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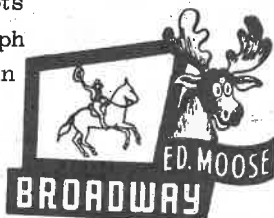

LET'S TALK ABOUT IT

anne & Bill Jonas



Far too many are saying that they are in a state of confusion when certain combination figures are called; that is, those figures or calls which incorporate some kind of combination of already established basic movements to make a "call": BARGE equals a square thru plus a pass thru and a type of U-Turn-Back. Many have expressed a desire of having certain major directional basics presented at a Saturday hoedown so that the dancers can enjoy themselves without too much of a challenge evening. It has also been expressed that certain "fun level" dances be held with a big assortment of callers; that is, callers from the floor.

CALLERS FROM THE FLOOR type of hoedowns present a problem to the major host caller and the sponsoring club. Several things can happen: so many callers show up that the host caller must ask his colleagues to split tips which result in uneven programs; new callers are placed in juxtaposition with experienced callers so that each detracts from the other to the detriment of the dancers enjoyment; or, so few guest callers attend that the dancers are disappointed as to the evening's program.

It has been suggested by some dancers and some callers that clubs entertain the idea of having "FUN LEVEL" dances from time to time with an assortment of guest callers with their own club caller as the leading master of ceremonies. It would be his responsibility to invite a definite number of callers to attend the dance and call a

fun level tip with the idea that they would individually be paid some kind of courtesy fee for their time and effort. This would insure a balanced evening of programmed dancing and would make it reasonably worth-while for a visiting caller to attend.

Such a dance would not necessarily be a BEGINNERS HOEDOWN with the usual "callers-from-the-floor," but would be at such a level to insure total enjoyment for the average club level dancer. It would be understood that clubs and callers would still be free to have the usual open beginners hoedowns in the fall and early spring to give the newer dancers an opportunity of getting into hoedown dancing. However, the aforementioned FUN LEVEL dances with an assortment of callers would provide a great opportunity of the vast majority of square dancers to enjoy an evening's square dancing without being challenged all night.

While there has not been much mail responding to the recent articles appearing in this space, there has been a great deal of personal talk. Folks have approached us at a number of hoedowns to discuss topics and subjects which concern them. While our assorted topics of leadership, public dress, and association amalgamation hasn't brought too much to light, there have been questions and problems.

High on the list is the subject of new basics and/or new figure movements. There seems to be an unusual assortment of BARGE FIGURES which tend to confuse the dancers.
