Dear Square Dancing Friends: we would like to offer our grateful thanks to each and every person who helped in our 7th Annual Taos Pueblo Christmas project. It is impossible to extend our thanks on a personal basis but hope this will help convey our deep and thankful appreciation.

We now have over 400 couples who have signed up to send a child a Christmas box filled with little presents and goodies. This means that each child on the Pueblo will receive a present this Christmas and we are hoping there will be enough to take some to the Indian school in Albuquerque.

Since this is being written before Christmas, it isn't possible to give a first-hand account but we do plan on arriving in Taos, New Mexico, on Dec. 23rd in time to play Santa to the little Indian children and distribute your boxes personally. We only wish you all could be present and share this experience with us.

Our special thanks goes to Al and Bea Brundage in Connecticut and to Pat and Joyce Munn and Ray and Mary Reinhart in Los Angeles for their help. Locally, our Santa's helpers were Vern and Minnie Branco, George and Anne Dreier, Cecil and Marty Hubbell, Bill and Dottie Kiefer, Ed and Dorothy Looney, Ernie and Lucile Mills, Nonie and Mary Moglia and Gene and Emily Sunia. We would like to express our gratitude to Rosalie Parker of the Aces and Laces who, along with eight other women, personally made 150 hoods and 100 pair of mittens for us to distribute to the Indian children. They have been working all year on this labor of love.

So many clubs helped - again it is impossible to thank them all - but we would like to mention a few that we know worked particularly hard for the success of this project. First, we would like to thank our own Mustangs, Gingham Squares and Sets in Order Workshop. They participate almost 100 per cent and our love and gratitude to them over the past seven years could never be expressed properly. Also, our heartfelt thanks go to the Aces and Laces, B Sharps,

Eagle Squares, Grasshoppers, Square Wheelers, Tormey Squares, Two by Fours and Whirl-A-Ways.

How does one say "thank you?" We think it is best expressed by our dear Indian friend from Taos, New Mexico - Mary Schlosser or Knpobo (which means Cradle flower). Here is her "message of thanks:"

"My dear friends: Words are inadequate in any sense - when one wishes to give thanks. In my thanking you, all my heart and soul speaks. We could never have made so many little faces shine with happiness if you good people had not helped us. You are so kind, and we thank God for you.

"The children lose addresses in the excitement and confusion, and most of them do not write personal letters of thanks - but they tell me to thank all of you. So on behalf of all the Indian children at Taos Pueblo, and the Indian school - we thank you - and may God bless you all." (signed) Knpobo - Cradle Flower.

Three years ago when we spent Christmas with the Taos Indians, the Governor of the Pueblo put his arms around us and with tears streaming down his face, tried to thank us for the happiness we brought to his people. He said God put us in the position to know so many people and then he led our path to them. His words were an emotional impact which gave meaning to our lives.

It is such a small thing we all do - filling a little box with presents and mailing it to a child - but the way the Governor expressed it, the thoughtfulness and love it conveyed made us - the Square Dancers - the greatest people in the world. So we feel very humble and most fortunate to have you all for friends and we do thank God for leading us to these wonderful people living on prehistoric Taos Pueblo.

May you all have a Merry, Merry Christmas and when you sit down to your Christmas turkey - think of us on the Pueblo eating Green Chili Stew, Indian bread and wild plum pie. But don't feel sorry for us - we think we're the luckiest people in the world and we wouldn't trade places with anyone - anywhere.

P.S. As a token of friendship the Taos Indians bestowed an Indian name on Nita and when translated, meant "Dancing Flower." Bob - a little perturbed - wanted to know why he didn't get a name. Their reply - it wouldn't do any good - everyone calls you "Santa Claus."
