RECORD: "Harvest Waltz" - MacGregor 5001A (Allegheny Moon)

POSITION: Open-Facing for Intro; As noted for Dance

FOOTWORK: Opposite; directions for M except as noted

MEASURES

INTRODUCTION

1 - 4 WAIT; WAIT; APART, POINT,-; TOGETHER (Bfly), TCH,-;

In Open-fcg M fcg wall & ptr M's R & W's L hands joined wait 2 meas;; Step apart on L, point R twd ptr,-; Step together on R assuming BFLY M fcg wall, tch L to R, -;

DANCE

1-4 FWD, PT,-; BWD (Bfly), TCH,-; FWD, PT,-; BWD (Bfly), TCH,-;

From Bfly release lead hands & swing trailing hands thru step fwd LOD on L, point R twd LOD,-; Step slightly bwd RLOD on R turning to face ptr & wall in BFLY, tch L to R,-; Repeat action of Meas 1 & 2;;

5-8 WALTZ AWAY; WALTZ TOGETHER (Bfly); SOLO WALTZ TURN, 2,3; ON AROUND, 2,3 (Bfly);

Release lead hands waltz fwd & away in LOD L,R,L; Waltz fwd & together R,L,R to end BFLY M fcg wall; Releasing hands ptrs do a solo waltz turn (M LF, W RF) down LOD L,R,L; R,L,R to end in BFLY M fcg wall;

9-16 FWD, PT,-; BWD (Bfly), TCH,-; FWD, PT,-; BWD (Bfly), TCH,-;

WALTZ AWAY; WALTZ TOGETHER (Bfly); SOLO WALTZ TURN, 2,3; ON AROUND, 2,3 (CP Mfcg wall);

Repeat action of Meas 1-8 --EXCEPT--end in CP Mfcg wall.

17-20 DIP BK,-,-; MANUV, 2,3; R TURNING WALTZ; R TURNING WALTZ (CP M fcg wall);

CP M fcg wall dip bwd twd COH on L,-,-; Do a 1/4 RF waltz maneuver R,L,R to end CP M fcg RLOD; Do 2 RF turning waltzes down LOD L,\$,L; R,L,R to end CP M fcg wall;

21-24 DIP BK,-,-; MANUV, 2,3; R TURNING WALTZ; R TURNING WALTZ (CP M fcg wall);

Repeat actions of Meas 17-20.

25-28 VINE, 2,3; FWD, PT,- (W twinkle, 2,3 to Bjo); BWD, PT,- (W twinkle, 2,3 to SCP); MANUV, 2,3 (CP);

Vine LOD swd L, XIB of L (W XIB); swd L turning to SCP fcg LOD; M step fwd R, point L fwd,- (W does a twinkle LOD turning to BJO L,R,L); M step bwd L, point R bwd,- (W does a twinkle RLOD turning to SCP R,L,R) to end in SCP fcg LOD; M maneuver R,L,R to end CP fcg RLOD (W takes steps almost in place);

29-32 R TURNING WALTZ; R TURNING WALTZ (face wall); R TWIRL VINE, 2,3; THRU, TCH,-;

CP M fcg RLOD do 2 RF turning waltzes down LOD L,R,L; R,L,R to end CP M fcg wall; M vines LOD L,R,L (W does 1 RF twirl under joined lead hands); Step fwd LOD on R to BFLY, tch L to R,-;

DANCE IS DONE A TOTAL OF TWO TIMES

ENDING: Replace Meas 31-32 the second time thru with: TWIRL, 2, APART; ACK,-,-;

On Meas 31 M steps fwd L,R turning to face ptr (W does RF twirl), step apart on L (W on R); Meas 32 point R twd ptr with M's R & W's L hands joined -,-.

given at the Crystal Springs Rehabilitation Center.

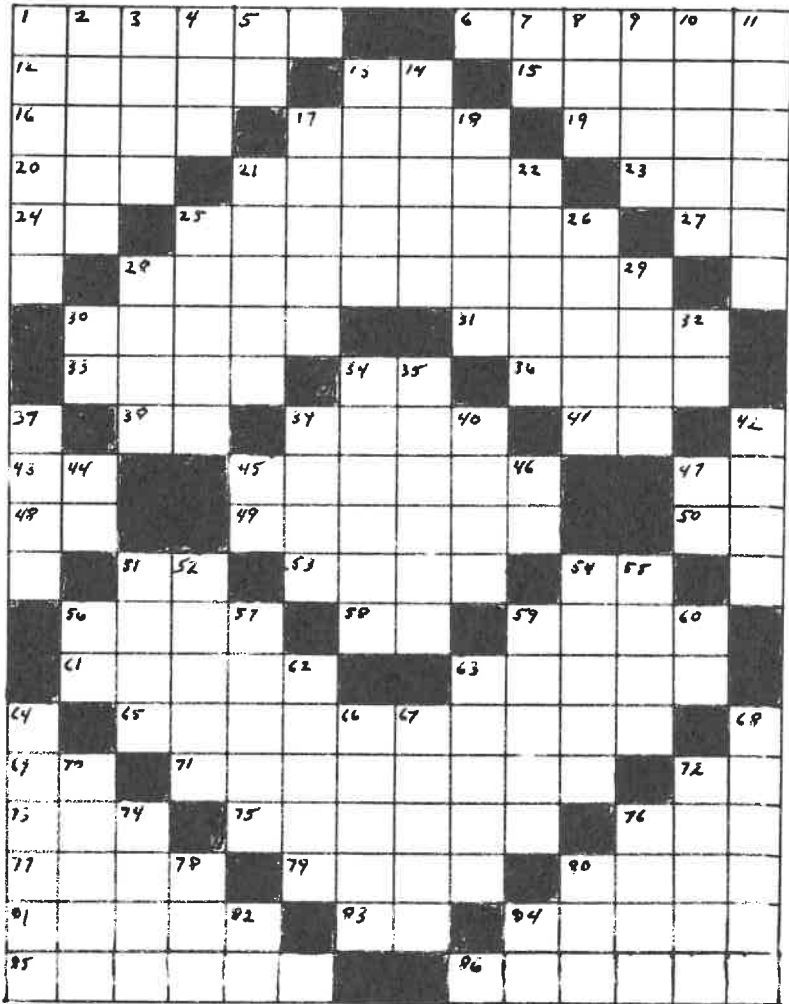
