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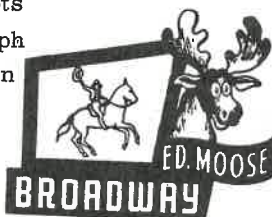

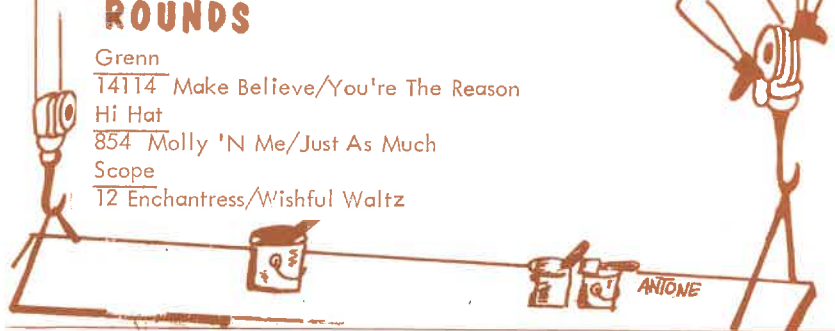

LET'S TALK ABOUT IT

It was not intended that you readers become confused reading this page last month. As a matter of fact, we had to read it twice ourselves to figure what was wrong. It was just a case of the printer putting the first one and a half paragraphs at the end of the article; otherwise, the message came through in a reasonable manner.

Once again, please permit us to thank all of you good people who have spoken to us at an assortment of square dance functions these past months. You may all rest assured that everything you say to us is taken into most careful consideration, and, we shall try to comment upon every subject raised. Talk to us or write to us; we will listen and read what you have to say. The voice of the dancer must be the voice of square dancing; otherwise, we won't have an activity at all!

The topic this month will be related to the topic of last month, to wit: "FUN LEVEL DANCING." Many dancers in Northern California have received a newsletter from the Edwards Record Service of Park Ridge, Illinois wherein the concept of fun level dancing is presented. For the benefit of those of you who did not receive this communication, we would like to present the main ideas.

1. Ten or fifteen years ago people could be taught to square dance by taking a course

of not more than fifteen weeks.

2. Such classes consisted of as much as twenty-five squares of folks who continued to dance for years on end.

3. Today's thirty to forty week course is lucky to get two or three squares of beginners; and, many of them fall by the wayside when they meet the challenge of learning new figures after graduation.

4. A program of 'easy level' dancing is proposed to take the place of the extended program which exists today.

5. It is proposed that some kind of National Committee be organized to set forth a basic program of teaching together with guides for a standard of fundamental basics to be used by fun level dancers after graduation. Such an organization might be called by the name of "SQUARES FOR FUN."

6. In no way should such a fun level group be in conflict with those dancers who might wish more challenging dancing.

If any of our readers wish to comment upon this proposition, their comments will be forwarded to the Illinois service mentioned above. For the purposes of "editorial" comment, we would like to say that we have always been in favor of fun level type dancing. As callers, we have tried to keep the squares moving and not stop the floor. As dancers we have never enjoyed standing around waiting for a Left Allemande.

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Dear Editor:

I would like to address this letter to the Northern California Square Dancer's Association, the Caller's Association, the clubs and the dancers of this area.

You have all heard the questions from time to time: "Where are the square dancers going?"... "Why are they dropping out of square dancing?" My wife and I have been square dancers for some time now, and we'd like to list a few reasons we feel dancers may be leaving square dancing and make some suggestions as to how all of us might help keep more dancers.

First, some of the reasons we may be losing square dancers. Did any of you attend the benefit dance and barbecue for Sparky Sparks at the Sonoma County Fairgrounds on Sunday, August 11, 1968? If you did, you found the floor had not been cleaned prior to the dance and it was like gum to dance on. Then the sound was anything but good. Many places you could not understand what the caller was calling and had to guess at it.

Beginning square dancers are counseled not to go to hoedowns until the caller tells them they are ready. Yet, at this dance we had many dancers on the floor who didn't know some of the very basic steps - do-sa-do, etc., - causing many of the squares to just stand for the whole tip. Some were even

wearing beginners badges. If they were there because of Sparky, then they should have stayed within their own group - not spoiled it for the more experienced dancers.

When a beginner class starts, lists of "do's and don'ts" are handed out, and one of these don'ts is "do not drink alcoholic beverages and then attend a dance. If it is not only unwise because of swings, etc., but it is offensive to some to have alcohol blown in their faces. Yet at this dance beer was being sold at the barbecue. Why?

And whoever was it who schedules a square dance on the same day and at the same place as 6000 Jehovah Witnesses were holding a conference - right on the fairgrounds. Or didn't they know dancing is against the religion of the Jehovah Witnesses?

But, let's go on to some other things that may cause the loss of dancers: things such as the club where the members dance as cliques, both in their club and when out visiting other clubs. Then there is the club where at the start of every tip someone seems to be checking his watch to see how much time is left to dance before they can all meet at the local bar. Do they really want to dance? Or the club which vanishes into the coffee room between each tip - and even during the tips - leaving the guest dancers sitting alone in the hall?

Then there's the big dance some club is holding. You're standing in line to pay your fee, when in comes some loud mouth yelling at the top of his voice to let you know that HE'S arrived and "why aren't they dancing?" and all the time he's crowding in ahead of everyone to the head of the line to pay his fee first.

To summarize the above: poor floors; bad sound; selling tickets to anyone for a dance, whether he can dance or not; if we are going to make rules to follow, let's make them for all, not just a few; cliques in clubs; worrying about bar time; poor scheduling of dances - all of these things help to lose dancers, and none of them is beyond curing.

A committee to see that the floor is clean before a dance; sound problems can be corrected (or helped) in most buildings unless it's a real "dog" of a building with wooden walls and ceiling; admittance to dances with regular club badges, unless it is a beginners dance; rules for all to follow, with no exceptions; do some checking before scheduling a dance so as not to conflict with another group which you might offend; the club caller can do a lot to stop cliques (mix up the floor after squares are formed, etc.). Cliques are not only poor taste and manners, but make for poor dancers, too. Brush up on individual manners and etiquette.

We'd like to suggest another idea that may cause the loss of members - summer vacations!

During the months of June, July and August, we have many members who go on vacation but do not keep up with their square dancing during that time. Yet during this period we still have new square dance figures being introduced by the Associations. Then in the Fall when these people come back to dancing they find there are a number of steps they do not know. These dancers may not be strong dancers to begin with, and after trying to get the

new figures in the first or second try, they give up and start staying home, until they are so far behind in dancing they never come back.

Why not just review figures taught during the past 9 months presenting many patterns and dances using these known calls? "Styling" (not fanciness-but just ease and grace in dancing) could be worked on, too. I think it would be worth a try to see if this would not slow down the Fall loss of dancers.
