AMERICAN LEGION JUBILEE

A National American Folk Dance, THE AMERICAN SQUARE DANCE, to coincide with and to be celebrated with THE GOLDEN JUBILEE OF THE AMERICAN LEGION in 1969. Beautiful words. A commendable goal.

Webster's Dictionary defines coordination, a noun, as (1) coordinating or being coordinated. (2) . . . harmonious adjustment or functioning, as the muscles in producing complex movements. Webster defines program, a noun, as (1) a proclamation, . . . (2) a list of events . . . (3) a plan.

Any Square Dancer or Legionnaire who doubts that we need a COORDINATED PROGRAM either does not understand the GOAL or is not concerned. We will definitely need a coordinated, harmonious adjustment or functioning, as the muscles in producing complex movements, to meet our proclamation of coming events to make a success of our plan.

1. The American Legion is not involved in this program. NOT YET!

2. Square Dance Councils of Associations are not involved in this program. NOT YET!

The American Legion and the Square Dance Councils are merely organizations that exist at and for the convenience of the MEMBERS. Elected officials, senior members of vast experience, have granted Square Dancers and Legionnaires permission to expand this Program, so long as nothing detrimental to either group is performed. To date, we have not received one, not one little old complaint.

BUT WHAT ARE YOU DOING? West Valley Post 158 has received many letters saying "We support you." a few letters saying "What can we do?"; and even fewer letters saying "We are doing this or we are doing that!"

Valley Associated Square Dancers and 14th District Legionnaires are different. These two organizations became acquainted as many of you observed at the 11th Annual CROSS ROADS SQUAR-RAMA, Fresno, 23,

24, 25 of February. Also, the 3rd Area, Department of California, presented this PROGRAM to Legionnaires in Stockton on 25 February. The 13th District is sponsoring the Caller for the Santa Clara Valley Whirling on 31 March. In return, SCV Square Dancers put on exhibition "FUN" dancing at Legion Posts, so that Legionnaires can observe and evaluate the AMERICAN SQUARE DANCE.

The named organizations have taken action! They have ideas, they are working. Let us hear what the rest of you are doing. The 13th District will push this PROGRAM at the Department Convention in Fresno in June, but we need the consolidated efforts and reports from everyone NOW.

What do square dancers do at a National Convention? First, they attend it and that is when the real fun starts (and unfortunately is brought to a close three short days later). To give you a little insight on what to expect in Omaha June 20-21-22, here is what might be called a typical day.

Beginning at 9 a.m. and continuing for two hours, a selection of panels is programmed. They are designed to be interesting, educational and present the trends of today's square dancing. Voice clinics for callers, gags, games and gimmicks, sewing panels and style shows are a few of the many panels that are scheduled.

At noon, square dancing and round dancing begin in different halls. In one hall a workshop goes on for those who wish to learn new square dance figures. In another hall challenge square dancing is featured. In still another hall, round dance workshops and clinics are taking place.

At 1:00 p.m. contra dancing joins into the bustle of activity. It is broken down to an hour of basics, an hour of workshop, and an hour of advanced contra dancing.
