LEVELING AS PER LEVEL

From over-all reports coming in from Callers and Dancers, the current beginner class cycle has been a good vintage year for the square dance scene. This is very encouraging after a long dry period of small classes, and our concern is always to fit these newer dancers as neatly and comfortably into our picture as possible.

My feeling is that the transition from graduate beginner to an intermediate dancer is BOOM! Too abrupt a change. I venture to say this may be the most critical time that a dancer will face unless the club is willing to gear its dancing to the newcomer. .

In a recent panel discussion, Earl Johnston of Connecticut, cited a situation in Canada. There is one caller up there who has three clubs. (1) Beginner, (2) Easy Level, (3) Intermediate Level. The dancers are invited by personal invitation when their dancing ability warrants, to progress from beginner to easy level, or to an intermediate level (which is really an extremely good level). In a sense this keeps a great majority of the dancers happy because, like the flow of water they seek their own levels. Many callers, of course, would not like to extend themselves that much, but it works well for this caller, and his clubs are just as full as can be.

One big problem the club caller has these days is to get a feel of the square dance pulse as to what new basics are being danced in the area. Let's face it, gang, there's a lot of junk coming out these days, and a caller must possess a good deal of clairvoyance to attempt screening the good and the bad. Ultimately it is the dancers who accept or reject and the caller would be wise to note their reactions to his program.

One wonders if we might have a continuation of easy level Saturday night dances to cater to the new graduate beginner not feeling at ease with the more complicated basics or the dancing speed found at the intermediate level. The most difficult part would be the caller's ability to keep it to that, to keep the great majority of the floor moving. Witness callers at beginner hoe-downs who call 'Spin the top,' 'Barge thru,' etc. The harm done thru such poor judgment is far-reaching and inexcusable. Small



wonder that the embarrassed beginner never comes back!

To sum up, I wonder if we shouldn't follow a trend which is being followed nationally. That is, to adopt a policy of easy dancing for the newer dancer over a longer period to allow more assimilation of those dancers that we could lose very easily. We lose absolutely nothing by this policy, but the rewards could be fantastic with a larger number of happy dancers.

Square Dancers Ass'n No. Calif. 'President's Message' Stitt Pool

In the past month or so there has been a considerable amount of discussion about the procedure used in nominating and electing your Association officers. I would like to use this space reserved for your Association President's message to try and clarify just how your Association goes about in the nominating and electing its officers. Every step of the way is spelled out in the By-Laws and we try to follow them very carefully.

First of all to be nominated for any office in your Association you must be a square dancer and belong to a member club. Then you must be a delegate or an alternate delegate of that club. Delegates elect their District Directors at 4-D Meetings (District Director - District Delegate) and the four general officers of your Association are elected by all the delegates at a general delegates meeting in May of each year.

Normally the President in the month of March asks each District Director to recommend a couple from his district to serve

on a nominating committee. This committee is charged by your President to select the couple best qualified in their opinion to fill the four general offices of your Association. Usually in the case of President, Vice President, and Treasurer, the incumbent Vice-President, Treasurer and Secretary are asked if they would like to go on to the next highest office and if so they are nominated for that office. This, of course, leaves the office of Secretary open and the committee must find a nominee for that office. Each couple recommended by the members of that committee is contacted to find out if they are willing to accept office if nominated. I am sure that each member of the nominating committee, when they recommend anyone, does so with the strong conviction that that couple will be an asset to your Association. The couple that is finally chosen and the nominees for the other offices is presented to the general committee for their approval and voted on at the general meeting in May. As in any election in a democratic organization, nominations from the floor of the general committee are always opened at the May meeting and any qualified couple or single can be nominated for any of the four general offices of your Association. The Association follows the fiscal year plan and the newly elected officers take over their office on July 1st. The qualifications named earlier in this article are the tangible ones but let it be known there are several intangible qualifications that the By-Laws do not spell out. First, you must love square dancing almost to the point of making it a way of life. Secondly you must have at least two Sundays a month that you can devote to attending Association meetings and taking care of Association business. You must promote square dancing whenever and wherever you can at all times. Your rewards for all this will be many and varied but mostly you will have the satisfaction of knowing that you have done your best for the best people in the world, "Square Dancers."

Taw Chatter



A REPRINT FROM LOCAL SQUARES

By Helen Smithwick

Hints for the Home Seamstress: In making a full circle skirt, if you will line it fully with pella, and if you are using trim sew it all the way through then all will wash with no ironing. If you use velvet ribbon, be sure it is nylon.

If you have a sweater or skirt that is trimmed in sequins, before having it cleaned, baste a good sized piece of white material over the design. This will help keep the sequins from coming off and will also preserve their sparkle. Save old pieces of discarded sheets for this.

In making a slip of nylon net, use safety pins or heavy hair pins to pin the net on net.

Instead of lining your dancing dress, for a change why not make a matching slip of the same color as the dress. Rayon material is best for this. Cut the skirt the same as for the dress, and if you don't want all that weight at the waist, make the slip with the torso line.

The girls on the sewing panel at the State Convention said that nylon petticoats should not be stored in nylon bags, they report that your slips need to breathe, so in traveling I am using my old pillow cases to store slips and petticoats in to keep them fresh and clean.

To carry or store a frosted cake without damaging the frosting, wrap it gently with a piece of waxed paper which has been lightly dampened, then spread evenly with a sprinkling of powdered sugar. The paper won't stick to the cake.

Did you know a staple can be removed without a staple-puller? All one has to do is to take a paper clip, run it under the staple and pull. It comes right out, every time!

Do you have a favorite record that has become warped? To solve the problem, take two sheets of glass (these can be removed from any pictures that may be in the house, providing you put them back later) place the record between them, lay in the direct sun on a flat surface for one day, after sundown and before dew sets in, remove the record and you will find it straight.

With the hot weather, and the dancers drinking lots of soft drinks, spills on the fabric of your dress will turn brown if
