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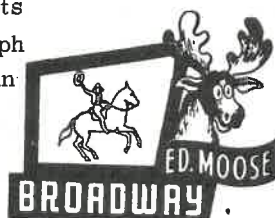

A PLEA FOR TOLERANCE

Last month Square Dance-Where? printed an article by Madeline Allen titled "All About Freeloaders." I would like to state a few of my thoughts on this subject. Please understand first and foremost - they are not offered in an argumentative vein but primarily to present another perspective. This is not written in defense of "freeloaders" (a word I thoroughly dislike) - it is my plea for all of us to be more tolerant of the other person whose circumstances may control his ability to give to the square dance movement.

I am sure most of us were told at the beginning: Learn to square dance - it is so much fun. Everybody can square dance - whether you are 8 or 80. Square dancing is fun! That is our primary selling point in this great recreation. So most people start out dancing under this impression: to have fun - to get away from the toils of the day - to have a little relaxation.

But Square Dancers are PEOPLE - and to live in this complex world we all know the problems are many and varied. Let's take a look at you—the people who square dance. What are you like? Dr. Robert Havinghurst has done an interesting piece of research on the tasks adults in our society have to accomplish at various points in the life cycle. This was brought out at a Square Dance Leadership Conference conducted by Dr. Eva Schindler-Rainman at the University of Southern California... According to this research, the adult life cycle is divided into three categories or stages: Early adulthood, middle age, and later maturity. There are tasks in each of these stages which almost every adult in our society must cope with. They are as follows:

- Early Adulthood: 1. Selecting a mate. 2. Learning to live with a marriage partner. 3. Starting a family. 4. Rearing children. 5. Managing a home. 6. Getting started in an occupation. 7. Taking on civic responsibility.

Developmental Tasks of Adult Middle Age: 1. Achieving adult civic and social responsibility. 2. Establishing and maintaining an economic standard of living. 3. Assisting teenage children to become responsible and happy adults. 4. Developing adult leisure time activities. 5. Relating oneself to one's spouse as a person. 6. To accept and adjust to the physiological changes of middle age. 7. Adjusting to aging parents.

Later Maturity: 1. Adjusting to decreasing physical strength and health. 2. Adjustment to retirement and reduced income. 3. Adjusting to death of spouse. 4. Establishing an explicit affiliation with one's age group. 5. Meeting social and civic obligations. 6. Establishing satisfactory physical living arrangements.

Knowing this about you makes us (the Square Dance Callers and Leaders) realize we are affecting but a small part of your life.

According to this research, I suppose the ideal square dancer would be Middle Age whose No. 1 task is "Achieving adult civic and social responsibility. They have reached the point in their lives where they can give of themselves to the square dance movement. But what about the young married couple? Recreation plays a very small part - in fact - it is the least of their cares and responsibilities. What about the older person who comes under "Later Maturity?" Recreation is pretty low on the totem pole in his life now.

I am sure we all have friends in the three categories. They are all wonderful people and I personally do not choose to think of anyone as a freeloader simply because they all cannot "give of themselves" on an equal basis.

To be an ideal recreation then, we, the leaders, should offer something for everyone. As for those people who work hard and give so much to the square dance movement, God bless them all. Survival would be hard without them. But let's not make others feel as though they are freeloaders. We want them in the square dance movement too.

How many of you have been guilty of asking a couple who have missed two or three club nights, "Well, where have you been?" The tone implies they "owe" it to the club to be there every week. Their answer should be, "It's none of your business!" It's all right to tell them they have been missed but, please, do not pry for an explanation. Someday, someone will tell you the truth: the bank account is overdrawn; the baby had the measles; the hot water heater went out and flooded everything; they have been suffering with a migraine headache for three days; and to make two loaves of ham sandwiches for the Saturday night hoedown was more than the budget could take.

So wherever you dance—in a beginners class, a refresher class, the weekly recreation-type club, the advanced workshop, the closed club, the basement group, the church group, the teenagers—we need you all. You are an intricate part of square dancing and we hope you are all having fun. Speaking for the Pages — of course!
