Record: HI-HAT 868

Dick Cary Band

Starting Positions: Open-Facing for Intro, Varsouvienna facing LOD for Dance.

Footwork: Opposite, Directions for M except where noted.

INTRO

WAIT; WAIT; APART, -, POINT, -; TOG, -, (to Varsouvienna) TOUCH, -;

1-2 In Open-Facing pos M facing wall (M's R hand & W's L joined) wait 2 meas;

3 Step apart on L, hold 1 ct, point R twd partner, hold 1 ct;

4 Step together on R, hold 1 ct, blend to Varsouvienna pos, touch L to R, hold 1 ct;

DANCE

(1) FWD TWO-STEP; (2) FWD TWO-STEP; (3) R TURN, -, 2, -; (4) R WHEEL, -, 2, (L-Vars), -;

1-2 In Varsouvienna pos facing LOD start on M's L (W's R) and do 2 fwd two-steps twd LOD;

3 Without releasing either hand and moving slightly LOD both do individual R-fc turns (1/2) to end in L-Varsouvienna pos facing RLOD (L, -, R, -);

4 In L-Varsouvienna pos wheel as a couple 1/2 R-fc with M backing up and W moving fwd to end facing LOD still in L-Varsouvienna pos (L, -, R, -);

(5) FWD TWO-STEP; (6) FWD TWO-STEP; (7) L-TURN, -, 2, -; (8) L-WHEEL, -, 2, (Vars), -;

5-6 In L-Varsouvienna pos start on M's L and do 2 fwd two-steps LOD;

7 Without releasing hands move slightly LOD and both do individual 1/2 L-face turns (L, -, R, -) ending in Varsouvienna pos facing RLOD (W on M's R side);

8 Wheel as a couple 1/2 L-face with M backing up and W moving fwd to end facing LOD and still in Varsouvienna pos (L, -, R, -);

(9) FWD TWO-STEP; (10) FWD TWO-STEP; (11) (W roll) VINE, -, 2, -; (12) 3, -, 4 (CP), -;

9-10 Starting on M's L do 2 fwd two-steps LOD;

11-12 Releasing hands the W does a solo R-fc roll LOD (4 slo steps) as M vines LOD swd L, -, cross R in back of L, -; Swd L, -, cross R over L, - (start blend to CP);

(13) TURN TWO-STEP; (14) TURN TWO-STEP; (15) TWIRL, -, 2, -; (16) (SCP) WALK, -, 2, -;

13-14 Blend to Closed pos and starting on M's L do 2 R-fc turning two-steps LOD;

15 W twirls R-face under joined lead hands as M walks LOD 2 steps L, -, R, -;

16 Blend to Semi-Closed pos and walk LOD L, -, R, -;

(17) (SCP) FWD TWO-STEP; (18) FWD TWO-STEP; (19) LUNGE, -, RECOV (turn), -;

(20) (L-Open) HITCH FWD, CLOSE, BACK, -;

17-18 In Semi-Closed pos start on M's L and do 2 fwd two-steps LOD;

19 Face partner and do a slight lunge swd LOD on L, hold 1 ct, recover on R and turn 1/4 R-fc (W L-fc) to L-Open pos facing RLOD, hold 1 ct;

20 In L-Open pos do a hitch stepping fwd RLOD on L, close R, bwd L, hold 1 ct;

(21) ROCK BACK, -, REC, -; (22) (Scis) SIDE, CLOSE, THRU, -; (23) (CP) TURN TWO-STEP; (24) TURN TWO-STEP;

21 In L-Open pos rock bwd LOD on R, hold 1 ct, recover fwd on L, hold 1 ct;

22 Face partner and step swd RLOD on R, close L to R, cross thru twd LOD on R (both XIF), hold 1 ct and start blend to Closed pos;

23-24 Blend to Closed pos and start on M's L & do 2 R-face turning two-steps LOD and end in Semi-Closed pos facing LOD;

(25) (SCP) FWD TWO-STEP; (26) FWD TWO-STEP; (27) LUNGE, -, RECOVER (turn), -;

(28) (L-Open) HITCH FWD, CLOSE, BACK, -;

25-28 Repeat the action of Meas 17 thru 20;

(29) ROCK BACK, -, REC, -; (30) (Scis) SIDE, CLOSE, THRU, -; (31) (CP) TURN TWO-STEP; (32) TURN TWO-STEP (to Varsouv);

29-32 Repeat the action of Meas 21 thru 24 and start blend back to Varsouvienna pos to repeat the dance.

DANCE GOES THRU 2 1/2 TIMES

Ending: (SCP) FWD TWO-STEP; FWD TWO-STEP; TWIRL-VINE, -, 2, -; APART, -, POINT, -;

1-4 On third time thru Dance complete measure 16. Remain in Semi-Closed pos and starting on M's L do 2 fwd two-steps LOD; Face partner and as W does a slow R-face twirl under joined lead hands the M steps swd LOD on L, -, cross R in back of L, -; Step apart and slightly LOD on L, - (change hands), point R twd partner and hold as music ends;



LET'S GATHER AROUND THE MULBERRY BUSH!?

We hear some talk occasionally that our Square Dancer Associations are too pre-occupied with their annual festivals and the pursuit of money to fill their treasuries that service to the square dancers is lost in the shuffle. There may be some validity to this claim.

In the feverish desire to always make next year's event the greatest, certain areas of service to square dancing must certainly be missed. However, I don't think the blame lies with our officers. Since we the square dancers, are the Association, why aren't we, the great silent majority making our wants known! Extremely sincere and capable persons are elected with one purpose in mind: To serve us, the dancer! But

only, if we indicate in which directions we wish to be served. If we ask and are ignored, that is another matter. I'm sure we have a wealth of good and qualified personnel material to choose for committees, boards, etc., if needed.

I have a thought in mind, prompted by questions from several dancers and callers. This is in the area of public relations. I guess you might say "Putting our best foot forward." (Lord knows television and movies don't always put us in the best light.) I would recommend a separate committee or board whose primary function would be public relations. Their first function might be

to obtain a list of shopping centers, civic groups, fraternal orders, county fairs, and so on, and the persons to contact. Secondly, a standby pool of one-night stand callers, and dancers willing to go out and do demonstrations. I believe an ample budget would be very necessary to institute this idea, but then, isn't this why we accumulate money, but to spend it furthering square dancing? Once all these various groups, shopping centers and so on have a central point to contact, the rest should be easier. A dancer or caller may contact this committee when they know of an opportunity to promote their hobby. I have been greatly intrigued with the Southland Shopping Center in Hayward. They are devoting an entire week spotlighting square dancing, consisting of demonstrations, hoedowns, and audience participation. (To me, this really sells our hobby when people actually get in and get their feet wet.)

In conclusion, the idea stated above is just that, and nothing more. After all, our greatest unsatisfied hunger is to bring new dancers into the hobby we have had so much pleasure participating in, and our Association has the means to plough back some of the profits taken from square dancing.

When people ask: "What does the Association ever do for us," here maybe a shining example of organization towards the greatest common good! Amen!

The newer dancer has a great deal of enthusiasm and this enthusiasm brought into a club by the newer dancer is what revitalizes and refreshes the older dancers in any club. Please never give a newer dancer a job he cannot handle, just because he is willing and wants to please. Let him have a while to learn how your club officers operate and he will do a much better job when he becomes one of them. Always let him help out on committees and parties and then he will understand that it takes all of the members of any club to make it operate smoothly and successfully. Above all, never laugh at him when he goofs in a square but let him understand that you are laughing with him.
