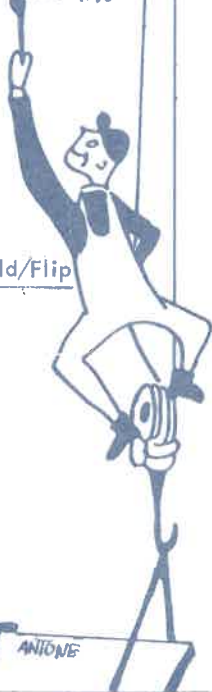

ABOUT IT

This is the edition that concerns itself with the recently past Golden State Round-Up. We suppose that obligation dictates that we make certain comments; however, other writers (and photographers) have pretty much covered the subject at this time, so we'd like to let the matter rest for this column until a later issue when we can present some constructive ideas which might go to make next year's Round-Up that much better; although, how can anyone improve on a good thing?

There is a problem. Let's not just talk about it, let's do something about it! It is one that has been swept under the rug far too long. Many are talking about it, but nothing ever seems to be done about it at the "association" level. Maybe the individual club officers can do something.

The vast majority of square and round dancing takes place in some local public school facility; a multi-use room or an auditorium. In most cases, there is no charge, or the charge is quite nominal. Even the money-making hoedowns find that the hall rental is either non-existent or most nominal. The public school is really the lifeblood of our activity. If the time ever comes when we are charged realistic hall fees, the entire square and round dance movement is going to be in real financial trouble. So, what's the beef?

A number of individual callers, alone and in partnership, have created a kind of Saturday night hoedown which is nothing more than a money-making proposition for the principal callers. These callers are using public school facilities at little or no cost, and they are lining their pockets with whatever money that comes in at the door.

"Ah," you say, "this is a free enterprise economy and everyone has the right to present his own business." So true, but not at the expense of recreational square and round dancing. If and when the assorted school districts discover that certain Saturday night dances are mostly "money-making" propositions, the entire club square and round dance picture will have been radically changed. Can you imagine paying

\$25 a night for workshops and \$50 for a hoedown?

Established callers and established round dance leaders have always acquired commercial facilities for their presentations. One need only to look at certain private club halls and hotel ballrooms to see where the professional callers and teachers hold their dancing presentations. It is the individual caller, or partnership caller combination, using public school facilities that presents the gross danger to our activity.

What do do? There are two things that dancers can do. First, the dancer can carefully read advertisements of coming hoedowns. If the dance is conducted and sponsored by an established club, then it falls into the category of recreational square or round dancing. Such a dance should be supported. If such a dance is not clearly sponsored and supported by an established club, and if it is being held in a public school, it should, in all good faith, be avoided for the greater benefit of square dancing at large. On the other hand, should such a dance be held in a commercial hall, then the only guide the dancer need follow is one of individual desire for an evening's entertainment.

If "boycott" seems too strong, or if you believe that not many will read advertisements that carefully, then the second course of action is open to club officers in regard to public school use, etc. Tell the administrators.

Most people out of the square and round dance movement do not really understand all the workings of our activity. How many times have you had an acquaintance, upon learning that you were going to a dance, say, "I hope you win a prize"? So it might well be with certain school administrators. To them dancing, square, round, or folk, is all the same; and, a dance is a dance is a dance.

We have a responsibility to the several school administrations with which we deal. We need to inform them exactly of our activity as an adult recreational thing (or teenage thing, if it is a youth group). We must

make clear to the school authorities the difference between club square dancing and out-and-out commercial enterprise. School administrators will appreciate our directness and frankness, and it will make them feel more at ease with the California Educational Code as it applies to the use of school facilities. Under Division 12, these are Sections 16561, 16562, 16563, and a whole range from 16651 thru 16661.

These sections make it quite clear that public schools are to be made available to square and folk dancers at a fee only large enough to cover expenses; however, it is also made clear that commercial enterprises should pay a fee comparable to local commercial hall rates. If a caller or club officer wishes to have a copy of those sections of the Educational Code which apply to our activity (without having to buy the bound code from Sacramento), a letter of request will be honored.

The free and inexpensive use of public schools is the life-blood of square and round dancing. Let us protect it with all our might!

Perhaps you will be the one to win one of those wonderful prizes. You don't have to use the form in the magazine, but be sure to include your name, address, and the name of your club if you send your theme in on regular stationery. The winners will be announced at the Association Anniversary Dance, January 11, 1970.

During the coming year we expect to attend as many of the Association Club's Anniversary dances as possible.
