PERSPECTIVES ON THE CALLERS INSTITUTE

Perhaps one of the finest Caller Institutes held in many years was held last September under the guidance of MAX FORSYTH at the Riverside Center in Santa Cruz. All the day sessions and workshops were restricted to callers and executive members of the Dancer's Association. The Saturday night dance was open to the square dancing public, and a fine group participated in both the dance and the after-party.

Max really let his hair down and got to the ground roots of the square dance picture as far as the caller presentations were concerned. He showed us in detail how to prepare and present an evening's program for the greater enjoyment of all. He drove home the one major idea that "... when dancers begin to fall apart on the floor, it is the caller's fault!" The caller has either called something too difficult or he has not been clear in his commands or he has used a combination of basics which don't fit well together.

From the standpoint of dancing and programming, Max actually demonstrated his every remark during the Saturday night dance. It was interesting to watch the dancers' reaction as Max would explain to the callers on the floor exactly what he was doing. It took a tip or two for the dancers to get into the swing of such a hoedown, but the dance was a great success with the dancers leaving the hoedown with the feeling that they hadn't ever attended a better dance.

Max also spent some time discussing club organization, physical hall arrangement (it is different on the East Coast,) and some new ideas regarding the first night of a beginners class. All the callers left this institute with many things to ponder during the months to come.

It was a great institute, from a caller's point of view.

A COMMENT ON BILL JONAS' ARTICLE IN OCTOBER ISSUE ENTITLED "A SURVEY OF THE REASON'S FOR OUR DROPOUTS"

Just finished reading your article "A Survey Of Reason's For Our Dropouts."

I can understand why a very important reason was left out why people leave their square dance clubs. Being a caller yourself you do not want to hurt or speak against a brother caller—but not all callers are that considerate.

We saw many good dancers leave our club because our caller made slight remarks about their mistakes; later on the remarks became downright insults, and all this took

place in front of the whole club and invited guests. How does one continue a workshop under these conditions?

Not long after that, the remarks and insults were against another caller. A group of us went to dance to this other caller who had been insulted so many times. We found that whenever he mentioned dancers or other callers it was always to tell us that we should dance to these other callers who were very good. In the four years we've been dancing to him we've yet to hear even the slightest word about anyone—be it dancer or caller.

At this same time, our Round Dance teachers (Mr. and Mrs. ---) took many of us aside and once more the remarks and insults against this other caller were told to us. I defended him as I did other callers who take their work seriously and are considerate of their pupils.

As you might guess we all quit our Round Dance club, and within a very short time the round dance teachers lost their complete Square Dance club.

Now we still see many of these dancers at hoedowns, and they all tell us the same thing, "we were fools to take the insults for a long time, we should have left the club sooner." At least these people continue to dance, but what about those many others who have never returned to square dancing. Is it their faults? Were they too sensitive? No sir! They gave the best of themselves, but didn't receive the best from their so-called teachers.

No, Mr. Jonas, it isn't always "old age" or arthritis for I have both of them, but I find happiness in Square Dancing to the right teacher.

Since your survey didn't include anyone signing their names I will also not sign mine, but I very much would like to see this letter in print in the S.D.W? magazine because you might be quite surprised at how many letters you will receive revealing the real truth of why they left square dancing.

Thank you kindly Mr. Editor, and I hope you overlook my errors.

Dear Editor:

Bill Jonas on DROPOUTS was right to the point. Congratulations Bill, on a most perceptive report.

The introductory remarks revealed a sociological aspect of square dancing that all of us may ignore at times. This form of recreation is really a "team sport," and each dancer must cooperate quickly and instinctively with seven others, while being coached from the sidelines. Some can do this easily. For others it is agony, never being sure that the error is one's own or the other fellow's, hesitant to make any anticipatory move, lest it be wrong, unwilling to accept the little bits of coaching from others in the square.

The beginner may not realize that this lack of "team instinct" is what is holding him back when he hits the regular club workshop routine, and he may blame lack of skill, or rude thoughtlessness of the others for his troubles. Probably half of the drop-outs during the first three months, is due to the unconscious recognition that a team-oriented activity is not for them. For a smaller number, it may be another aspect of the same problem—they cannot bear the routine of going out socially on the same night each week, with the submersion of one's selfish desires for independence in both time and activity. For these beginners, we can do little.

This still leaves a large number of new

dancers who may drop out in the first three months. I believe we could save more from this fate in that period, than by any effort directed at older drop-outs. Remember, these new members are no longer protected by the cocoon of their class period, they are shy about getting into an experienced square, and they are mortified by mistakes that you can laugh off. The early enthusiasm they brought from their class is soon lost, if experienced dancers seem to snub them, or are impatient with their mistakes. How they long to be asked to join a good square, and to be treated as one of the gang. My happiest memories are of Dan & Madeline Allen getting us into their square, while Jim York inspired us to heights we didn't know we could reach!

Everyone could re-read Bill Jonas' DROPOUTS to advantage, and make his own estimate of how HE or SHE could do something to prevent dropouts. I, for one, am going to work harder at getting experienced dancers to get the awkward, shy, but willing newcomers into the best squares, where they too will be inspired to want to enjoy square dancing for years, not just for a few months.
