To tell you everything we saw in Europe would be a near impossibility and I won't even attempt to try. Everything was so beautiful, so fabulous, so elegant—it is beyond my ability to give a verbal description. I am writing this (more or less) for the women and will try to recall those memories which meant the most to me.

ENGLAND—London was just as I had imagined it would be. It was absolutely mad with traffic and to cross a street was to take your life in your hands. You soon learned to "look right" and run as fast as you could. England is the only place in Europe where the cars still use the wrong side of the road and I daresay I could live there a year and still have a hard time getting used to it. Everything is backwards! Money was also the hardest for me to understand—in fact I never did. I just held out my hand and let the clerks take the correct amount. I'm certain they did just that! I bought a beautiful coat with the "animal look" on Oxford Street in a most elegant fur shop. The saleslady who was helping me said, "You must be from California." This really took me back. I could see her guessing me from the U.S.A. but, with the remains of my Southern accent, the California bit took me by surprise. I said "Yes, I am, but how did you know?" She said, "I can always tell because the nicest people I meet are from California." Of course, this completely won me over and as stated above, I bought the coat—cost me fifteen guineas and it was a steal!

HOLLAND—Beautiful Holland. We loved every inch of it. Flowers everywhere and the people were delightful. We stayed at the Hilton Amsterdam, several miles from the downtown section. Wanting to shop in their main shopping center, Bob and I took a taxi and spent a lovely afternoon in their quaint shops, trying so desperately to be understood. English may be spoken all over Europe (at least this is what we were told) but, believe you me, this isn't true. As the saying goes, everyone speaks English except the person I happened to be speaking with! We finally found ourselves in their five o'

clock rush-hour traffic and not a taxi in sight. You can't even use the phone because the operator can no comprehend! We found a policeman and with our arms waving, we attempted to explain our plight—how to get back to the Hilton. He understood "Hilton" and put us on one of their local buses where we sat and silently prayed until the Hilton came into sight. Everything we did was an experience and I loved every minute of it.

FRANCE—No one in their right mind would attempt to describe Paris. We were told she is like a beautiful woman—very difficult. This was said regarding politics, but we were not interested in their politics. It was a dream come true, looking down on "her" from the Eiffel Tower. Taking a boat ride on the Seine at night and saying, "As long as I live, I shan't forget the beauty of seeing the Notre Dame at night, and the thousands of other places so beautiful we can well understand the artists desire to live in such a place." Suzanne, our French lady guide, told me the women of France did not believe in wearing slacks, pants or whatever they might be called. She said, "We just are not built for them and they don't look good on us. We dress as women should dress and would never be caught in public with our hair in rollers." This was very true, in all of our travels, we didn't see a single woman in pants. Guest Count

Marco must be right! But, our French gentleman guide was everything you would expect in the way of a Frenchman. On one of our local city tours, the bus stopped to let our people out to take pictures. As they returned to the bus and I counted to see if all were "accounted for," I turned to our French guide and asked, "Are you ready?" In a most delectable Charles Boyer accent, he replied, "I don't know what that means in your country, Madame, but in France,

the answer is 'yes'!"

ITALY—Rome, Naples, Sorrento, The Isle of Capri—it was all there in its breath taking, old, but lovely beauty. If I had to say the place I enjoyed the most, I would say Italy. Being Italian, I might be a little prejudiced here! Their pasta was the best ever. Their chocolate ice cream, just as Sophia Loren described in her tour of Italy. The people were friendly, emotional and to shop was an unforgettable experience. Most of them cannot understand one word of English, let alone speak it. They expected you to bargain for each thing you bought. They could not say the 'price' so that we could understand it, consequently, you did all your bargaining on a piece of paper, as they could write (for instance) 3100 Lire. Being thoroughly experienced as travelers by now, I knew immediately this was \$5.00, which was "too much!" So, on and on until you both would agree on a price at which time you more than likely found them throwing their arms around you, shaking your hand and saying, "Grazia, grazia!" One experience I will never forget—I made the mistake of going into a beauty salon and trying to make an appointment. In the first place (as I found out later) they do not make appointments. You just walk in and sit down. I didn't want to sit down on Monday but wanted to on Thursday—we spent at least fifteen minutes of hand waving and I finally left in despair. I quickly learned what to say—something like 'messa in piega'—went back again on Thursday and sat down. Then I made the mistake of showing her a picture of the way I wanted my hair done. Well, it seems she couldn't do the picture without first cutting my hair, which I didn't want cut. You might guess the outcome—she cut my hair with her 18 inch scissors (I swear) and made me the loveliest hairdo I've ever had! I stood with my back to the Trevi Fountain, threw my coin with my right hand over my left shoulder—and now I will get to go back to Rome.

SWITZERLAND — Fabulously green! Our hotel here (The Palace Hotel on Lake Lucerne) was the most luxurious in all of Europe. One of our highlights was renting their main ballroom and inviting local Swiss people to dance with us. They came in authentic Swiss costume and we wore our square dance outfits. They would do a dance and then each one would get one of us and then we would attempt to dance it

with them. All of this without one word between us. One Swiss man danced every dance with me during the night, and their waltzes must be 200 beats a minute. I could hardly move the next day. Of course, Bob called some squares and we got them up to dance with us. It was a night to remember. Afterwards, refreshments of cake, wine and coffee were served and I sat at a table with five Swiss people and "talked" to them. I learned their names and the man I danced with managed to let me know he wasn't married! This is no easy thing to do when you can't speak one word of each other's language! We all went absolutely wild buying watches in Lucerne. The final count, thirty people in our group bought 92 watches!

GERMANY—Munich was 90% destroyed during the war and here it was in all of its splendor, looking as though it had been there hundreds of years. Our hotel had to be at least 100 years old—but in the lobby there was a picture showing it completely destroyed during the war. We drank beer in their famous beer houses (one holds 10,000 people and it was hard to find a place to sit). Beer was approximately 30 cents a quart, coffee 75 cents a cup. Their beer was also 25 per cent to 28 per cent alcohol, and very, very good. I don't like beer but I loved theirs. When you stay in European hotels, the 'help' doesn't knock when they want to come in your room. They use their key, which will open any door and simply walk in. This was upsetting and hard to get used to, but I finally reached the point in Munich where I simply didn't care. I had an early morning appointment (for my hair)—(they make appointments in Germany) and crawled out of bed half asleep. We always had breakfast in our room. So I put in our order and proceeded to the bathroom. Every hotel has a bidet for the women (and since their toilet tissue is made from sticks, stones and wax) you soon learn to use them. This particular bidet had three adjustments and the maid had left one on, when I turned a knob, water started hitting the ceiling like a fountain and we had a twenty foot ceiling! I screamed for Bob and he finally got it turned off. Then I turned the other knob and the whole thing started all over again. All I could say was, "They'll make us paint the bathroom"—and by this time my nightgown and hair was dripping wet. I stripped everything off and just at this moment the waiter walked in with our break-

ast. With me absolutely naked, he calmly put it down, said, "Good morning, Ma-lame," and walked out!

As afterthoughts—I will always remember their luxurious bathrooms with huge bathtubs over six feet long and three feet deep. Marble, marble everywhere. Our hotel room in Italy was solid marble—the floors, the window sills, the bathroom walls and tub. I loved their beds with the huge feather comforter on top and the way they turned your bed down at night, spread a little towel, where you would take off your shoes, put out your gown and slippers—gave you all fresh towels—and then put a little bar of chocolate on your pillow, which said "goodnight" in four languages.

I shall never forget the taxi rides—absolutely wild and so scary you didn't dare look out. They went through intersections at least fifty miles an hour, blowing their horns to high heaven just as you missed someone else coming the other way blowing their horn!

I shall long dream of their elegant ways of setting the table—always with at least ten pieces of silverware.

And wonderful Italy—the only place we couldn't drink their water—where to buy a bottle of water cost 70 cents and a bottle of wine cost 25 cents. It really is a nice way to start the day—brushing your teeth with wine!
