The October meeting was called to order by President Don Shotwell at the Washington School in Alameda with the main order of business being the final presentation of the By-Law changes and the re-presentation of the Round of the Month, "Can't Stop Loving You" by Al & Emma Buoncristiani.

Membership Report: Accepted as Associate Callers: Chuck Hall of Kelseyville; Bob Kinkston of Fremont; and Al Mason of San Pablo. Welcomed as a Subscribing Caller: Stan Lawniki of Massachusetts. A few other applications were received, but after the Executive Board had met. These applications will be considered at the next meeting.

Don Black thanked all who assisted in making the recent Konocti Institute a success. Plans are already under way for the next year's Institute which feature one of the nation's best known callers.

Ed Ferrario reported that he is having trouble with certain local Post Offices in regard to the proper delivery of Square Dance, Where? And, he displayed copies of a letter written to local postmasters urging them to a more prompt delivery of this "time value mail." It was suggested that people who do not receive their copies by the first of the month contact their local postmasters.

Plans were presented for the joint meeting and hoedown of the Fresno Valley Associated Callers and the Northern California Callers under the direction of Harry Whitlock, Ed Ferrario and Bill Jonas as part of the big annual Potluck Dinner held in late November. This will be the second time the two Associations have gathered together for a joint event.

The accepted By-Law changes relative to membership are as follows:

Subscriber Member:

1. A Caller/Teacher desiring to receive Association material . . .
2. Must reside outside the Northern California area convenient to attending monthly meetings.
3. Will have NO vote, will receive materials, will pay \$4.00 annual dues.

Associate Member:

1. An active dancer in a square dance club for a year or more . . .
2. Will have NO vote, will receive materials, will pay annual dues of \$6.00 and receive Square Dance, Where? as part of membership . . .

Jr. Caller/Jr. Teacher:

1. Must have been an active dancer in a square dance club for two or more years . . .

2. Must have served as an apprentice caller/teacher for at least 15 weeks under a master caller/teacher - OR - equivalent apprenticeship outside

of Northern California by written statement . . .

3. Must have attended seven meetings of the Caller's Association and must have presented material on three occasions to the Association . . .

4. Must apply, in writing, to the Executive Board for any change of status . . .

5. Will have NO vote, will receive materials, will pay annual dues of \$6.00 and receive Square Dance, Where? as part of membership . . .

Caller/Teacher (full active membership)

1. Must have been a member of the Association for two or more years.

2. Must have been an active caller or teacher for one or more groups in Northern California for one or more years and be actively calling at time of request for change of status . . .

3. Must have completed the requirements of Jr. Caller or Jr. Teacher to the satisfaction of the Executive Board . . .

4. Will have VOTE, will receive materials, will pay annual dues of \$6.00 and receive Square Dance, Where? as part of membership.

Life Members:

1. These include Past Presidents and Honorary Members . . .

2. Will pay NO dues and will receive Square Dance, Where? . . .

3. Are entitled to a VOTE and a voice in policy . . .

Sub-Note:

All members and classifications of membership will abide by the Code of Ethics of the Association which include such points as:

1. . . . conduct as a lady or gentlemen when attending a square dance function.

2. . . . abstain from use of alcoholic beverages before and while appearing before any square or round dance group . . .

3. . . . be courteous when calling or teaching, and use no vulgarity.

4. . . . remember first duty to dancers and their enjoyment . . .

5. . . . remember that my "word" is my bond . . .

It was Tennessee's loss and our gain when Len Murphy and his wife, Billie, moved to Oakland in 1936. Len is a Property Representative for Pacific Telephone in the Bay Area. He and Billie have one son, an attorney.

Of course Len square danced as a boy in Tennessee, but started dancing here in 1940 when he and Billie attended sessions sponsored by the "Dad's Club" and P.-T.A. They learned old American couple dances as well as squares. Then in 1944, Len was lassoed by a folk dance club in Oakland because no one else would do it. He and Billie taught for the Adult Education first and for the past twenty years have been teaching for the Oakland Recreation Department.

He has two clubs, the Oakland Sundowners (1953) and the Valley Paws and Taws in Alamo. Any excess time is gobbled up by the Recreation Department.

Len has hosted the Feather River Jamboree each year, and was Chairman of the Oakland Centennial in 1952, the first large all square dance program in Northern California. He and Billie served on the first Golden State Round-Up planning committee to select the name and establish guiding principles, and served three more years.

The Murphy's also bought (for \$1) the first subscription to Square Dance, Where?

For relaxation, he enjoys gardening, mostly camellias, azaleas, and rhodies. Len believes the new dancer deserves the best possible teaching and says, "Wise caller stays close to dancer with finger always on pulse."
