Last month when we presented the activities of the State Council meeting that was held in Santa Clara, one major piece of business was not mentioned for lack of space. It is presented herewith:

An invitation to help promote square and round dancing has been received by the International Association of Holiday Inns. Mr. William Carroll, the director of all Holiday Inn promotions, wishes to establish advertising relations with the square and round dance clubs. He has sent a letter to all managers of Holiday Inns throughout the country requesting that they allow rack space in which to place informational folders for travelers interested in square and round dancing. These brochures will not only direct the traveling dancer, but will also acquaint the Holiday Inn's personnel with local square and round dance activity.

Square and round dance groups in the area of a particular Holiday Inn need only to furnish the printed material and keep it up-to-date. The only restriction is to the size of the material submitted. It should be 3 3/4" by 8 1/2" so that it will properly fit the existing racks in Holiday Inn lobbies. In addition to this local service, square and round dancing can expect to receive publicity in the international magazine published throughout the Holiday Inn organization.

Should anyone wish additional information, or should there be any problems in this matter, write to Bill Crawford, Holiday City Station, Box 18442, Memphis, Tennessee, 38118.

Somewhat in conjunction with the Holiday Inn situation, it should be mentioned that the KOA Camps are providing square dancing for their summer campers. There are a number of KOA Camps around the country, but of particular interest is the camp located at Richardson Grove among the Redwoods here in California. Last summer our good friend, Sparky Sparks called squares six nights a week; sometimes by himself and sometimes hosting a traveling caller. Most of the presentations were of the one-night-stand variety, but Sparky says that there were three or four evenings which turned into real hoedowns when experienced dancers came by.

Perhaps the most important thing about this, aside from the fun folks had at KOA, was the follow-up. Because of our listing in the Yellow Pages, we have received three calls from people who wanted to join a beginners class upon their return from Richardson Grove. Who knows how many were able to find classes on their own?
