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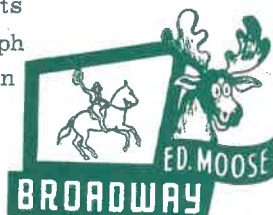

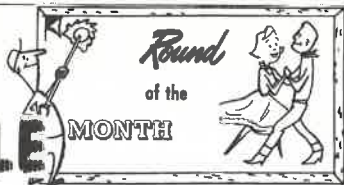

1-4 In Open pos facing LOD wait 2 meas; Do a standard (2 meas) acknow-
ledgment ending in Open pos facing LOD to start Dance;

Meas DANCE

(Open) FWD TWO-STEP; FWD TWO-STEP; (Scis away) SIDE, CLOSE, CROSS,-;

(Hitch) APART, CLOSE, TOG (to Bjo-Butterfly),-;

1-2 In Open pos start on M's L and do 2 fwd two-steps LOD;

3 Retaining hand hold step away from partner (swd) on L, close R, cross
L over R (both XIF) to face partner, hold 1 ct;

4 Still retaining hand hold step bwd away from partner on R, close L, fwd
twd partner on R, hold while blending to Banjo-Butterfly pos (M face wall);

BANJO AROUND, 2, 3,-; AROUND, 2, 3 (face),-; (Bfly Hitch) APART, CLOSE, TOG,-;

(Scis Thru) SIDE, CLOSE, THRU (to Open),-;

5-6 Starting on M's L and both moving fwd rotate around each other in 6 steps
L, R, L, hold; R, L, R, hold (End in Butterfly pos M facing wall);

7 Hold hands and hitch apart on L, close R, step together on L, hold 1 ct;

8 Step swd RLOD on R, close L, cross thru twd LOD on R (both XIF) to Open
pos, hold 1 ct;

(Open) FWD TWO-STEP; FWD TWO-STEP; (Scis away) SIDE, CLOSE, CROSS,-;

(Hitch) APART, CLOSE, TOG (to Bjo-Butterfly),-;

9-12 Repeat the action of Meas 1 thru 4;

BANJO AROUND, 2, 3,-; AROUND, 2, 3 (face),-; (Bfly Hitch) APART, CLOSE, TOG,-;

(Scis Thru) SIDE, CLOSE, THRU (to Open),-;

13-16 Repeat the action of Meas 5 thru 8;

DIP FWD,-, RECOV,-; (Hitch) BACK, CLOSE, FWD,-; TURN (Bk-to-Bk),-, TURN

(On around),-; (RLOD in Bfly) SIDE, CLOSE, SIDE,-;

17 In Open pos dip fwd LOD on L, hold, recover bwd on R, hold;

18 Hitch bwd RLOD on L, close R, fwd L, hold 1 ct;

19 Step fwd on R while turning back-to-back (leave L in place), hold, recover
on L while turning around (M L-fc, W R-fc) to face RLOD, hold
and take L-Open pos; (Similar to military turn, "To Rear March".)

20 Moving RLOD face partner in Butterfly pos step swd R, close L, swd R,
hold 1 ct;

(Bfly-Hitch) APART, CLOSE, TOG,-; (Scis thru) SIDE, CLOSE, THRU,-; (Vine)
SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE, THRU (to Open); (slow) FWD,-, 2,-;

21 In Butterfly pos retain hand holds and step apart on L, close R, fwd L,
hold 1 ct;

22 Step swd RLOD on R, close L, cross thru twd LOD on R (both XIF), hold;

23 Release trailing hand and do an "open" grapevine swd LOD on L, cross R
in back (both XIB) opening out slightly, face and step swd L, cross thru
twd LOD on R (both XIF) and blend to Open pos facing LOD;

24 In Open pos walk fwd LOD 2 slow steps L,-, R,-;

DANCE GOES THRU THREE TIMES

Ending: FWD TWO-STEP; FWD TWO-STEP; (Scis away) SIDE, CLOSE, CROSS,-;
APART, CLOSE, POINT,-;

1-3 Complete third time thru routine then again do the first 3 meas of Dance;

4 Keeping hand hold step apart on R (M twd COH), close L, point R twd
partner and hold as music ends;

'President's Message'

This month, our President, Walt Tupitza, held the general meeting at Washington School in Alameda in honor to all the President's of our clubs in the Association. It was a pleasant sight to see so many dancers out and the square dancing that was done after the meeting was a lot of fun too, not forgetting the tap-notch caller, George Dreier. I really don't know who had the most fun, George or the dancers!

Walt also announced that all the club banners should be brought to the next general meeting so that they may be hung up in the Auditorium for the Round-Up in May. So keep your Delegate on his toes and make sure he brings your banner to the meeting. The banner should be in a case for protection (of some kind), and be sure you have your identification on the case.

Club participation was encouraged by our President. The Club that works together - has more fun together - and stays together. So be sure your club takes an active part in the Round-Up. We have the Parade on Saturday, many clubs are entering floats, some cars. Just anything so the club is represented. Saturday night we have the Grand March - try to have as many club members there in their club dresses. Sunday morning is the breakfast, again your club can make representation. For the clubs who have couple's or single's that like to work individually, we have the Reception and Registration Committee at the Round-Up who need people to help them. So, you see, there is plenty of work for everyone!

Under new business Walt introduced all the President's, and thanked them for coming, emphasizing that our Association is not the Association Officers, it is the Club Members that make the Association. Our group is as strong as our weakest link - we must build at the club level. We must follow up with support. We need leaders with gentle hands, but firm hands. You, (the Presidents) were voted upon by your club to lead them. Are you really up to the task?

Are you afraid to follow through with your ideas? Are you afraid of what the minority might say? No doubt the majority railroaded you into your office, it's your turn, therefore, you have no choice! Because you lack experience, you ask yourself questions - How do I hire a caller? - How do I fire one? - How do I get someone else to take over?

It is very important to schedule your time so it doesn't interfere with your family life. Ask yourself, what sort of leadership are you really giving? Sometimes a strong man emerges, what then? No one officer should try to be a superman. Sometimes the formation of cliques can kill a club. It does require that they work together. Your club's Delegate is vital to your strength and to the Association. Most Delegate terms are for 6 months and then your club elects a new one and you have to start all over again. Our President urged all to go back to their clubs and see if their by-laws can be changed so the Delegates term would coincide with the term of the Association Officers. By doing this, a lot of work would be relieved from the Secretary by changing the Delegates name and addresses all the time. Look over your shoulder and see that your Delegate is working. If you see something working in your District, bring it back to the meeting and let us know about it. The 4-D meetings are where your club Delegate makes recommendations. If your club has problems why not discuss them. The other clubs may have had the same problem and can help you straighten them out. We do not dictate to the clubs. Think it over. We can't force you or even try to.

Does your club take part in the jobs of the Association? We have the best Association in the State. If there should be a time where the Association could help your club they would be glad to after a request from your club is made. We can suggest and we could be your umpire. We like to help where we can. School costs - we try to help keep the costs down, we have not always won, but we have tried.

We need cooperation with the Area Dancers, Anniversary Dances - participate! Help the little clubs out and attend all the Association meetings.

Membership Cards - In August at our next Stampede each dancer must have one card per person to get in. Each card will be sold by the Delegate of their club for \$1.00 per

person. So make sure you get your Membership Card so you can attend. Delegates, be sure your cards and money from the last Stampede have been turned in to Stitt Pool so you will be eligible to receive more. The Levis & Laces announce that they now have the Buckskin. It sure seems as though District 5 is really bound and determined to keep it moving. It's really been fun having guests come and try to take the banner away. So, who is going to be the next one to get it? I bet a lot of clubs will be going after it now with the Round-Up around the corner just so it can be hung up by their banner.

Well, this is about all the news for now and I'll be dancing with you at the Round-Up. Be sure to get your best bib and tucker on and I'll meet you in the big town of Oakland - that is if I don't see you in Alameda at the big parade, on my way to Oakland.

Oh yes, for the clubs who want club pictures - we will have a new photographer this year, Harry Cullum, at the Round-Up, and he said he would be glad to take club pictures as well as individual ones. So with bib and tucker, we need a smile too . . . See you at the Round-Up?
