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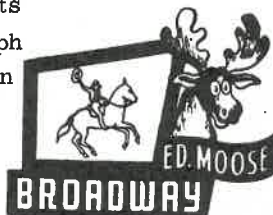

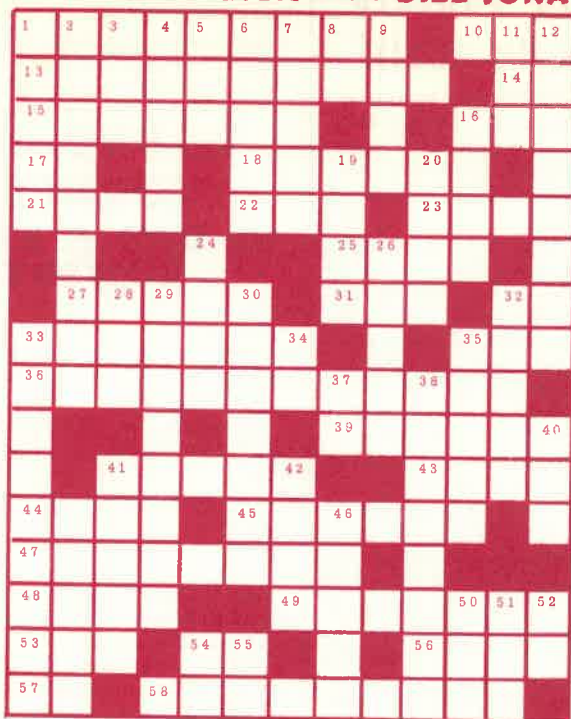

Well, the time has come and all the committees are busy working—preparing for the Round-Up in May. Many fingers are doing many jobs and believe me it does take many hard working hours.

Of course, one of the most important things of the Round-Up is the Callers, so to inform you a little bit of the background we will be publishing each month what we have found out.

This month we have a very good looking caller DAVE TAYLOR - Dave did not begin square dance calling by choice; he was ordered to do so. This happened about 12 years ago when Dave, a Detroit school teacher, was working part time for the Detroit Parks and Recreation Department and was assigned to Cannon Recreation in Detroit. He was in charge of the Saturday night activities, including teaching children's square dance classes. Because of lack of experience, he refused this assignment, but after two other potential callers had been drafted and were unsuccessful, Dave was ordered to call.

He took advantage of an offer of coaching from another caller, and finally felt that he was getting the idea. In about a year, he decided to spread his wings a bit further, and after much work and practice within three years he was accepting out-of-town bookings.

For two years he M.C.'d a radio program "Square Dance Club of the Air" on Detroit Radio Station WJLB.

As Dave's activities expanded further, he began to appear on the staffs of various square dance institutes. He has called one night stands, festivals, conventions and institutes in just about every area of the U.S. A., in Canada, several European countries, Bermuda, Hawaii, Puerto Rico, Mexico, and is Staff Director of Boyne Highlands

Squarama in Michigan, one of the largest square dance institutes in the country. He also conducts several square dance weekends each year.

One of Dave's primary interests is in working with potential callers, and he has conducted his own Caller's Clinics, as well as featuring nationally known callers in clinics at Boyne Highlands. He also enjoys working with beginners and in helping to interest more people in square dancing.

Current activities in the Detroit area include several workshops in various areas of Metropolitan Detroit and suburbs, and calling for six clubs in the area, plus Dave records for Windsor Records.

Keeping five children out of mischief is a full-time job for Angie Taylor, but she helps Dave with his classes and clubs, and manages to accompany him on some of his trips.

Dave is a mathematics teacher with the Detroit Board of Education, and received his Masters from Wayne State University in 1963.

The Taylor family resides in Grosse Pointe Farms, Michigan, a suburb of Detroit.
