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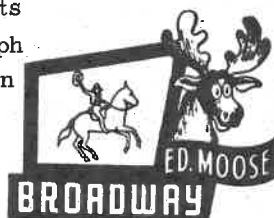

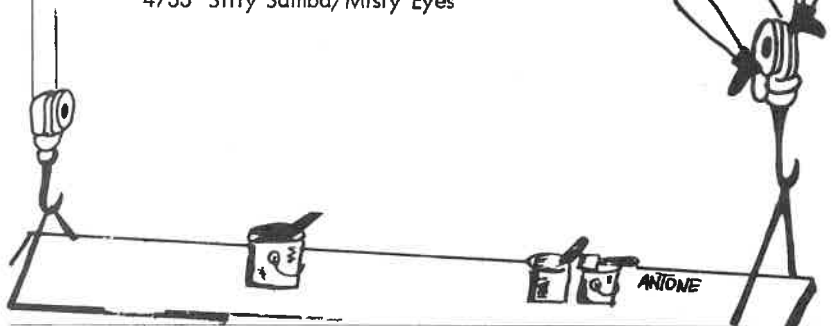

LET'S TALK ABOUT IT !!

Anne & Bill Jonas

Two topics have been presented in this space for the last two issues: Callers and Leaders dress while attending public functions, and, the question of some type of amalgamation of the DANCERS and CALLERS groups. So far, there hasn't been too much serious reaction. (Some wag wrote in to say that callers shouldn't bother to dress at all, but we hope he was kidding.

In the past few years school auditoriums have been harder and harder to get for square and round dancing. Facilities which were once free are now costing from \$10 to \$25 per night, and some school districts have closed their schools altogether as far as adult dancers are concerned. Recreation Departments which once gave nods of blessing now set up rules and regulations which inhibit the normal growth of a square dance class or a regular club organization. More often than not, an eight or ten week session

is considered the time set aside for any kind of Recreation Department sponsored activity and we know that Square Dancing doesn't fit this mold.

Perhaps it is time to consider the acquisition or construction of regular square and round dance halls to be owned on a corporation basis by the dancing members at large through the distribution of stock shares. It does seem likely that a "corporation" would be needed to produce the money necessary for a start because, with today's high prices, an individual could not afford such a venture. On such a share basis, a dancing couple could invest as much or as little as could be afforded. While certain building sites may be too expensive and construction costs more than somewhat high, there are unused lofts, warehouses, and former supermarkets available for a small investment. On a co-operative basis, remodeling to dance hall status could be a fine undertaking.
