LET'S TALK



ABOUT IT

Most people would agree that the life blood, or at least food, of square dancing is the newer dancer. The care and feeding of beginners should be the major topic of concern for all established square dancers and callers. All too often the beginners of the end takes place during a new dancer's early experiences.

Many men come to their first square dance class with great trepidation and reluctance because of fears of being made to feel foolish on the dance floor. In most cases the caller and the helping experienced dancers are able to dispel such fears as that first evening progresses. Certainly, by the second meeting of the beginners class, the beginner is put at ease and is brought to the realization of his own learning abilities. From then until the time of the first away from home hoedown, the newer dancer has great confidence in himself. He has, however, been taught by this time that he has certain responsibility to seven other people in his square.

Because the ultimate and total enjoyment of square dancing is the hoedown and public dance, and all the many related pleasurable experiences attached thereto, it is most important that the newer dancer not only enjoy his first hoedown, but come away from it with great feelings of accomplishment. Here then, is the problem that could be the most important one of a square dancer's career.

There are three kinds of beginners dances and the caller or club leader must choose the one which would be best for the newer dancers under his care. There are the "callers-from-the-floor," the "guest callers," and the advertised caller or callers' dance. The first is probably the most dangerous because no one knows beforehand what callers might be on the floor and it is likely that newer callers might be at such a dance and by their inexperience, do a disservice to the beginning dancers; however, such a dance with a well-established master caller as program director could be quite satisfactory if one is assured that that master caller will take care in regulating his program.

The guest callers dance presupposes that the host caller has made arrangements with

callers who are presently teaching classes of beginners and/or will accept on his platform only those callers who are familiar with the needs and limitations of newer dancers. Such a dance should be most satisfactory for beginning dancers as it is related to the known ability of the host caller and his past good judgment is working with newer dancers.

Perhaps the most assured dance for beginners would be the one which advertises the caller or callers for the program. Then the club caller or club leader need only make a judgment based upon the advertised caller's ability in working with newer dancers. And, of course, one can use past experience as a yardstick.

Such things as location, traveling time, and possibly weather conditions need to be taken into consideration. An 8 o'clock

dance in San Jose, no matter how promising, is of little value to a club group in Petaluma; nor would a Stockton dance be of much value to a bunch from San Mateo. However, when a dance is chosen for the benefit of your group of beginners, you have the responsibility to see to it that that dance serves their purpose; to their best needs and abilities.

When a series of guest callers seem to be stopping the floor too often, when a caller seems to be "teaching" too much to the dancers, and when an advertised caller begins catering to the very best dancers on the floor, it is time for the club caller or club leader to approach the stage and complain to the person in charge. Always keep in mind that when a "beginners" or "newer dancers" dance is being held, they, and they alone are the most important people to be considered. While it is hoped that a master caller or a club leader is capable of receiving suggestions at a dance, it is more important that the visiting newer dancers have an enjoyable evening than one being worried about whether the host's feelings are marred.

Challenge dancing has its place among experienced dancers, but it does not have any value at all at an open hoedown arranged for our "life blood" newer dancers.

At our Nov. 17, 1968 General Committee meeting, we had invited Club Presidents and after the meeting, we all enjoyed dancing to Bill Peters. By the time you read this, we will have had our March 16 General Committee meeting, to which we have again invited Club Presidents. They will have had the pleasure of joining us in dancing to Skip Graham. Such questions as these should be directed to your Delegate. If he is unable to answer them, then ask your Assistant and/or District Director.
