Position: Open-Facing for Intro, Closed pos M facing wall for Dance.

Footwork: Opposite, Directions for M except where noted.

INTRO: WAIT; WAIT; APART, -, POINT, -; TOG (to CP), -, TOUCH, -;

- 1-4 In Open-Facing pos with M facing wall wait 2 meas; Step apart on L, hold 1 ct, point R twd partner, hold 1 ct; Step twd partner on R, hold 1 ct, blend to Closed pos with M's back to COH and touch L, hold 1 ct;

PART A

Meas
(Broken Box) SIDE, CLOSE, FWD, -; ROCK FWD, -, REC, -; SIDE, CLOSE, BACK, -; ROCK BACK, -, REC, -;

- 1 In Closed pos step swd LOD on L, close R to L, fwd L, hold 1 ct;
- 2 Rock fwd twd wall on R, hold 1 ct, recover on L, hold 1 ct
- 3 Step swd RLOD on R, close L to R, bwd on R, hold 1 ct;
- 4 Rock bwd twd COH on L, hold 1 ct, recover on R, hold 1 ct;

(Scis Thru) SIDE, CLOSE, CROSS (L-Open), -; SIDE, CLOSE, CROSS (Thru to CP), -; VINE, 2, 3, 4 (to SCP); WALK, -, 2, - (to CP);

- 5 Step swd LOD on L, close R to L, cross thru twd RLOD on L (both XIF), blend to L-Open pos facing RLOD and hold 1 ct;
- 6 Face partner and step swd RLOD on R, close L to R, cross thru twd LOD on R (both XIF), blend to Closed pos M facing wall and hold 1 ct;
- 7 Vine LOD stepping swd L, cross R in back of L (both XIB), swd L, cross R in front of L (both XIF);
- 8 Blend to Semi-Closed pos and walk fwd LOD 2 slow steps L, -, R, - blending back to Closed pos to start over;

(Broken Box) SIDE, CLOSE, FWD, -; ROCK FWD, -, REC, -; SIDE, CLOSE, BACK, -; ROCK BACK, -, REC, -;

- 9-12 Repeat the action of Meas 1 thru 4;

(Scis Thru) SIDE, CLOSE, CROSS (L-Open), -; SIDE, CLOSE, CROSS (Thru to CP), -; VINE, 2, 3, 4 (to SCP); WALK, -, 2, - (to Bfly);

- 13-16 Repeat the action of Meas 5 thru 8 except end in Butterfly pos M facing wall;

PART B

(Bfly) SIDE, CLOSE, SIDE, TCH; SIDE, CLOSE, APART, LIFT; (Change sides) WRAP, 2, 3 (face), -; (Hitch apart) BACK, CLOSE, TOG, - (to Bfly); (Note: "Wrap" is modified.)

- 17 In Butterfly pos step swd LOD on L, close R to L, swd L, touch R;
- 18 Step swd RLOD on R, close L to R, keeping both hands joined step apart R, lift on R and point L toe twd partner;
- 19 Change sides with a "wrap action" stepping twd partner on L while starting to bring the joined M's L hand & W's R thru between partners and high and over W's head and other hands joined at waist level, fwd R passing on M's R side starting wrap motion with M turning R-face and W wrapping L-face, step fwd to face partner and drop M's R hand and W's L to take Left Open-Facing pos with M's back to wall (M's L hand and W's R still joined), hold 1 ct;
- 20 Hitch apart by stepping away from partner on R, close L to R, fwd R, hold 1 ct while blending to Butterfly pos (M's back to wall);

(Bfly) SIDE, CLOSE, SIDE, TCH; SIDE, CLOSE, APART, LIFT; (Change sides) WRAP, 2, 3 (face), -; (Hitch apart) BACK, CLOSE, TOG, - (to SCP); (Note: "Wrap" is modified)

- 21-24 Starting with Man outside repeat the action of Meas 17 thru 20 except end in Semi-Closed pos facing LOD;

(SCP) FWD TWO-STEP; FWD TWO-STEP; (CP) VINE, 2, 3, 4; PIVOT, -, 2, -;

- 25-26 In Semi-Closed pos start on M's L and do 2 fwd two-steps LOD;
- 27 Blend to Closed pos with M facing wall and vine LOD swd L, cross R behind L (both XIB), swd L, cross thru on R (both XIF);
- 28 Do a couple pivot LOD in 2 slow steps L, -, R, - and end in Closed pos with M facing wall;

(CP) TURN TWO-STEP; TURN TWO-STEP; TWIRL, -, 2, -; (SCP) WALK, -, 2, -;

- 29-30 In Closed pos do 2 turning two-steps LOD;
- 31 M walks fwd LOD 2 slow steps (L, -, R, -) as W twirls under joined lead hands;
- 32 Blend to Semi-Closed pos and walk fwd LOD 2 slow steps L, -, R, -;

DANCE GOES THRU TWICE (A-B-A-B)

Ending: (SCP) FWD TWO-STEP; FWD TWO-STEP; TWIRL, -, 2, -; APART, -, ACK, -; In Semi-Closed pos do 2 fwd two-steps LOD; W twirls as M walks fwd 2 slow steps (L, -, R, -); Step apart on L to face partner and acknowledge as music ends;

Food for thought. Any of you who are planning on going to the National Convention in Seattle next year had best be getting your application to the Housing Committee as they are rapidly running out of space. The SQUARENADERS and STARDETTES both hope to exhibit at the National next year. They have already sent in their application and money. There is some thought of chartering a train or busses. We'll keep you informed as to cost and other pertinent facts and if it looks feasible, we'll set up a committee to handle transportation bookings. Two pertinent points came out of our recent meeting with the Callers' Association - One, Principal Callers Stampede Passes. As many of you may not know, we send all Principal Callers a Pass to every Stampede. This is quite costly in printing and in postage. We intend to propose to our board a change in our policy following the November Stampede. Our proposal is that we will have Principal Caller Passes at the door of all Stampedes. We will also have a current Principal Callers List there and all a Caller need do is identify himself and if he is on the list he will be given a Pass. This will save a lot of cost and time. Also, we will be able to thank them in our following article for participating in our Stampedes with their dancers.

Another point was a question from a club to their Caller, how do we choose Anniversary and Stampede Callers? If this was a question from a Caller, I could see the reason for it. But, this was from a club so apparently some of our dancers need clarification. All of you have, or should have by now, returned your ballots for the Anniversary Dance. You, the Dancers, pick your Anniversary Callers. We covered this quite thoroughly in our September article. As for choosing of Stampede Callers, we have a

committee, chaired by the Vice Pres., who picks the in and out of area callers.

You may have noticed that our basics program has sort of slipped. After talking with the Callers' Association, it was decided our basics will return to their original format in the very near future.

The Callers' Association newer dancers' hoedown in Santa Rosa will be right across the street from our Stampede. This is unfortunate but, it was the only place they could get and we feel for a one time happening, we will make the most of it. For those of you who will have newer dancers dancing in Santa Rosa, the Callers' Association has said they will recognize the stub of your Stampede Card if you want to go across the street and have a tip with your newer dancers.

Let's all make an effort to attend our own dances,
