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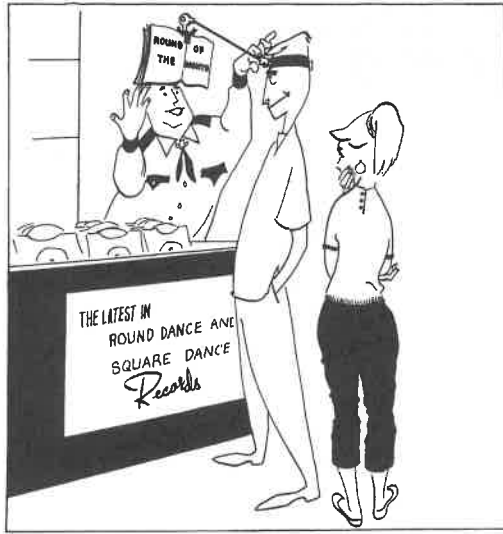

A SURVEY OF REASON'S FOR OUR DROPOUTS

Several months ago this writer and his wife, Anne, were commissioned by the editors of SQUARE DANCE, WHERE? to investigate and explore the reasons for the square dance drop-out. This was to have been accomplished by interviewing people who had once been square dancers. As it turned out, this was not an easy method to follow. Some former square dancers who were contacted refused to even discuss the matter, or were quick to give some trite, popular answer like 'too many new basics, etc'. *(See footnote) Some, who had not danced in over a year, claimed that they had not dropped out and were expecting to rejoin their club "any day now." Further discussion with such people brought out reasons why they were not now dancing and gave indications that it would be unlikely if they ever danced again. For some of those who refused to discuss the matter, it was sometimes possible to get second-hand information from a third party. The information which follows was gathered from a random sample of over one hundred couples representing not only Northern California, but several other states as well.

The reasons were personal; that is, everyone concerned in this study had a valid, personal reason for discontinuing the square dance activity. While some of the reasons fell into certain categories, each reason was personal for the person giving it. This is important to keep in mind because, of all types of social recreational activities, square dancing is the most personal; by way of both physical and emotional contact. One cannot even begin to square dance without the help of seven other human beings and a caller; a club or group usually consists of at least twelve couples. When one is this closely associated with other human beings in a recreational activity, the formal reserve is down and personal feelings are exposed. In such a social situation the chances for one's feelings to be hurt are multiplied many fold. However, there was one

reason given which probably had no relation to hurt feelings. This was the reason of poor or failing health.

As middle-age comes on, physical well-being slows down, as this writer is learning only too well. A number of older people questioned stated that poor health caused them to stop square dancing. While a heart condition was mentioned in two or three instances, most mentioned arthritis-like conditions—or—(sadly) an inability to keep up with the group. In almost all these cases it was the lady who was ill or infirm (this is contrasted with the reverse situation when reasons other than health were given). While there should be no question about the "health reason" of these older people, there seemed to be an underlying cause of the drop-outs: a feeling of not being able to keep up with the group.

There was another reason for not continuing to square dance which was related to feelings in an abstract sort of way. Four couples were contacted who had been active dancers, but had moved away. They had not joined a local club in their new area, nor had they danced at local open hoe-downs. While a number of "reasons" were given, the reason which came through was that the couple (usually the man) was simply too shy to go join another square dance group. We must remember that this man came to square dancing as an awkward fellow along with other awkward fellows in a beginners class. There must have been a certain safety in numbers. If he never became expert in his own mind, he must have had great hesitations to join with some other experienced group. Of course, the couple which doesn't have these reservations joins a new group without qualms and does not fall into the classification of the drop-out.

For the balance of the former dancers questioned we have the following as expressed, but not in any particular order of importance:

CALLERS - LEADERS

A number of men had become so disgusted with the dictatorial policies and practices of the club caller that they had insisted that they give up square dancing entirely. This was the group which refused to discuss the matter. In some cases the wife gave information, in others it was from associates. Such things as: "... he felt he was bossed around enough on the job that he didn't want to go out one night a week to be bossed by some other guy, or ... who the Hell did the caller think he was telling me what to do, or ... why can't the caller listen to the suggestions we make?"

Closely associated with this criticism was a complaint against club presidents or other leading officers. Somewhat the same kind of reaction: "... who is he to tell me ...?" Connected to this was the simple question of overwork: "... we were always on some committee or other ... we came to dance, not to always work ..."

IN-GROUPS and CLIQUES

Here the complaint was the difference between "THEY" and "US" with the feeling that "THEY" did all the extra fun things or made the rules while "WE" were often left out. In some cases it was not a question of a clique, but of just one other couple or person. The male drop-out would have had an argument or disagreement with some other fellow in the club and would have become so upset over this to insist that he and his wife stop going to workshops or club nights. One or two hoedowns might be attended following this, but then there would be a complete withdrawing from square dancing; it became either "... back to the old TV ... or ... let's take up something else ..."

DANCING ABILITY

There were a number of cases where the man never became a good square dancer while his wife became rather expert. More and more the man would sit out a tip or two which would result in his not getting any better. On certain nights he wouldn't even show up at the club workshop although his wife would manage to attend. Then, with the realization of what was about to happen to the marriage, the wife would suggest that they drop out of square dancing and seek other means of recreation. There were a

number of other indications that the man wasn't happy with the activity (which supposes that he was not successful with the basic skills); anyway, because of the man's dissatisfaction, the couple withdrew.

FAD INTEREST

There were some who had nothing bad to say about square dancing, they simply were now active in something else: bowling, golf, boating, camping, or whatever. In most cases these people had an history of being involved in some different kind of recreational activity every so often. Square dancing requires some kind of regular attendance. If one does not go dancing every month or so, one finds that he is faltering much too much at a dance. To save embarrassment, one goes into other activities which don't demand such constant practice.

HIGH LEVEL

A few who were contacted turned out to be not drop-outs at all, but simply dancers who no longer belonged to a regular club. They were dancers who attended closed high-level dances and occasionally attended certain special workshops. They were people who paid their way all the way and would always leave a donation on those rare occasions when they attended the workshop of a local club. With this group are those who have become more interested in Round Dancing, and spend much of their time in this related activity. It is not that they have forsaken square dancing, it is just that they round dance more.

SQUARE DANCE CALLERS

One need only study the annual list of callers in the Callers Association to see that there is a certain amount of turnover, or one need only to read the club listings in this magazine to see that some established names no longer appear. The former caller is the saddest drop-out of all!

First, there is the newer caller who registers and maintains membership for a year or two, then drops out. Taking him as an example, we can follow a direct history: a beginner who is encouraged by his wife to attend a beginners class; a man who learns to enjoy square dancing; a fellow who begins to sing along with the caller which leads to a callers class; a budding caller who starts a beginners class of his own with the hope that it will lead to an established club; then, the disappointment as the new

club falters without the support of the neighboring 'old line' clubs and callers. Such a fellow has gone all the way to the top of the movement, but has found failure as his reward. There is no other way for him to go but out.

Then, there is the experienced caller; the one with an established club or two. He calls several hoedowns through the year; he serves the good of square dancing through the several associations, yet, he quits! He is the caller who has faced all the others mentioned above, he has dealt with beginner and expert alike, and he has tried to satisfy all to keep the club together. But, for the most part, he has been criticised from all quarters. In time his tough skin can take it no longer and he is plagued with the thoughts of "... after all I've done for these folks, they still find fault." Therefore, as things fall apart, he finds himself accused of the fault, so he drops out of the activity; sometimes silently, sometimes with bitter recriminations, but for all intents and purposes, he is lost to square dancing forever. What a pity, what a loss!

CONCLUSION

There is really no conclusion. Each reader, each dancer, each leader should be able to come up with some kind of answer to each problem of the drop-out as it affects his group or organization. This writer will simply conclude that we all take into consideration the age-old precept: "DO AND ACT TOWARD OTHERS AS YOU WOULD LIKE HAVE BEEN DONE AND ACTED TOWARD YOU."

* (Footnote)

The time-honored complaint that there are too many new basics is just not valid. Ten years ago Wheel & Deal - and - Square Thru were unknown; look how Swing Thru and Spin the Top have continued to make square dancing more interesting. If a beginner can learn and enjoy Wheel Around, Grand Right and Left, and Alamo Style, he can learn and enjoy the others just as much. Someone once said, "You can find the time and energy to learn and do that which you want to do." Therefore, the bug-a-boo of "new basics" is but a cover-up for the real, personal reasons why people drop out of square dancing. We owe it to ourselves to extend every effort to solve the personal problems of square dancing, and not be too

concerned with the mechanics of our activity.
