leadership is a must. Webster's defines leaders as one who, leads, as a guide, a commander, a chief. We here in Northern California have many chiefs and commanders but not many who lead.

The two organizations that were formed for this purpose are sorely lacking in this field. I am talking about the Caller's and Dancer's Associations. I have attended many caller's meetings, a great many club meetings and a few dancer's association meetings and I can honestly say, "Leadership is lacking."

When it comes to real leadership, South-

ern California and other parts of the country are way ahead of us. The dancers and callers in these areas saw the valued need for real leadership and did something about it.

On August 23, thru 27, the Purdue Seminar is being held at Purdue University in Lafayette, Indiana. It is a national Square and Round Dance seminar on leadership training.

I wish I could attend these affairs. But it is impossible they are just too far away. And then I ask myself, "Why not one in this area?" What is wrong with our wonderful colleges and universities? Or perhaps we are so smug and so assured ourselves we won't need one here. I say, baloney. A course in leadership training is needed here and something should be done about it now. So please, you club presidents, and club delegates, and officers of the caller's and dancer's associations don't promote us, Lead us!

## Some Generalization ON SQUARE DANCING! *Fransquita S. Overmire*

People: Just folks! Yet, oftentimes we have danced with them for many months before we know who they are. If, as a fact, this can be acknowledged, let us also assume that Callers likewise may be included.

It is a fact almost universally granted by square dancers (and there are a lot of us), that you meet and grow to know some of the finest folks in the world. Yes! Square dancers in general are wonderful people.

Let us assume that we have a beautiful hall, with the best floor and the finest acoustics that can be designed—and a perfectly superb, smooth Caller who owns the latest and best in equipment. Do we have a square dance? Not yet. Not without dancers. Not without people.

People are the indispensable ingredient. These are folks who initially have been "sold" on square dancing as a recreation and a diversion. Review the "pitch" — "Square Dance for Fun." These are people who every day pursue their selected vocations, who should therefore be allowed, an evening or two a week, a genuine, relaxing diversion. Square dancing is not a vocation. If, for a select few, it has become an avocation, that is quite understandable, only provided no other advocacy has been proved amenable to the disposition of these people. These are lovely people too, as long as they show themselves aware of the wide difference that exists between an avocation and a vocation.

There are those who are not so aware, making up a very small minority of people on the dance scene, yet let it be remembered that they are the vocal contingent. The great majority of square dancers say very little about their recreation, save in occasional remarks to a friend. The vocal ones are those who take the trouble to make themselves heard. Since they are the ones among us who have selected square dancing as "the be-all and the end-all of existence," these ideas naturally color their descriptions of square dancing. These are the ones who will collect between the tips in vocal acclaim of some Caller who omnisciently aggrandizes himself by goading a floor full of puppets into the rigors of a marathon. But never discourages: these who so praise are the smallest of minorities.

Square dancing is STILL done for relaxation and for fun! When it will cease to be, this minority will have lost its avocation and the god-like Caller his place in the sun. Also, the big majority, you and we and our dear friends, we Silent Ones, will have lost one of the most wonderful diversions that our country has ever seen. We believe that we possess the inalienable rights to retain this recreation uncluttered of over-complexity and to cherish it as a

diversion from our real life's work. We believe that we need offer no apologies to anyone for square dancing only for fun. Why not? This roots deep in our heritage; this is the real folk dance of America!

Does all this verbiage imply that some danger threatens us?  
Doesn't it?

Callers: Our best Callers know that they are still people, and they possess the graciousness of soul consistently to behave like people. They are of an extraordinary personality, and the most successful of them must live by an almost continuous giving of themselves. "Successful" is not measured by how many miles away he comes. He need not be exotic. He may, on the contrary, be your charming next-door neighbor in the town in which you live.

But never think otherwise: a good Caller is an extraordinary person. The natural demands of his chosen recreation are legion. While calling a square dance or teaching a class he must be self-effacing while taking care that he is always in the limelight. If his behavior smacks of effrontery, he is not an ideal Caller, no matter how good he may think he is. If he lets himself slip into an obscure background, he is not a good Caller, because his leadership and the "image" of what he is are indispensable colorations of the very art of square dancing itself. In almost everything he does, this rather paradoxical exigency exists. He must never manage his club, while being always there to guide and counsel it. He is surely aware that among all the diverse people in his club of whose careers he may know little, there may be, and very often is, some of true executive status whose life work consists of managing.

The ideal Caller is, indeed, a "gentleman and a scholar." He is a scholar because he must possess a prodigious memory and the patience to nourish and train it. He is a gentleman because he is what we would all be, because, too, there is a Lady constantly at his side, an out-of-the-limelight compassionate spirit who reflects from and to herself the camaraderie which underlies and stabilizes the esprit de corps of the club as a whole.

And because the Caller is a public figure, a celebrity as it were, so we must allow that he must be, in this respect, different from the rest of us. He is entertainer, teacher, dancer, leader. His talents demand of him no less. And, in addition, we demand of him that he never exalt himself too far above us. How can anyone execute and remain faithful to all these demands? It is not the question, but the answer, which is revealing. All our good Callers accomplish it!

On the stage, the good Caller has an eye on the tiny minority, all the while keeping the floor constantly moving. Why? Because he and the dancers must give expression to that which has been taught and learned. Otherwise he could not fulfill himself, nor could the majority of dancers. The dancers fulfill themselves by realizing the relaxation they have been led to believe they shall find.

Yes. Ideal Callers do exist. They are in goodly numbers among us locally. They are probably everywhere in the majority. Yet, we must pause to wonder if they sometimes sense that their numbers may be dwindling. Because? Because of the too-long silence of the Silent Ones?

Clubs: They do not manage themselves, these groups of wonderful individuals called square dance clubs. They hang together, some loosely, some tightly, not because of the dancing, for they all offer that. They hang together by the grace of an almost undefinable word, morale, which is their public and private spirit, expressed not singly, but by the totality of their people as a whole. If each expression is different, it is because the individuals express themselves rather differently. It is just as logical to say that clubs are what they are because of the people in them as it is unnecessary to say that clubs would not exist without people in them.

Whether they are loosely or tightly knit together seems to depend upon the ratio of management that the totality of the individuals share. A tightly knit club with a high morale is no accident. There is machinery. But that machinery runs so smoothly that it cannot be heard and so seems not to be there at all. But there it is, empowered by the same simple fundamental behind it that makes our mighty nation function. Without thinking of itself as such, this group is conducting itself exactly as any little group of Americans anywhere in the whole broad land would be expected to conduct itself, as a little piece of America, respecting the will of the majority, obeying the ingrained cognizance of freedom of us all in exercising the right to make a choice when we hold elections. As a people we notably get behind the selection of the majority, in big and little instances. This may befuddle others, but it is no mystery to us. So in the little square dance club, once a year the machinery momentarily pauses without anyone's being too aware of it, and then starts up again and runs smoothly on. The strip of badge which proclaims an officer is pinned on another person whose name on the sacred printed slip the majority in secret marks an 'x'. A little thing? An insignificant detail? Not by any manner of means! In a little way, yes, in its "little" way one of our world's greatest issues!

There is no legitimate justification for "second class" citizens in the square dance club. Beginning dancer, or veteran, these are all first-class human beings who want to meet each other in an atmosphere of diversion, and their tenure at the dancing itself must of necessity be an utterly negligible factor. Not so, in their careers outside. And so have we "sold" square dancing to hundreds as the perfect relaxation from that. If we find this by some rather easily and soon forgotten, it must be asserted blushing that this is most regrettable. For finer than a strand of spider web and as easily destroyed because even more invisible is the strand called morale that knits a healthy club, especially, alas! when those who wittingly or unwittingly destroy do so with the simultaneous assurance that "we square dance for fun."

Clubs come into being, and they go out, a phenomenon worthy of some speculation and much study. It is not anomalous to say that those which survive do not survive by accident. There is always a cause, and the cause is, of course, the people who make them up.

It is so simple to state: they are warm and friendly people who receive pure joy from a feeling of loyalty to each other.

# '69 Convention to Seattle

Seattle in 1969 was announced as a future Convention site as 14,016 including dancers from 44 states, Canada, and several foreign countries attended the 15th National Square Dance Convention in Indianapolis, thus making it the third largest in history, being exceeded only by Detroit and Long Beach.

Future Convention dates are: Philadelphia, June 29, 30, July 1, 1967; Omaha, June 20, 21, and 22, 1968; and Seattle, June 26, 27, 28, 1969.

The 14,016 at Indianapolis included 5740 from Indiana and 8276 from the other states and foreign countries. Other high states include: Illinois, 1574; Ohio, 1323; Michigan, 1310, and Kentucky 874. There were 50 or more dancers from 22 different states, and 25 or more from 30 states.

Future General Chairmen include: 1967: Vic and Peg Wills, 200 Treaty Road, Drexel Hill, Pennsylvania; 1968: Dick and Hazel Shadle, 4039 Redman Road, Omaha, Nebraska; and 1968: Harry and Marge MacGregor, 2333 North 149, Seattle, Washington.

Harry Moore, 9233 Abbott Avenue, Miami Beach, Florida, was elected chairman of the 1966-7 National Executive Committee, with Gordon Pierce, Fergus Falls, Minnesota, vice-chairman; Norm Hol-loway, Long Beach, California, secretary, and Roy Long, Dallas, treasurer. Howard Thornton, 2936 Bella Vista, Midwest City, Oklahoma, will serve as Director of Information. The committee will hold its Mid-Winter Pre-Convention meeting in Philadelphia on November 18, 19 and 20, 1968.

An expanded program was outlined for the National Convention Organizations Committee with Chet Ferguson, 4609 NW 33 Terrace, Oklahoma City, being reappointed chairman. A special panel will be held in Philadelphia for organizations leaders.
