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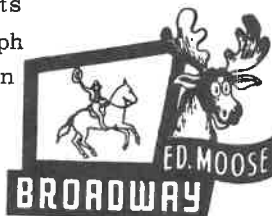

- 1 - 4 WAIT; WAIT; APART, TCH, -; TOG, TCH, -;
 In Open-fcg M fcg wall wait 2 meas;; Step apart on L, tch R to L, -; Step tog on R, tch L to R, -;

PART A

- 1 - 4 WALTZ AWAY; WALTZ TOG (Bfly); SIDE, DRAW, CLOSE; SIDE, DRAW, CLOSE (CP);
 Turn to OP fcg LOD & waltz fwd & slightly away from ptr L, R, L; Waltz fwd & slightly twd ptr R, L, R to end in BFLY M fcg wall; step swd LOD on L, draw R twd L, close R to L; Step swd L, draw R twd L, close R to L blending to CP M fcg wall;
- 5 - 8 DIP BK, -; MANUV, 2, 3; R TURN WALTZ; W TWIRL, 2, 3, (OP);
 In CP dip bwd twd COH on L, -; Step fwd twd wall on R turning 1/4 RF, swd to wall on L, close R to L; Do 1 RF turning waltz L, R, L; M waltzes fwd R, L, R in LOD (as W does 1 RF twirl under joined lead hands) to end in Open-fcg M fcg wall;
- 9 - 16 WALTZ AWAY; WALTZ TOG (Bfly); SIDE, DRAW, CLOSE; SIDE, DRAW, CLOSE (CP); DIP BK, -; MANUV, 2, 3; R TURN WALTZ; W TWIRL, 2, 3, (OP);
 Repeat action of Meas 1-8 -- EXCEPT -- end in OP fcg LOD.

- 17 - 20 FWD WALTZ; TWINKLE LOD, 2, 3; TWINKLE RLOD, 2, 3; (SCP) FWD, TCH, -;
 In OP waltz fwd LOD L, R, L; Step fwd R, swd LOD on L, close R to L; Step thru twd RLOD on L, swd RLOD R, close L to R; Turn to SCP step fwd LOD on R, tch L to R, 1;
- 21 - 24 (OP) STEP, SWING, -; SPIN MANUV, 2, 3(CP); R TURN WALTZ; R TURN WALTZ (SCP);
 Blend to OP at same time step diag fwd & away from ptr on L, swing R fwd & slightly in front of L, -; M leads W into a spot LF spin as he maneuvers R, L, R to CP M fcg RLOD; Do 2 RF turning waltzes down LOD L, R, L; R, L, R to end in SCP fcg LOD;

 Do 1 RF turning waltz L, R, L; M waltz fwd R, L, R (as W does 1 RF twirl under joined lead hands) to end in Open-fcg M fcg wall;

DANCE GOES THRU 2 TIMES, then ENDING.

ENDING

- 1 - 4 WALTZ AWAY; WALTZ TOG; TWIRL VINE, 2, 3; THRU, SIDE, CLOSE; ACK.
 Repeat action of Meas 1-2 to end in momentary BFLY; M vines LOD L, R, L (as W does 1 RF twirl under M's L & W's R hands); In Bfly step thru LOD on R, step swd LOD on L fcg ptr & wall, close R to L; Release lead hands & step bwd on L twd COH (W bwd on R twd wall), & acknowledge.

LET'S TALK ABOUT IT

Last month we presented the question of how a caller or square dance leader should dress at a public function. Publication deadlines being what they are, it is too early to have received any reader response. Let us present a different topic for consideration this month.

There are two major square dancing associations servicing the area of Northern California: the Dancers Association and the Callers Association. While our topic for discussion will be addressed to these two major groups, it is certainly recognized that there also exist local organizations such as the ones for the Santa Clara Valley and Marin County. Such local area organizations no doubt serve well to handle local area problems and will continue to operate as long as local problems exist.

The major question is: "Why is it necessary for there to be a DANCERS and a CAL-

TERS separate organization?" There are some areas in our country where they have only a Square Dancing Association which includes not only square dance clubs and callers, but also unattached individual dancers. In such areas there is never a problem of who can attend what dance on a fifth Saturday, or which group is responsible for the production of the annual festival, or which group receives whatever profit there might be. Nor, is there a question of which caller might be acceptable for festival calling depending upon his club affiliation.

It certainly must be recognized that the two existing associations have been co-operating and working jointly these past years in almost every area of square and round dancing with considerable success, but there have been conflicts of interest at times; conflicts which would not have occurred if the two associations had been one.
