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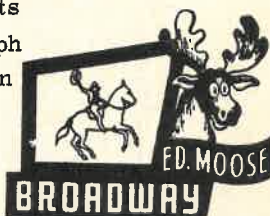

POSITION: INTRO & DANCE: Open-Facing M fcg wall
FOOTWORK: Opposite. Directions for M unless indicated
MEASURES: INTRODUCTION

- 1-4 WAIT; WAIT; APART, POINT,-; TOGETHER,TCH, -(Op-Fcg);
Walt 2 meas In Op-Fcg Pos M's R & W's L hands joined;; Step apart on L, point R twd ptr, hold 1 ct; Step diag twd ptr & RLOD on R, tch L to R, hold 1 ct ending in Op-Fcg Pos M fcg wall.

DANCE

- 1-4 FWD WALTZ; WRAP,2,3; FWD WALTZ; FWD (face), SIDE, CLOSE;
Starting M's L & swinging joined hands fwd waltz 1 meas twd in LOD; Swinging joined hands bwd M does another fwd waltz as he leads W into a full LF turn in 3 steps to WRAPPED POS fcg LOD joining M's L & W's R hands in front; In Wrapped Pos waltz 1 meas fwd LOD; Releasing M's R & W's L hands keeping others joined step fwd LOD on R (W fwd on L) turning 1/4 R (W 1/4 L) to face ptr, step swd on L, close R to L ending M's back twd COH M's L & W's R hands joined & extended twd LOD.
- 5-8 TWINKLE (LOD); TWINKLE MANUV; (R) TURNING WALTZ; (R) TURNING WALTZ (to Op-Fcg);
Swinging joined M's L & W's R hands twd RLOD twinkle down RLOD stepping L XIF of R (W R XIF L), swd on R turning to face ptr, close L to R; Stepping R XIF of L (W L XIF R) twinkle down LOD turning 1/4 RF to end in CP M's back twd LOD; Stepping bwd twd LOD on L do 2 RF turning waltzes prog down LOD making a 3/4 RF turn to end in OP-FCG POS M's back twd COH.
- 9-16 FWD WALTZ; WRAP,2,3; FWD WALTZ; FWD (face), SIDE, CLOSE; TWINKLE (LOD); TWINKLE MANUV; (R)TURNING WALTZ; (R)TURNING WALTZ (to Bfly);
Repeat action of Meas 1-8 except end in BFLY POS M's back twd COH.
- 17-20 WALTZ BAL(L); WALTZ BAL(R); VINE-TWIRL; THRU,SIDE,CLOSE (to Bfly);
In Bfly Pos step swd LOD on L, step on R behind L (W also XIB), step in place on L; Step swd RLOD on R, step on L behind R, step in place on R; As M vines down LOD stepping L, behind L on R, swd L W twirls RF under M's L hand prog down LOD; Step thru twd LOD on R, step swd LOD on L, close R to L to end in BFLY POS M's back twd COH.
- 21-24 WALTZ BAL(L); WALTZ BAL(R); VINE-TWIRL; THRU,SIDE,CLOSE (to Bfly);
Repeat action of Meas 17-20.
- 25-28 FWD WALTZ; FWD,POINT,-; TURNAWAY,2,3; TOGETHER,TCH,-(CP);
Quickly turning to SEMI-CP waltz fwd LOD; Step fwd on R, point L fwd, hold 1 ct; Do a 3/4 spot turnaway in 3 steps with M turning LF (W RF) to end fcg ptr; Step fwd twd ptr on R (W fwd L), tch L beside R to end in CP M's back twd COH.
- 29-32 BAL BACK,-,-; WALTZ MANUV; (R)TURNING WALTZ; (R)TURNING WALTZ (to Op-Fcg);
In CP M fcg wall bal back twd COH on L & hold 2 cts; Waltz manuv turning 1/4 RF to CP M's back twd LOD; Starting bwd on M's L do 2 RF turning waltzes prog LOD to end in OP-FCG POS M's back twd COH.

DANCE GOES THRU TWO TIMES

ENDING: On Meas 32 last time thru end in CP M's back twd COH then add: Bal back twd COH on L, hold 2 cts;; Twirl W RF; Change hands to M's R & W's L step apart & Acknowledge.



Conclusion of the Vic Tolley Debate!

Shake - shake - shake! Vic, that is me shaking the sand out of my ears after I pulled my head from the sand - as per your request. But, when I did pull my head from the sand what did I find? A very nice and complimentary open letter from you regarding square dancing in general and leadership in particular. After reading your letter I felt like crawling back into the sand pile.

How can you ever hope to enjoy square dancing, Vic, if there are so many things wrong with it? How can you associate with people who look with glee upon someone else's difficulties? How can you be a member of the Callers Association and not always do your level best to make it work the way you think it should. How long has it been since you have attended a meeting of this Association?

Let's face it, Vic, your idea of a leader and mine are entirely different - particularly in the field of Square Dancing. I wasn't trying to be humorous when I indicated that I believed the Chairman of a Refreshment Committee was a leader. I was deadly serious! I believe that if any individual can carry out to its successful conclusion any project they are showing symptoms of leadership.

Now - if Square Dancing was a business then the above individual would probably not get to be President of his club. But, since Square Dancing is a form of recreation then every person can and should do his part. The current President of a club may not be the best leader in the Bay Area but for general purposes he has enough of the qualities of a good leader to do the best job he knows how to do. Up to now Vic, these individuals have done better than an average job. Did you tell the Presidents of your club that they should not be in office because they did not have the same qualities of leadership that is required of the President of United Steel?

Your comment about the Dancers Association not stepping in when two clubs were

in the process of disbanding clearly indicates what I have hinted at. You do not have the slightest idea how the Dancers Association functions. To enlighten you I would like you to know the Association does have a Club Service Committee whose sole purpose is to step into the breach if any club is having difficulties. One of the standing rules of this committee is that it never steps into a club problem unless it has been officially requested to do so. Would you - the self-proclaimed arbitrator - step into an argument between a man and his wife unless you were asked to do so?

May I quote you? "Tell me Mr. Butzer, if your Dancers Association and if the Callers Association is so full of this fine leadership you speak of why don't they get together once a year and promote Square Dancing for everyone." OK, Vic, I will tell you. The two Associations have been working together for the past five years to my knowledge promoting Square Dancing. They just recently held a joint Board meeting where the problems of Dancers and Callers were discussed. The Callers sponsor a Beginners Hoedown and have shown their willingness to work with and for the dancers on many occasions. Why don't you attend a callers meeting and find out that there are some callers who take part who are interested in Square Dancing and are willing to do what they can to further promote it instead of knocking it.

Also Vic, I just plain disagree with you when you say that large clubs "secretly" hope the smaller clubs beginners would disband so they could absorb the remainder of the class." The only way I know anyone could have any information of that type would be to be a member of a club that felt that way. A dancer should be proud of his caller and club, he should be working to increase its size because then he is working for Square Dancing.

You stated that clubs should work together. Here is an example of three clubs do-

ing just that Vic. In Alameda the three clubs have banded together to promote beginners classes and further Square Dancing in that city. Part of this promotion includes putting out fliers and posters advertising the beginners classes. And Vic - I don't know if you will believe this or not but they ARE going to dance at shopping centers. Did you take the time to find out if things like this were going on before you commented on it?

Further, a group of teen-agers called the Stardettes, have been dancing all over the Bay Area for the past three years. They have danced at shopping centers, for church groups, for elder citizens, and for various Fraternal organizations. Vic, are the people who work with this group leaders? I think so. Are these teen-agers learning what constitutes leadership and responsibility. I think so.

So, Vic, in summing up, I will state once again that I believe that we have different ideas as to what constitutes leadership in Square Dancing. So may I suggest that we let the matter rest and let's both of us do what we can to build up Square Dancing?

AN OPEN LETTER TO N.C.S.D.A. by CORINNE N. O'NEAL

Because of the present undercurrent of ap-prehension, bewilderment, and urgency for a coordinated, progressive program (which concerns the very survival of the square dance movement in the Bay Area), this is by necessity, directed as an open letter to the Northern California Square Dancer's Association.

You're good . . . but not good enough. To accept a position of leadership and then coast easily along upon a pattern of past action and past decisions may be comfortable and effortless, but it is not progressive. Change is a stimulate . . . stimulation is progress, and progress is work (team-work)! To have an awareness that there is a need, to fill the airwaves with talk-talk concerning it, and then fail to take positive

action is worse than no recognition at all, for you have failed as an individual, failed in your acceptance of leadership responsibilities and, failed those who trusted you for leadership.

Turkey in the Straw. Have you ever danced to this old-time melody? Chances are you haven't and, yet, the majority of our fellow Americans associate this melody with square dancing and square dancers, along with long, sweeping dresses and men in western attire playing cowboy. They consider square dancers as truly "squares" (always laughingly, of course) and that square dancing is a rigorous, physical activity, totally lacking in artistry, which early Americans exuberantly indulged in only because of their isolation and limitations.

This is our national image! How strange it seems that within a half-century the truism of the square dance movement has not even penetrated square dancers let alone the general public. Can we not offset the Turkey-in-the-Straw concept and tell, and show, our fellow Americans that square dancing is the one and only true American dance, perpetuated by square dancers nationally, that it is modern and artistic (sometimes), that it is accepted internationally and, that it is sponsored by our Park and Recreation Boards as a public service and self-participation recreation?

Do you not think, NCSDA, long overdue is to stop presenting square dancing as an "economy package" in these days of affluency, forgetting that this dance has a rightful and honored place in American history?

Crimson was the color. The place and time was Bakersfield, 1963. The occasion was a gathering of square dancers for the promotion of our yearly State Square Dance Convention. Proudly mentioned was the influence and potential of NCSDA. There was silence. Finally the Chairman gently informed the writer that NCSDA was not a member of the State Association. Surely, just the mere exchange of ideas would demand membership not to mention the spirit of cooperation and participation for the advancement of square dancing. This, then, is NCSDA'S state image! (You may not be missed but your absence is conspicuous!)

Something to think about. And, now, the image of NCSDA within the Bay Area. The newer dancers are unaware that NCSDA even exists; past and present club officers, plus a few more, have a certain degree of knowledge because of the yearly selection of the club's Delegate (who attends District and NCSDA meetings); old-time dancers recall that sometime back NCSDA was instrumental in establishing insurance for the various member clubs. When reminded that Delegates report back to their clubs NCSDA news (and that there is a blurb in SDW?), comments were made that "it never gets past the Board" or, it is "outdated," "impersonal" and, "too brief - no pros and cons."

The Tower of Babel. Workmen, engaged in building the Tower were craftsmen. Take away their tools and they would be replaced. Take away their skills and they will learn anew. But, take away their means of

communication with one another and the building would have to be abandoned.

And this is just the way many dancers feel today . . . they have been abandoned. And because this feeling persists they, too, are abandoning NCSDA. Not intentionally, not because of retaliation, but only because the lines of communication are either no longer functioning or not functioning properly and wisely. This area of lost communication with the dancer is NCSDA'S greatest under-achievement. And it is here that NCSDA has its greatest potential for leadership.

Apprehension, Bewilderment and Urgency! These words appeared in the opening sentence. Let's now see what they imply:

Apprehension . . . is when you attend a hoedown and quietly learn that it is that club's last dance. They are folding. Apprehension . . . is when you notice, time and time again (under all the right circumstances) hoedowns attended at half capacity and you see fewer and fewer familiar faces. Apprehension . . . is when you hear dancers talk about their problems . . . all with an undertone of the blues and defeat.

Bewilderment . . . is listening to club officers talk about the lack of finances, ever-decreasing memberships, the great difficulty in inspiring people to serve as officers, the great competition in the solicitation of beginner classes and, even greater competition in hosting successful and financially sound hoedowns.

Urgency . . . do something! And somebody has! As a confirmation of what has been said here, in this open letter to NCSDA, is the fact that a President's Council has been originated here in the Bay Area "to know more about each other, to work with each other, instead of working against each other." Something is being done actively and constructively about "apprehension, bewilderment and urgency!"

And, in keeping with my philosophy that if there be criticism then let there also be constructiveness, following are suggestions which NCSDA may wish to review:

1. NCSDA to promote a quarterly NEWS-LETTER for all square dancers by square dancers, talk to the officers and the dancers and let them talk back! (An informed people are interested people and, interested

people are usually participating people.

2. Compile a HANDBOOK OF SQUARE DANCING . . . tell the story, expose historical facts, indicate the purpose, growth and function of square dancing nationwide and statewide; and, include the scope and functions of NCSDA. And, there is also the acceptance of the square dance internationally . . . which is a beautiful story in itself brought about by some very modern pioneers.

3. Why doesn't NCSDA sponsor an installation ceremony recognizing and honoring our newly elected officers.

4. Why doesn't NCSDA establish a seminar for all newly elected officers so that they may early become acquainted with the many problems for the continuance of the square dance movement, club affairs, thereby eli-

minating much of the "trial and error" waste. (Most club officers are just beginning to function progressively at the conclusion of their term of office).

5. Why doesn't NCSDA establish a LOG BOOK for registering various hoedowns so that there may be a stop placed upon too many clubs within too short a distance having hoedowns on the same night? No club wants this kind of situation . . . but it is happening all the time.

6. And for a long range program, why doesn't NCSDA take a long look at square dancing five years hence . . . and determine areas wherein more clubs are needed and those where several are now starving. (How about one school area supporting three different clubs? It should never have happened!).

So, get with it BIG DADDY!
