Record: HI-HAT 854

Dick Cary Band

Position: Open-Facing for Intro, Semi-Closed for Dance.
Footwork: Opposite, Directions for M except where noted.

Meas

INTRO: WAIT; WAIT; APART, -, POINT, -; TOGETHER, -, (SCP) TOUCH, -;

1-2 Wait 2 meas in Open-Facing pos with M's R hand and W's L joined;

3 Step apart on L, hold 1 ct, point R twd partner, hold 1 ct;

4 Step together on R, hold 1 ct, touch L to R while blending to Semi-Closed pos facing LOD, hold 1 ct;

DANCE

(SCP) FWD TWO-STEP; FWD TWO-STEP; WALK, -, 2, -; (Pickup) 3, -, 4, -;

1-2 In Semi-Closed pos start on M's L and do 2 fwd two-steps LOD;

3-4 Walk 4 slow steps LOD picking up W to Closed pos on 3rd step (M still face LOD);

(Scis) SIDE, CLOSE, CROSS, -; (Scis thru) SIDE, CLOSE, THRU, -; TURN TWO-STEP; TURN TWO-STEP (to SCP);

5 Step swd COH on L, close R to L, cross L in front of R (W XIB), hold 1 ct;

6 Step swd twd wall on R, close L to R, step thru twd LOD on R (both XIF), hold 1 ct;

7-8 Do 2 R-fc turning two-steps LOD and end in Semi-Closed pos facing LOD;

(SCP) FWD TWO-STEP; FWD TWO-STEP; WALK, -, 2, -; (Pickup) 3, -, 4, -;

9-12 Repeat the action of Meas 1 thru 4;

(Scis) SIDE, CLOSE, CROSS, -; (Scis thru) SIDE, CLOSE, THRU, -; TURN TWO-STEP; TURN TWO-STEP (to Bfly);

13-16 Repeat the action of Meas 5 thru 8 except end in Butterfly pos with M facing wall; (Fc to Fc) SIDE, CLOSE, SIDE, -; (Bk to Bk) SIDE, CLOSE, SIDE, -; (Circle) AWAY TWO-STEP; TOGETHER TWO-STEP (to Bfly);

17 In Butterfly pos step swd LOD on L, close R to L, swd on L and turn to face LOD in Open pos, hold 1 ct;

18 Blend to Back-to-Back pos and step swd LOD on R, close L to R, swd on R and remain in Back-to-Back pos;

19 Release hand hold and starting on M's L circle away from partner in 1 two-step with M turning L-face and W R-face;

20 Continue the circle with another two-step (R, L, R, -) coming back to partner to take Butterfly pos with M facing partner and wall;

(Scis thru) SIDE, CLOSE, CROSS THRU (check), -; BACK, SIDE, CROSS THRU (dip to CP), -; VINE, 2, 3, 4; PIVOT, -, 2, -;

21 Step swd LOD on L, close R to L, cross thru on L twd RLOD (both XIF) to check with a slight dip, hold 1 ct; (Note: You are now in L-Open pos facing RLOD)

22 Retain the joined hands (M's L & W's R) and step bwd twd LOD on R, face partner and step swd LOD on L, cross R in front of L with a slight dip (both XIF) to Loose-Closed pos with M facing wall, hold 1 ct;

23 In Loose-Closed pos do a 4 ct vine LOD stepping swd L, behind on R (both XIB), swd L, cross R in front of L (both XIF);

24 Starting on M's L do a full R-face couple pivot in 2 slow steps to end in Butterfly pos with M facing wall;

(Fc-to-Fc) SIDE, CLOSE, SIDE, -; (Bk-to-BK) SIDE, CLOSE, SIDE, -; (Circle) AWAY TWO-STEP; TOGETHER TWO-STEP (to Bfly);

25-28 Repeat the action of Meas 17 thru 20;

(Scis thru) SIDE, CLOSE, CROSS THRU (check), -; BACK, SIDE, CROSS THRU (dip to CP), -; VINE, 2, 3, 4; PIVOT, -, 2, - (to SCP), -;

29-32 Repeat the action of Meas 21 thru 24 except end in Semi-Closed pos to repeat the dance.

DANCE GOES THRU TWO TIMES PLUS MEAS 1 THRU 8

Ending: (SCP) WALK, -, 2, - (W twirl R-fc); APART, -, POINT, -;

After completing Meas 1 thru 8 the last time thru M walks fwd 2 slow steps LOD (L, -, R, -) as W twirls R-fc under joined M's L hand and W's R; Change hands and step apart and acknowledge as music ends;

ABOUT IT

While the month of March is rather blustery, and is known to be cold with rain, it is a time to begin thinking about the coming summer. Summer brings to mind vacation trips of all kinds. This year we are fortunate to have on our west coast a national square dance convention.

Several years back there was a "national" held down in Long Beach, but most of the conventions have been held east of the big Rockies, locations a bit too far for comfortable family traveling. The 18th NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE CONVENTION will be held in Seattle, Washington the weekend of June 26 and it promises to be one of the finest because it will be held in that famous Space Needle fair area. Of what we've seen of badge ribbons lately, there is already a large number of Bay Area dancers attending as well as a goodly number of local callers.

For the benefit of those readers who have never attended a "national," permit us to give some highlights which seem to be more or less universal: prior to the opening of the convention there are any number of trail dances in the surrounding and immediate area, not only in assorted square dance halls, but in the ballrooms of the major hotels; every evening at the close of the day's convention activities there are any number of after-parties held in the aforementioned halls and hotels. Wherever the "national" has been held, whatever the city, there is a grand festive atmosphere everywhere the local residents seem to embrace the square and round dances and our colorful costumes.

The National Convention, itself, is a magnificent expansion of any kind of square dance festival you may have attended. Try to imagine a multiple combination of our ROUND-UP and the FRESNO CROSS-ROADS and any one of our State Conventions. Day and night square dancing is taking place in several halls at once. One or two hard-wood floored ballrooms are usually set aside for round dancing. The dan-

cer is exposed to callers and round dance teachers from all over the United States and Canada; from the neighborhood club caller to the nationally known traveling caller. Round dancers will meet the teachers who have written the many dances which are popularly done. And, as with any convention, there are the business people who supply us with the clothes and things we associate with our activity. Entire halls are set aside and filled with booths where merchandise is displayed to stagger the imagination. While the usual kinds of costumes are on exhibit, there are always a number of other things available which we don't normally find in our own neighborhoods.

It is true that there have been "good" conventions and "poor" conventions, however, no one can really believe that he is an experienced dancer until he has attended a "national." So, if it is at all possible, make every effort to join us in Seattle this summer.

Under the same subject of vacations and traveling, we would like to call your attention to a square and round dancer's directory service of a national and world-wide scope. It is C.R.O.W.D., Central Registry of World Dancers. It is the brain-child of Fran and Steve Stephens who developed a cross-indexed file of all kinds of dancing activities as an outgrowth of their experience as world travelers. They provide this service at no charge as a hobby and because of their love of dancing and people.

If you are planning a trip, and would like to dance along the way, you need only write to them and outline your route and destination. They will mail you a programmed guide of all the available dancing and contacts along your route. Write C.R.O.W.E.D., 151 Dryden Drive, San Antonio, Texas 78213.

One of the most important things about the Golden State Round-Up, is the featured callers. As we promised in last month's issue we will bring you what information we have, on each one of them.

This month we will feature Vaughn Parrish - Vaughn and his wife, Jean began dancing 21 years ago with three neighboring farm couples in Texas. They did it the hard way, no caller, using what records were available at the time, which also meant, no instruction sheets. For two years they went without hearing the word "Allemande." The series of records that they used had a call "On the corner with your left hand," which took the place of "allemande."

After dancing seven years, Vaughn began calling. Since that time, he and Jean have made calling and teaching squares and rounds a full time profession.

Vaughn has called in 49 States, including an Air Force sponsored Trek to Alaska a couple of years ago. He has called in most Canadian Provinces, and has been featured at many of the Nation's outstanding festivals, conventions, and vacation institutes. He also conducts caller's clinics frequently throughout the country.

Vaughn records squares on Kalox and Rounds on Belco. His most popular round was "Oh Boy!"

Vaughn and Jean have three adult children, Kay, Terry and Kim. They also have two adorable grandchildren, Jeana Kay, age 5 and Bobby, age 3.

The Parrish family makes their home in Boulder, Colorado.

How our Parade will be...

Last year our Parade Chairmen Wayne & Ginger Earle sent a copy of the judges scoring sheet to all clubs, and there was still a misunderstanding and some disappointment at the end of the parade, because floats that had a lot of hard work and thought put into them did not score high enough to win a prize.

This year I hope that, maybe, I can explain the scoring so there will be little misunderstanding, and if there are any questions please feel free to contact me and I will try to help you. First thing when building your float keep in mind the judges will be looking for the following things:

Design: This will net you anywhere from 1 to 20 points depending upon artistic imagination, color combination, symmetrical arrangement. The better you are on these three points the higher you will score.

Construction: This is one of the most important parts of your float in point value, first, propulsion, if it is self-propelled you may receive from 1 to 10 points, if you are towing it with a decorated car, you may receive from 1 to 8 points, if it is towed by a non-decorated vehicle you may receive from 1 to 4 points, as you can see your best points are for self-propelled floats, if this is not practical then you must have a well-decorated towing vehicle to receive a high score. Next, automation: You may receive from 1 to 10 points for this, if it is not automated you will receive no points under this section of the score sheet. Last of all under construction, is materials: You may receive from 1 to 20 points for this. Now to sum up this category, to receive the maximum points your float must be self-propelled, automated and your materials must be unique, and, of course, the judges have to agree with you.

Theme: Under this section you may receive from 1 to 10 points for the presentation of your topic. There will not be a parade theme, so the topic is yours to decide and no matter what it may be, present it well, for up to 10 more points.

General Effect: This may net you from 1 to 30 points so this is also important for your final score, the judges will be looking for

over-all appeal, so try to plan ahead before construction starts. That completes the score sheet.

This year your parade committee has added and raised the prize money that you may win. It is listed under the President's Message. As you can see we are trying to make it more attractive for you this year, so, before you set your minds on your floats this year re-read the above points, then the prizes and now to work. Let's make this parade even better than it was last year, and some day soon not only our Golden State Round-Up, but also our Parade will be the talk of the nation. Good luck!
