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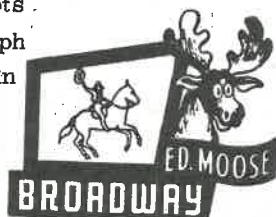

RECORD: "Marnie" - Grenn 14100

POSITION: Open-Fcg M fag wall for Intro; same for Dance

FOOTWORK: Opposite: directions given for M except as noted

MEASURES

INTRODUCTION

1-4 WAIT; WAIT; APART, PT,-; TOG, TCH,-;

In O en-fcg M fac wall with M's R & W's L hands joined wait 2 meas;; Step apt on L, pt R twd ptr,-; Step diag twd ptr & RLOD on R, tch L to R, -;

DANCE

1-4 WALTZ AWAY; WALTZ TOG (to Bfly); WALTZ BAL L; WALTZ BAL R;

Swing joined hands fwd & waltz LOD turning slightly away from ptr L,R,L;
Swing joined hands bwd waltz fwd turning twd ptr R,L,R to end in BFLY M fag wall; Step swd LOD on L, XRIB of L (W XIB), step in place on L; Step swd RLOD on R, XLIB of R (W XIB), step in place on R;

5-8 WALTZ AWAY; WALTZ TOG (to Bfly); WALTZ BAL L; WALTZ BAL R (SCP);

Repeat action of Meas 1-4 EXCEPT end in SCP fag LOD.

9-12 FWD WALTZ; FWD, PT TURN (to SCar,-; TWINKLE (RLOD); TWINKLE MANUV (to CP);

In SCP waltz fwd LOD L,R,L; M step fwd R, pt L fwd at same time turn 1/2 RF to SCar (W step fwd L, pt R fwd),-; In SCar twinkle RLOD XLIF of R (W XIB) swd R turning to BJO, close L to R; In Bjo twinkle maneuver XRIF of L (W XIB), step swd twd wall on L turning to face RLOD, close R to L to end in CP M fag RLOD;

13-16 WALTZ TURN R; WALTZ TURN R(face wall); VINE TWIRL; THRU, FWD CLOSE (to Vars);

Start bwd on L & do 2 RF turning waltzes down LOD making a 3/4 turn L,R,L; R,L,R to end M fag wall; M vines L,R,L (as W does a RF twirl under joined M's L & W's R hands); Release hands M steps thru on R, fwd L, closes R to L (as W continues turning 1/4 RF to face LOD on L, fwd R, close L to R) to end in VARS fag LOD;

17-20 FWD WALTZ; WALTZ (to RH Star); STAR AROUND; SPOT TURN (to SCar);

In Vars waltz fwd L,R,L; Release M's L & W's L hands M leads W out to a RH STAR M turning 1/4 RF R,L,R (W turning 3/4 RF L,R,L) to end M fag wall; Star around RF to face RLOD (W face LOD); Release hands both do a 1/2 RF spot turn M step R,L,R to end in LOOSE SCAR M fag LOD & wall (W RLOD & COH);

21-24 TWINKLE OUT; TWINKLE IN; TWINKLE OUT; TWINKLE IN (Open-fcg);

In SCar do 4 twinkle steps down LOD alternating from SCar to BJO L,R,L; R,L,R; R,L,R; R,L,R to end in Open-fcg M fag wall;

25-28 WALTZ AWAY; WALTZ TOG (to Bfly); FLOAT APART; SPIN MANUV (CP);

Swing joined hands fwd waltz fwd LOD L,R,L turning slightly away from ptr;
Swing joined hands bwd waltz fwd LOD R,L,R turning twd ptr to end in BFLY M fag wall; Keep both hands joined waltz apart L,R,L to arms' length as in a "float-out"; M does a waltz maneuver R,L,R as he leads W into a LF spin to end in CP M fag wall;

29-32 WALTZ TURN R; WALTZ TURN R; WALTZ TURN R; WALTZ TURN R;

Do 4 RF turning waltzes down LOD L,R,L; R,L,R; L,R,L; R,L,R to end in Open-fcg M fag wall to repeat dance from the beginning.

DANCE GOES THRU 2 TIMES

ENDING: On Meas 32 last time thru, substitute TWIRL & ACK for the 4th turning waltz.

COMMERCIALISM ? asks MADELINE ALLEN...

A Square Dance Where? reprint

Periodically a cry goes up about 'commercialism' in the field of Square Dancing. We used to have complaints about paying admission to the dances, we heard bitter comments about advertisements in dance magazines, and about Callers promoting records, and about charges for classes. In each case, however, people got used to the idea of paying for what they wanted, and in the end they got a much better product than they had before.

Look at the items you can buy now, designed and made especially for Square Dancers. Remember how we used to hunt for shoes, for men's ties, for shirts, for petticoats, to say nothing of records and sound equipment. When we started dancing, we had one record without calls, and we turned it over all evening long. Now look at the choice! Is that bad?

The newest complaint I have heard is about the charges made by Callers. It is a lament for the old days, when so many Callers came to each Hoedown that all you had to do was to call them up from the floor in turn, and you had your program. The calling may not all have been good, but it was varied and it was free. Now, the trend is toward a program of not more than two or three Callers, all invited, and all paid. Where, they ask, is it going to end? How can smaller Hoedowns afford to compete? Where can Beginning Callers get experience?

It seems to me that the answer is that Square Dancers are learning more all the time. As our activity grows up, more and more of us are learning what good Calling really is, and how much difference it makes to us to be able to relax, and quit worrying about whether or not the Caller knows what he is doing. Top quality Calling is like a good steak—there's nothing we'd like better, but we realize that we can't all have it every day. We're glad to worry along with what we can get, for our regular Club nights, but we do like to get out on Saturday night and dance to the best Callers we can find. And those who promote Hoedowns are realizing that, and are planning accordingly.

Actually, it seems to me that the law of supply and demand is operating very satisfactorily in the field of square dance Callers, and the situation is a very healthy one. We still have more Callers in the Bay Area than in almost any other similar area, of all degrees of competence. And we have plenty of dancers who care about dancing to the best calling available and are willing to pay for it, and we also have a lot of dancers who care more about just dancing in their own groups, and who love their own Callers, no matter how amateurish. We also have new recruits coming up all the time.

The trouble seems to be that some people are confusing Commercialism with Professionalism. Amateurs are all very fine for some things, and if you can get a friend to help you build your barbecue for nothing, you are in luck. But you don't expect the same standard of results from him that you do if you hire a professional to install your furnace - you want an expert, and you are

willing to pay what he is worth. Learning to be a Caller is something like learning to be a doctor, requiring a large investment in money and time before any return can be expected. Many a Caller had bought his equipment, taken a course or two in Calling, maybe got up his own Club in order to have dancers to practice on, and gotten up to where he is occasionally asked to call at Hoedowns, only to find out that he simply does not care to take that last big jump, and really work at it enough to be worth paying. As long as he is calling free, or just for expenses, he has no responsibility beyond doing his best, whatever that is. But the moment he sets himself up as a professional, and agrees to do a job of Calling, he is no longer his own master. Then he owes his dancers a good, professional job, and if he can't do it easily, he has to stay all night and practice until he can. He also has to be convinced that he has the natural ability to do it, which is not true of everyone.

Even when Callers have decided to be professionals, and have achieved a reputation in their own area, there are decisions to be made. Someone is always trying to persuade them to become 'Traveling Callers' and make a bigger name for themselves. Dancers who have heard about the hundred dollar fees demanded by some Traveling Callers tend to assume that the rewards for that sort of life are really lush - but those who have tried it have found that expenses are right there along with profits. That fact explains why most of our Professionals are still only part-time Callers, and depend on other jobs for a living.

I think it would be fair to say that no one ever went into "Square Dance Calling" just to make money. Maybe it looked like fun, maybe the club needed a Caller, maybe it looked like a chance to be a Big Shot - but it certainly never looked like a chance to get rich quick. Most Callers never get beyond trying to pay off that initial investment. And for those few who do get good enough to start making a profit - let's not grudge it to them. They might quit Calling, and the loss would be ours.

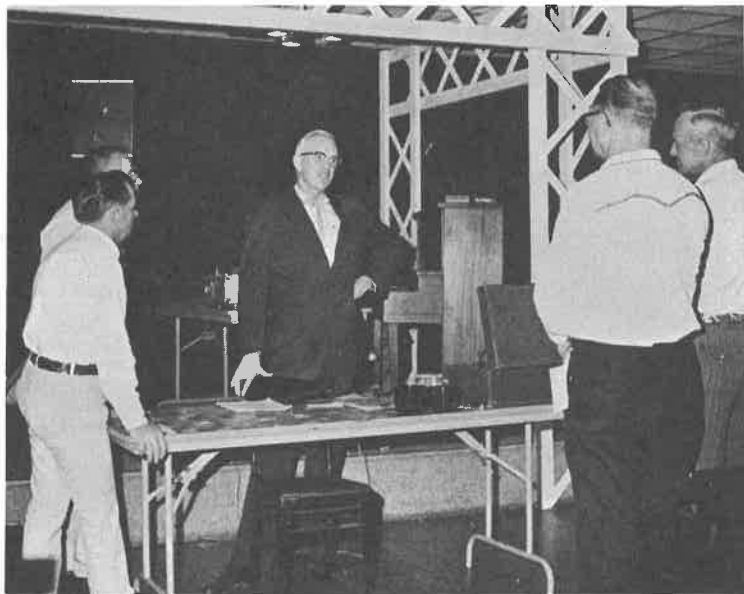

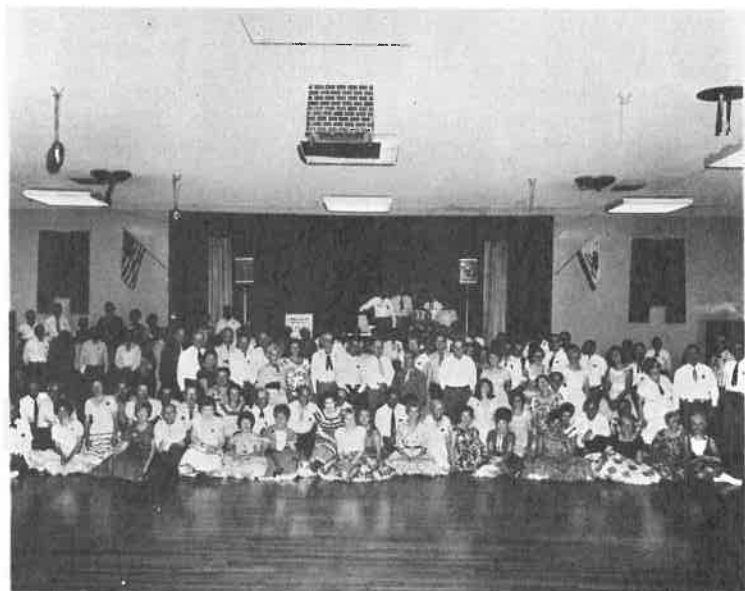
