The California Council of Square Dance Associations held its quarterly meeting in Santa Clara not long ago. Through the intervention of Art Hansford, the President of the Santa Clara Callers' Association, we were able to attend as special guests and were permitted to sit in on several committee meetings. For the benefit of you readers, here are a few high points:

The committee investigating the possibility of having the 1976 National Convention in California is considering such locations as San Diego, Long Beach, Los Angeles, and San Francisco. Each one of these cities will have a convention complex suitable for a square dance convention by that time. The financial obligations entailed in hosting a national are staggering and the need for cooperation and organization among the state's several associations is paramount. At this time the State Council admits to having difficulties in putting on a State Convention. But the greatest hurdle is getting the approval of the National Convention Committee three or four years in advance. If there is going to be a national held here in this state by 1976, it's going to take a lot of doing.

At a publications committee meeting it was pretty well established that square and round dance publications have many of the same problems. The major one is a total mailed delivery for each issue. More times than not certain groups of readers fail to receive the magazines until the second week of the month. In each case the publisher has delivered all his copies to the post office the last week of the month, but one batch somehow gets sidetracked. All publishers ask that readers contact the local post office rather than the magazine office. More times than not a bundle of your favorite magazine is gathering dust in some corner behind the mail sacks.

It was at this committee meeting that something was mentioned about an idea being put into action in the Southern California Area. It is still in its early stages, but as reported by Emma and Lou Rumbaugh of OPEN SQUARES it goes like this:

As an outgrowth of a Blood Bank for square dancers of the Western Association it came to mind that a need for sick-room supplies always exists when there has been an accident or serious illness. In such times of need money is often short and one hates to buy a cane or wheel chair or crutches or whatever. Sure, these things can now be rented, but not for free. How nice it would be if a person need only call a central number and find out where this or that item could be located. How many of us have a sickroom item or two resting in a basement or storage closet? It would take time and bookkeeping to find out who has what where. But, we square dancers think nothing of spending lots of time and effort to put on benefit hoedowns for fellow dancers. (What about a Blood Bank for Northern California dancers?)

In the several committee meetings attended and at the general meeting itself the letters "D" "C" "P" kept coming up. DCP stands for a clearing house kind of committee that exists in Southern California to cope with problems of a universal nature as they relate to square and round dancing. DCP means, "Dancers, Callers, Publishers" and it is composed of a representative from each dancers association, each callers association, and each publication in the area. The DCP in Southern California has been helpful in dealing with the problems of hall use and hall fees, and sometimes the group acts as a clearing house for proposed benefit dances.

The committee meetings and the following general meeting lasted all day. A great deal of business was transacted and/or discussed. Some problems were solved, some were created, and some will be carried over until the next quarterly meeting, but it sure was democracy in action. We believe that it is unfortunate that the Northern California Square Dancers Association does not belong to the State Council.
