Off and on, and from time to time, there has been some amount of conflict between round dancers and square dancers. This is strange because, in most cases, they are one and the same. But, it must be recognized that there are square dancers who don't round dance; while, there are no round dancers who don't square dance. In this strange situation, we often find that the round dancer gets the short end of things when it comes to square dance festivals.

In particular, we are considering the recent and past Golden State Round-Ups. Because of facility space, the round dancers are relegated to another hall while many of us square dancers are having a grand time on the main auditorium floor. So far, so good! But, there are times when special dance programs are scheduled which conflict with each other. The main example is the recent scheduling of the "challenge" dancing while there were workshops in rounds at another hall. Many round dancers were disappointed in not being able to participate in the challenge squares because of their round dance obligations. Obligations which are justly due the very dedicated round dance leaders who endeavor to conduct the several round dance sessions. (You all will remember the many fine round dance couples who were on the floor assisting in the teaching of the current Round-of-the-Month.)

We don't want conflict in the square and round dance movement; we want to continue to maintain cooperation and good fellowship. Let us callers and square dancers recognize the folks who enjoy round dancing and give them every opportunity to dance along with us. Not in every case, but in most cases, these are the leaders of the greater square dance movement and the ones who have been around our activity for many, many years. It is therefore suggested that future planners make sure that round dancers are scheduled in such a way that they are included in the several special square dance activities that become part of the major program.

For those who might take another point of view in regard to round dancing, we'd

be happy to entertain those ideas, and incorporate them in a future article. In the meantime, we'd like to toss out a thought which will be explored at another time, namely: "Is square dancing too cheap?"

Why is it that we are willing to pay over two dollars a person to see a major Hollywood movie, eighty-five cents a line for bowling, or three dollars greens fees for golf when we pay a dollar or less to go square dancing? Why are callers paid only \$35 or \$40 to call a dance when other entertainers or bands are paid in the hundreds of dollars? Are we selling our activity short?

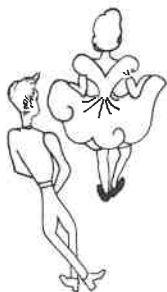
