LET'S TALK ABOUT IT!!!

Let us try something. Let us present some topics for discussion in the next few issues of this journal with the hope that readers will respond in care of the Editor. After there has been some reader reaction, or lack thereof, we'll present these assorted points of view. Where this feature will go is anybody's guess.

To begin: Every square dancer who has been through a beginners class has been informed as how to dress for the activity: full skirt and flat shoes for the ladies, and shirts with long sleeves for the men. Of course, we refer to our hobby as being "Western"; therefore, it is not long before many are attired in so-called "cowboy" dress with boots to match. Speaking of "match," we sometimes have matched outfits with the man wearing a shirt or vest of the same material as the lady's dress. For those who begin to take leadership roles in our activity, the advent of custom-made costumes is not uncommon. One need only look out upon a festival dance floor to see the wide range of beautiful and unique dress available.

However, there seem to be four groups of people who do not fall into the general pattern. First, there is the dancing couple which never acquires colorful western dress and continues to look like folks at their first night at a beginners class—though they may have been dancing around for several years. Second, there is the veteran couple of many years which dresses in muted shades of dull colors or black trying to be as formal as possible. Third, there is the caller-couple which dresses to the point of Hollywood guilt and glamour like exotic gods to be admired by all. Fourth, and this might be the sore point, there is the caller, caller-couple, or leader, leader-couple, which is noted for its sloppyness. The person who shows up for dances or festivals in non-square dancing attire, or what is worse, in some kind of sloppy dress that isn't even acceptable in any kind of public social situation.

When one is in a square dance class or a member of an experienced club, one is advised by either the caller or the club leader as to the appropriate and acceptable dress

and general physical condition. But, what of the old-line experienced dancer or the established caller? Who does what to suggest or encourage these people to present themselves in the most favorable manner for the square dance activity? How should a club president present himself at a public dance? How should a caller present himself at any kind of public square dance function? Does it matter whether or not said person is on the program or regularly presented? What obligation does a leader have to the square and round dance movement as a whole? Is an individual's personal freedom abridged if he is told how to dress or conduct himself if he is in a leadership capacity? Who is to say what to whom?

More or less as an aside, and in conclusion, it must be stated that some national square dance journals have already raised the question of the way in which some "national" callers appear before square dancers at functions dressed in simple "civilian" suits. The question raised is, "How can they call to "Western" dancers dressed in Eastern business suits?"

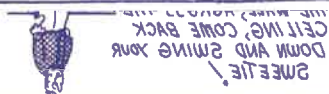

HOT LIPS

RECORD: "Hot Lips" - Decca 29558

POSITION: Semi-closed, facing LOD

FOOTWORK: Opposite, with M starting on L. Directions for M

MEAS:

- 1-4 TWO-STEP; TWO-STEP; SIDE, BEHIND; SIDE, FWD;
Two fwd two-steps in LOD; M drops R hand from W's waist leaving his L and her R hands joined for a grapevine: Step L to side along LOD, pivoting almost to face RLOD, Step R behind L; Step L to side turning to face partner, cross R in front of L along LOD and take semi-closed pos. (This is a plain grapevine with a little more styling.)
- 5-8 TWO-STEP; TWO-STEP; SIDE, BEHIND; SIDE, FACE;
Repeat Meas 1-4, ending in closed pos, M's back to COH.
- 9-12 SIDE, STEP-STEP; AMAY, STEP-STEP; FACE, STEP-STEP; AMAY, STEP-STEP;
In closed pos, M facing wall: Step L to side along LOD, step R beside L, step L in place; (M takes R hand from W's waist leaving his L & W's R hands joined) Turning R to face RLOD (W turns L), step R twd COH slightly away from partner, step L beside R, step R in place; Then, touching palms of free hands and giving each other a little push: Step L to face wall and partner, step R beside L, step L in place; Again, step R slightly away from partner, facing RLOD, step L beside R, step R in place. (Phythm for all of Meas 9-12 is slow, quick, quick.)
- 13-16 WALK, 2; 3, PIVOT; SIDE, STEP-STEP; FACE, STEP-STEP;
Facing RLOD, M's L & W's R hands joined, walk fwd 4 steps RLRL, pivoting on the 4th step to face LOD and join inside hands (M's R & W's L); Step L to side twd COH away from partner, step R beside L, step L in place; Step R to face wall and partner, step L beside R, step R in place, assuming closed pos, M facing wall.
- 17-20 TWO-STEP FWD; TWO-STEP BACK; TWO-STEP FWD; TWO-STEP AROUND;
M two-steps fwd on L (W two-steps back on R); M drops R hand from W's waist but still holds her R hand in his L & both two-step back away from each other; TAMARA STEP: W places L hand behind her back so that palm is out and near R hip and two-steps fwd on R, M two-steps fwd on L so R hips are adjacent and as he does so, he places his R hand in the L hand of partner (M's L & W's R hands held high: Releasing M's L & W's R hands and keeping other joined hands low, do a two-step turning to M's R & W's L to face partner again. (M is now facing COH, W facing wall.)
- 21-24 TWO-STEP FWD; TWO-STEP AROUND; WALK, 2; 3, TURN;
Repeat the Tamara Step with M facing COH and W facing wall: This time, M places his L hand behind his back with palm out and near R hip and two-steps fwd on L, W two-steps fwd on R so R hips are adjacent and places her R hand in M's L with bther joined hands (M's R & W's L) held high; Releasing M's R & W's L hands, to a two-step turning to face RLOD (M turns L, W turns R); with inside hands joined (M's L, W's R) walk 4 steps in RLOD, pivoting in twd partner on 4th step to face LOD, assuming Varsouviana pos.
- 25-28 TWO-STEP FWD; TWO-STEP FWD; WALK, 2; 3, 4; (W - free twirl)
Both do 2 fwd two-steps in LOD; Then M Walks fwd 4 steps RLRL while W does one free turn (R-face) in 4 steps RLRL to reassume Vars pos. facing LOD.
- 29-32 TWO-STEP FWD; TWO-STEP FWD; WALK, 2; 3, 4; (W - free twirl)
Repeat Meas 25-28, but end in semi-closed pos, facing LOD to repeat dance.

DANCE IS DONE 3 TIMES PLUS ENDING

ENDING: Repeat Meas. 1-16 and end with slow twirl and bow.
