Every once in a while an article is written about the question of drop-outs and/or people who are beginning to lose interest in square dance activity. These pages have certainly worried the question from several points of view. Most of the reasons given for drop-outs are negative in nature: too many basics, caller not friendly, cliques in the club, etc. The suggested remedy is to "fix" that which has broken down. Certainly it is only prudent that we watch for the pitfalls and avoid them at all costs, and the remedy of a bad situation is better than no action at all. However, there might not be a drop-out problem if we could concern ourselves with positive action.

Last April we attended a dance sponsored by the BERKELEY CLUB SINGLES under the direction of Howard Scott, and that dance was attended by a busload of folks from the SACRAMENTO SINGLES under the direction of Gene Case. The bus trip itself was a fine example of positive activity to maintain high club interest, but the real high point of the evening was an exhibition dance group of these Sacramento folks called the FLIPPERS & FLAPPERS. This consisted of one square of dancers dressed in

most outlandish costume: giant potato sack head, short body, and dangling arms. With swimmers flippers on their feet these dancers kept the whole hall in stitches! No one who was in that hall that night will ever forget that exhibition!

The FLIPPERS & FLAPPERS are the sum-total result of everyone's work. Costumes had to be made, gear had to be acquired, and many hours of practice had to take place. The end result was not only outstanding, but every club member had a feeling of accomplishment for a job well done. Activities like these are the cement and mortar which holds a group together.

The creation of an "exhibition" group within every club or the scheduling of assorted bus trips is not the answer for every group.
