ABOUT IT

It may not seem appropriate to examine a possible gift at this time of year, but something is being offered to us which might prove to be in the company of the white elephant. We are speaking of the possibility of being verbally sponsored by that veterans organization known as the AMERICAN LEGION.

It seems that the AMERICAN LEGION is giving consideration to the idea of declaring square dancing as the "American Folk Dance." As we understand it, pressure would be brought to bear to have such a declaration made by Congress and possibly by the President. It is also proposed that the Post Office publish a commemorative stamp on behalf of square dancing. And, it is likely that AMERICAN LEGION halls be made available to square dancing at little or no fee. As a package this seems like a fine gift, indeed.

In examining this proposition we cannot deny how nice it would be to have use of additional halls and it would be just as nice to have a commemorative postage stamp, something that has been requested for several years by an assortment of square dance journals and organizations. As to some kind of national, official recognition of square dancing as a "national" dance is begging the question. Either it is or isn't or it's someplace in between, but a declaration doesn't make it one thing or another. As a matter of fact, the kind of square dancing we do today is only related to the early American barn dance square. No longer do we have only one active traveling couple, no longer do we do the assortment of ring and star figures, and no longer are we moving at the slower contra pace. Our grandparents would be at a loss trying to Wheel & Deal to a Dixie Daisy.

Furthermore, what of the Mexican Hat Dance of our Latin Citizens? the polkas of our Slavic Citizens? the quadrilles of our people of the bayou country? Are not these good American folk dances? By implication the square dance movement might offend more than it would encourage.

Now comes the hard part to write. The AMERICAN LEGION has come to be more than a veterans organization. It has become a pseudo-political pressure group which has had a recent history of supporting conservative causes on our political and social scene. The AMERICAN LEGION has gone on record as a militant supporter of the Viet Nam war, a cause which many Americans deplore. The AMERICAN LEGION has gone on record against most kinds of government social welfare programs, yet it has been the first to champion the special case of the military veteran. While some of our readers may agree with the stands of the AMERICAN LEGION, there are vast numbers of Americans who do not. It is most likely that we would all wish to shy away from an endorsement by the PEACE & FREEDOM PARTY. By this token, it must be more prudent to shy away from any kind of endorsement from any national-social-political group.

There is one more thing to be taken into consideration and that is the question of any kind of national or prestigious sponsorship. Should a national organization like the AMERICAN LEGION or a person like the President recommend square dancing, then there would be many who would join the activity, not because of a desire for the recreational activity, but because it was the current thing to do. We sincerely question such a mass joining of our movement.

Some of our friends who are golfers say that the whole game of golf has been ruined as a result of the popularity given it by the activities of former-President Eisenhower. What was once a quiet day on the links has become a day of "waiting-in-line" and a forced joining of a foresome when one wished to play alone. Fads come and go. Look at slot-car racing, steak pits, pizza parlors, skate-boards, and, very soon; family billiard rooms. About the only similar type of activity that has continued has been Bowling - and - this very much supported by great amounts of money, cocktail lounges, and refreshment counters. How much does it cost to bowl for three hours as compared

to the cost of square and round dancing for the same amount of time? If the time ever comes when square and round dancing becomes commercial, be prepared to pay like you have never paid before.

While the intent of the AMERICAN LE-GION for the greater good of square dancing is appreciated, we all should take a careful look at all that might result from such a "gift." Communications in this regard should be directed to your Dancer's Association and to the Caller's Association. Of course, we will accept anything sent to us in care of this magazine.

Everyone have a grand Yuletide Season and we shall all look forward to meeting you here when the new year rolls around.

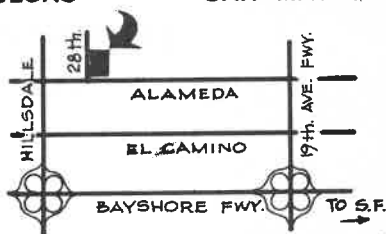
