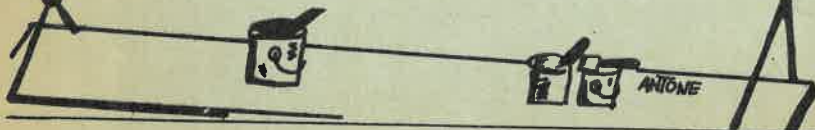

CALLERS ARE EGOTISTS & EXTROVERTS!

Have you, the layman, ever wondered what goes into the makeup of the average club caller? Would you agree that he is an egotistical, money hungry extrovert who has lots of spare time and an exceptional memory?

I have heard them called all of the above plus some names that are usually whispered when in mixed company. I have to confess that I have to agree with some of the above and disagree with some.

Let's start with egotistical. Here I agree. I agree because to be egotistical one must believe that self-interest is the motive of all conscious action. I would think that a good caller would have enough of an interest in himself to make himself believe that he could do a good job of calling. Therefore he is on his way towards complete motivation.

Next we can look at "extrovert." Again I agree. A caller must be an extrovert to even think about calling in the first place. How can he turn in a complete evening of calling if he is not interested in external actions. In other words he must be interested in the actions of the dancers and be able to adjust his calling to the dancing level. Also if he is not interested in the accomplishment of his dance group how could he effectively teach?

How about "spare time." We who are dancers can, if we don't feel up to "par" stay at home on some dance dates. But - the caller? What would happen if he "just didn't feel like mixing with people tonight" and failed to show up? He would soon be back dancing if he desired to continue with square dancing. Then of course he must spend some time going over new material in both square and round dancing plus programming for all calling dates. To this we might add time spent in the purchase of new records, the maintenance of equipment, and always being on call to members of his club

who might have problems they feel only he can solve.

Then we have the "exceptional memory." I'm not sure about you but I don't know how many times I have marvelled at the ability of the callers to come up with a whole program of calling - and no notes! Also - I'm sure everyone of you has experienced dancing to a caller who does have a lapse of memory. He and everyone on the floor knows it but, as a rule, the caller will reach into his bag of calls and come up with something that will keep you going and eventually get you back to where you belong. Do you ever feel envious? I do.

Then back to one of the tributes that we passed over the first time. The one about being "money hungry." Here I disagree. Any of us who work get paid for it and calling is work. Some might think that the pay per hour is far too high. But the gimmick here is that you see him ONLY when he is calling - you do not see him when he is doing the dozens of other things related to his calling. Very few callers make a living from calling. The ones that most of us are familiar with hold down other jobs and the calling is just an extra activity. Add to the time spent in getting ready to call and doing the actual calling the cost of equipment, records, expenses involved in attending meetings relating to calling, and the maintenance of equipment and clothes. I am sure that the amount per hour is very low.

So - if you feel like walking up to your caller and calling him an egotistical extrovert, go ahead. He is just that. When you think about the part of your club dues that is used to pay the caller don't grumble in your beard about how much he makes, just remember you are getting a lot for your dollar.

To all of the above I might add that I think that it is a darn good idea to walk up to your caller and tell him he is doing a good job (this will further develop his egoism) - but - if you don't think he is putting forth as you think he should then for heavens

sake tell him (this will deflate his egoism and, we hope, maintain the proper balance).

In closing may I say we should be thankful that there are some egotistical extroverts in Square Dancing or we would be dancing to records. Horrible thought - huh?

AN OPEN LETTER TO LARRY BUTZER

Dear Larry:

In as much as you have taken a few whacks at me through the pages of Square Dance Where? I feel it is only fair I be given the privilege of taking a few swipes at you.

In your recent article bemoaning the fact that I know little of leadership and if I had checked around I would have discovered there is leadership among the dancers only points up what I had already stated. There is a need for leadership and I mean real, down to earth leadership. Not the type you speak of. When you try to tell me, Sir, that the chairman of a refreshment committee is leadership then you and I are not speaking on the same plane.

The trouble with square dance clubs today is the fact that the poor soul that does take over the refreshment committee will probably end up being elected President of the club with little desire for the job and with less experience. Or even worse the poor dancer is elected as a club delegate to the Dancer's Association and is even less prepared to handle those duties properly.

The following is a classic example of the type of leadership being displayed today in this area:

During the season when clubs start their beginner's class a small club ended up with three squares of beginners after three weeks. A neighboring club, larger and more experienced ended up with ten squares of beginners. They beamed with pride because they had ten squares of new dancers. They were also delighted that their neighboring club only had three squares of beginners and were secretly hoping the smaller club's beginners would disband so they could absorb the remainder of the class. Now, if this is

what you call leadership, you and I do not have the same regards for Square Dancing. And I might add, this is not an isolated case. I feel a real leader in that club would have taken steps to help the smaller club, even going so far as to try to get more dancers for them.

When you speak to me of leadership in your Dancer's Association how about these two recent cases? Two very well known clubs in this area that had been dancing for over five years disbanded. Some of the dancers quit dancing for good and others had to seek other clubs to dance with. Now, where was the leadership in your Dancer's Association? Why didn't someone take the time and the trouble to find out what was happening and help these clubs to continue as square dance groups and help them over their difficulties? Of course the answer is that the delegates were not prepared for their elected office and stood by helpless while two fine clubs folded up. Today there are too many club officers and delegates being elected to positions they are not fitted for. If you are going to have clubs and associations with elected officers then I believe they should be prepared for their job.

As for the Caller's Association, the two functions that draw most callers to the meetings are to buy records and to learn the round of the month. If the dancers in this area were to depend on the material put out by Northern California Caller's Association they would be way out in left field compared to dancers of other areas. Most callers subscribe to So. Calif. Caller's Ass'n and to two national magazines for their material. And why, if there was such good leadership, did Santa Clara Valley have to form their own Association?

Being a caller does not make a leader any more than being chairman of the refreshment committee makes a leader. There are a great many callers in this area that need this training in leadership and if they had it they would become better callers and their clubs would most certainly benefit from it.

Tell me this, Mr. Butzer, if your Dancer's Association and if the Caller's Association are so full of this fine leadership you speak of why don't they get together once a year and promote Square Dancing for everyone? Why can't they put on exhibitions during the month of September at shopping centers, food markets or any place crowds gather. Representatives from clubs could hand out flyers telling of time and places where new classes were starting. Why not work as a team so that everyone could benefit.

I keep asking myself, Why do clubs and callers have to make such a fine thing as square dancing so competitive? Why does one club that has a successful Saturday night dance with thirty squares giggle with glee when their neighbor has only six squares? Why do callers have to wait like vultures for some poor club to fold up so they can take over as caller and run another club or absorb the dancers in the club they are already calling for?

In summing up I will state once again that I believe both the Caller's and Dancer's Associations need a course in leadership, no matter how humorous you try to make it look. I say:

"Take your head out of the sand, Mr. Butzer and quit acting like an ostrich."
