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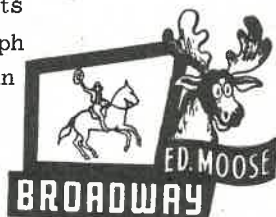


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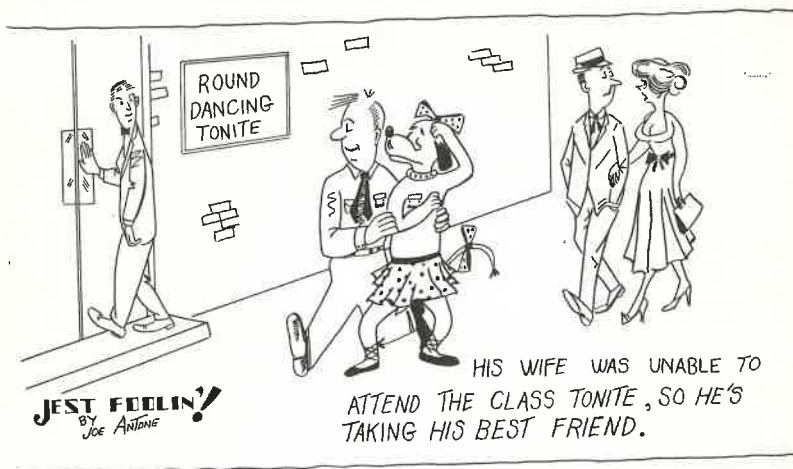

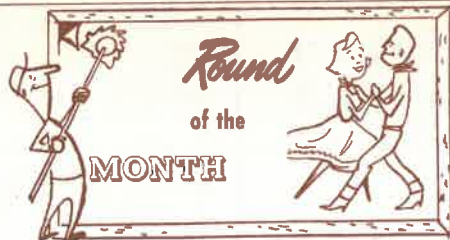

On January 28, 1968, our Association had a joint meeting with Santa Clara Valley Dancers Association at the American Legion Hall in San Jose, Calif.

Needless to say, we were mighty proud of the turnout we had from our Association. You have a lot of hard working people on your Board and they have the interest of the Association at heart.

The boundaries of the different Associations were discussed and Clubs that lie in the "Grey Areas." As it now stands, all the Clubs belonging to the State Council honor each Associations boundaries and these boundaries will be reviewed each year.

It was discussed to have a Joint Whirling" (to us, it would be the same as a Stampede Dance) with SCVDA. It was agreed upon to have the Vice Presidents of each Association as Committee Heads and they are to report back: If, when and where! So now it is up to George and Lou Freeman - and - Ron and Darlene Skidmore to let us know their plans.

Keith Marcuson gave a talk on trying to get the square dance recognized as the American Folk Dance. He has asked all Legionnaires to wear their American Legion Pin on their Club Badge, and for all square dancers to contact your nearest American Legion Post and see what we can do as two organizations working together for the one purpose in mind - have the square dance as our National Dance. Actually, the first square dance ever recorded was on March 19, 1651.

With no other business brought up at this time, the meeting was adjourned.

ROUND-UP CORNER by DON & BETTE BOWLEY

The Parade Committee met the other night and it sounds like we are all in for a big and wonderful parade.

The trophies were discussed and pictures of them were shown, and they are really nice! Each Club who enters into the parade will receive a little "something" and from this year on - "things" will be added to it. This award will be able to show the Club's participation in the parade and will not clutter up the Banners. So come on and get your club on the Band Wagon so you will have something new on your Banner.

Some of the entrance applications are coming in already. As of the Round-Up Parade meeting, the Twelfth District Military Band, Encinal High School Band, San Alacosta Civil Air Patrol and Twelfth District Military Color Guard have entered. Sounds like a good start to me!

This year our Memorial Parade will be dedicated to "Gary Meridith and To All Who Have Lost Their Lives For Our Country." Gary is the son of one of the couples of Strolling Eights who were our Decoration Chairman for our Round-Up in 1965. Gary gave his life fighting in Vietnam for what he believed in on January 2, 1968.

On July 3, 1967, Gary wrote a letter to his parents while he was completing his training as a Navy Corpsman at Oak Knoll Naval Hospital. He sealed it and gave it to his father asking that it be opened only in case of his death. It was opened on Fri. Jan. 5, 1968. On Nov. 10, 1967, Gary left his parents and brothers for Vietnam. He was attached to the 2nd Battalion, 5th Regiment of the 1st Marine Division. His remains were returned to them on Jan. 13, 1968.

Here are some of the excerpts of his original letter:

"Dear Folks:

When you read this I will be dead. I will have died without any fear of what is to come and I will have died doing what I think is more important than living. That being fighting for my country and its ideas. I died trying to bring the world to a state which is free and safe for others in the hopes that they will not have to go through what I have been through.

I know that my death was a great shock to you and Janeen and others close to me, but I want you to know that it was expected by me and I was willing to accept it if it happened. For I have had a good life with my two families (Janeen's and mine) in the greatest country this world has ever seen. A country in which the people are, and always will be free, as they were meant to be. This is something that is the greatest gift of all in this world today. I am proud to say that I (Gary Meridith) died fighting for his country's ideas and beliefs and for the freedom of the generation to come and continue our GREATNESS.

I sincerely hope that Gene and Greg will never have to experience what I have in order to feel this way toward their country."

"Maybe I have died at a young age but I died with definite beliefs and am not sorry for standing up and fighting for them. Someday all of us will be together again and then for eternity. I send my love to you all and say "Be proud, not sorry, for it was for his country - the greatest country and the greatest people ever."

Good bye to all of you,
Gary"

Parts of the letter which were to the family were left out, but with strong beliefs like these in our hearts and knowing that all our boy's who fight and die for our country feel the same way—let's make this the best parade. Let's show the world, as Square Dancers, what we can do. Let's enter our floats, cars and etc., in the parade for a good and worthy cause —
