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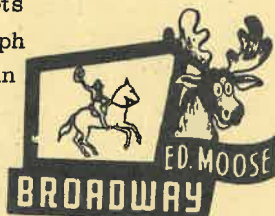

AS CALLERS GET older?



Once again an article has been published in *Where?* bemoaning the assumed fact that Square Dancing in this area lacks leadership. The author, one Vic Tolley, is the same individual who once publicly stated that if callers could not be leaders they should stop calling and become dancers. This in itself indicates there were no leaders among the dancers. I took him to task and asked him to do a little checking among the dancers.

One of two things has had to happen since that time. Either Vic checked and could find no leaders or he didn't take time to check. If he did not check then he should not complain about non-leadership among the dancers—because "he knows not whereof he speaks."

If he did check and could not find what he terms a leader then in my opinion he wouldn't know a leader if he saw one. I ask you once again Vic to check with your own club first. Is there no one who can take over and do a good job of it? Next check the Dancer's Association. Here you will hit pay dirt. Every delegate of every club is a leader! If he were not a leader he would not be there! But, Vic, he is only one of the leaders in his own club. The others are those who take over the duties of the various offices. Then Vic, would you take it upon yourself to say that the ladies who take over the chairmanship of the Refreshment Committee are not leaders. Careful, Vic!

Back again to the Dancer's Association.

One of the very good reasons that Square Dancing has been as successful as it has is because of the leadership of the Association. Vic, before you complain about this group why don't you attend more than "a few" of their meetings? Again I just have to say I don't think you are aware of what is going on!

Now to your Callers Association. This is your own group Vic. If the members of

this Association are not leaders then, Vic, they should stop calling and become dancers—remember you said it! Once again Vic, I have to disagree with you.

I, along with an untold number of dancers in this area are well aware that the Callers Association is made up of callers who ARE leaders. Leaders of Square Dancers. Leaders in their own organization. Vic, if the above is not true how long do you think they could keep a club together?

This magazine is a function of the Callers Association. Its editor is a caller (sometimes we use the word loosely). Does it publish itself? Does someone have to make the final decision as to each detail that goes to make the whole? That someone, Vic, is a leader. You can also apply the above to any Square Dance club. Someone has to make the final decisions as to the functions of the club.

On one thing I would have to agree with you Vic. I have to believe that a course of courses on Leadership Training would be an asset. I believe that all callers and those dancers who are interested could add to their background by attending a course of this type. But—before you start saying "I told you so!" I would like to say that these courses would be good because our present fine leaders are smart enough to know that anything they can add to their natural ability would be helpful.

Vic, Square Dancing didn't "just grow." It had to have leadership. The original leaders who were instrumental in getting it off the ground gave way to those who kept it going. They in turn gave way to our present leaders who are, in my estimation, doing an excellent job in keeping it aloft. Then, as the wheel spins along, new leaders will pop up to take over.

Then, as the callers grow older (Ed?) and newer ones take their place we will have a new group of caller leaders. Now Vic, where do these callers come from? They come from the dancers. Then Vic, there must be leaders among the dancers or they couldn't become callers. Because (remember—you said it!!) to be a caller you must be a leader!
