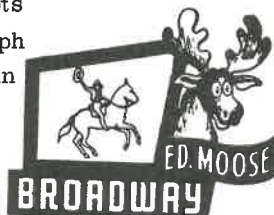

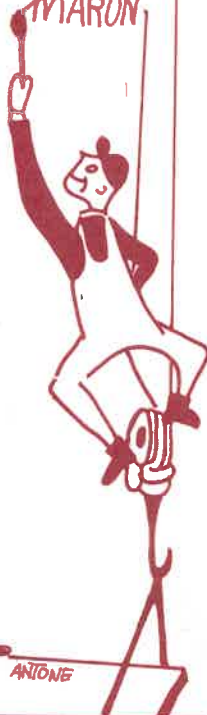

For those of you who do not know, a good friend was lost to all of us in the death of Jack Mann on September 25th.

Jack left a host of friends from among the

many organizations to which he contributed so much time and devotion during his lifetime.
