Positions: Open-Facing for Intro, Butterfly, M facing wall, for Dance.

Footwork: Opposite, Directions for M except where noted.

INTRO: WAIT; WAIT; APART, -, POINT, -; TOGETHER (to Bfly), -, TOUCH, -;

1-2 In Open-Facing pos (M's R hand and W's L joined) wait 2 measures;

3-4 Step back away from partner on L, -, Point R fwd, -; Step together on R (blend to Butterfly pos), -, touch L to R, -;

DANCE

(Bfly) SIDE, CLOSE, SIDE, -; (to Open) ROCK FWD, -, RECOV (to face), -; (RLOD) SIDE, CLOSE, SIDE, -; (to L-Open) ROCK FWD, -, RECOV (to face), -;

1 In Butterfly pos step swd LOD on L, close R, swd L, hold 1 ct;

2 Turn to face LOD and rock fwd R, hold 1 ct, recover on L while turning to again face partner in Butterfly pos, hold 1 ct;

3 Step swd RLOD on R, close L, swd R, hold 1 ct;

4 Turn to face RLOD in Left-Open pos and rock fwd on L, hold 1 ct, recover on R while turning to face partner and again take Butterfly pos;

(Bfly) SIDE, CLOSE, CHECK, -; (Scis Thru) SIDE, CLOSE, THRU, -; (CP) TURN TWO-STEP; TURN TWO-STEP (to Bfly);

5 In Butterfly pos step swd LOD on L, close R, rock swd LOD on L to check fwd motion, hold 1 ct;

6 Step swd RLOD on R, close L, step thru on R twd LOD (both XIF), hold 1 ct;

7-8 Blend to Closed pos and do 2 R-face turning two-steps LOD (End in Bfly);

(Bfly) SIDE, CLOSE, SIDE, -; (to Open) ROCK FWD, -, RECOV (to face), -; (RLOD) SIDE, CLOSE, SIDE, -; (to L-Open) ROCK FWD, -, RECOV (to face), -;

9-12 Repeat the action of Meas 1 thru 4;

(Bfly) SIDE, CLOSE, CHECK, -; (Scis Thru) SIDE, CLOSE, THRU, -; (CP) TURN TWO-STEP; TURN TWO-STEP;

13-16 Repeat the action of Meas 5 thru 8;

(Limp) SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE, BEHIND; (SCP) WALK, -, 2, -; (Limp) SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE, BEHIND; (SCP) WALK, -, 2, -;

17 In Loose-Closed pos step swd LOD on L, cross R behind L, swd on L, and again cross R behind L (both XIB);

18 Turn to Semi-Closed pos and walk fwd LOD 2 slow steps L, -, R, -;

19 Repeat the action of Meas 17;

20 Repeat the action of Meas 18 except end in Loose-Closed pos;

(Scis Thru) SIDE, CLOSE, THRU, -; SIDE, CLOSE, THRU, -; (CP) TURN TWO-STEP; TURN TWO-STEP;

21 Step swd LOD on L, close R, cross thru twd RLOD on L (both XIF), hold 1 ct;

22 Step swd RLOD on R, close L, cross thru twd LOD on R (both XIF), hold 1 ct;

23-24 Blend to Closed pos and do 2 R-face turning two-steps LOD and end still in Closed pos but with M facing LOD;

(CP) FWD TWO-STEP; (to Bjo) ROCK IN, -, RECOV, -; (CP) SWD TWO-STEP; (Scis Thru) ROCK OUT, -, RECOV, -;

25 In Closed pos do a two-step fwd LOD L, R, L, -;

26 Turn to Banjo pos and rock diag twd COH & LOD on R, hold 1 ct, recover on L, hold 1 ct;

27 In Closed pos do a swd two-step twd wall R, L, R, -;

28 Turn to Sidecar pos and rock diag twd wall & LOD on L, hold 1 ct, recover on R, hold 1 ct;

TWIRL-VINE, 2, 3, TCH; TWIRL-VINE, 2, 3, TCH; (CP) TURN TWO-STEP; TURN TWO-STEP;

29 M vines twd COH (W twirls R-face) side L, cross R behind L, side L, touch R;

30 M vines twd wall (W twirls L-face) side R, cross L behind R, side R, touch L

(Note: The M takes small steps in Meas 30 so that he will be in position to take Closed pos with his back to COH as W's twirl is completed);

31-32 Blend to Closed pos and do 2 R-face turning two-steps LOD;

DANCE GOES THRU TWICE

Ending: FACE-TO-FACE; BACK-TO-BACK; TWIRL-VINE, -, 2, -; APART, -, POINT; Moving LOD do a face-to-face two-step; turn to back-to-back and do another swd two-step; Face partner and do a slow vine-twirl side, -, behind, -; Step apart on L (W on R), -, change hands and point R twd partner as music ends;

ABOUT IT

Letters and comments from readers reach us either directly or through the editor's office. In every case a direct reply is made, and matters not clearly stated on these pages are explored in more individual detail. Space, and the recognition of privacy, does not justify personal comments in this column. When we are made aware of a situation related to dancing, that situation will find itself presented here. In most cases the "editorial we" is the point of view together with an attempt at a fair representation.

However, in light of comments we have heard, letters we have received, and our own philosophical beliefs, the following is a definite point of view.

This is the time of year when our thoughts turn to the creation of beginners classes. Ours is an activity which could soon die out if we did not recruit new people each season. Those of us who have been associated with square and round dancing for a number of years find it harder and harder locating friends or associates eligible for beginners classes; most of our good friends are already in the movement.

There is a great reservoir of American people that has not ever been invited to join: the so-called minorities of Latins, Orientals, and Negroes. Sure, one may find a brave couple here or there participating, but the large majority of said groups is not with us. The reason is simple prejudice.

By "prejudice" we mean only the definition of pre-judgment, not fear, nor hate, nor dislike. There seems to be a pre-judgment that these people wouldn't fit or belong. This does not seem to be true in fact. At the number of national square dance conventions we have had the pleasure of attending the Negro and Latin dancing couples have been as accepted as could be imagined in keeping with the overall courtesy of square and round dancing. And, the halls fill up when Negro callers from Detroit or Los Angeles pick up the mike.

The United States is currently faced with one of the greatest revolutions in its history: "Black Power." We have seen what has

happened during periods of hate and violence. While the questions of jobs, housing and education are paramount in this situation, there surely is room for human relations. If we really believe that modern American square dancing is wholesome, friendly, and a justifiable part of the American Way of Life, then we had better get to work and incorporate our beliefs into practice.

It is strongly suggested that established square and round dance clubs place recruiting posters in neighborhoods which are populated by so-called minorities. Wherever such posters are placed, it should be made clear that everyone is welcome. All beginning couples should be accepted in the established club's class. We do not want "black" clubs, nor "brown" clubs, nor "oriental" clubs; we want American square dance clubs!

Throughout our assorted school districts you may find courses of study dealing with Black History. Television and the current press show us where the Negro has had a very important place in the development of our nation as a whole; to say nothing of the grand development of our Pacific Southwest by the Mexicans and Spanish. A simple study of the railroad empire and the development of western business can only lead to an understanding of the contributions made by our Oriental citizens. These folks are Americans, and have every right to be invited to partake of our dancing activity.

If we, in our area, can bring about a recruitment of minority people; if this can be done across the country, then the next two national square dance conventions will be the most outstanding examples of American democracy that the world has ever known.
