Ever wonder why some square dance clubs go on and on for years with the same caller? Ever wonder why some callers stay with clubs for many years while other clubs seem to continually be changing callers?

First, let's examine a few factors that make a club happy with their caller:

1) He (or she) is always ready with a smile and a warm greeting to all members or the club or visitors alike.

2) He calls what the club likes and what they desire, fast or slow, hard workshop or general material. He teaches all the new material available or teaches them enough material to keep the club current with their local dancing area, again depending on the likes and dislikes of the club members.

3) He enjoys calling and the club in turn enjoys dancing. Everyone has their own ideas as to the factors that make a club happy with their caller, but now let's examine the other side of the coin, what makes or keeps a caller happy with his club?

All callers are temperamental to some extent, even though the majority usually does not appear to be, none the less he still is. Webster defines temperamental as "moody, irritable or sensitive." Before you say that your caller doesn't fit this description, think a little first and try to remember if he wasn't just a little irritable, or moody perhaps maybe even had what is sometimes called "an off night."

What puts a caller into a happy or sad mood or become irritable with a club on a particular night or over a period of time? What factors may cause a caller to lose interest or become so moody or irritable with a club that he quits or is fired?

The answers are infinite but here are a few things you might ask yourself about yourself or your club...

1) Does everyone square up as soon as the music starts or does the caller have to keep calling for couples so that all can dance?

2) When the caller is attempting to teach a new call does everyone square up to learn it or do several people choose to sit out the learning sessions and then complain or completely foul up a square later because "they

don't know how to do it?"

3) When your caller is calling a "hoe-down" as a guest caller for another club, does the club support him by being there and enjoying themselves or do they just go to say they were there or perhaps not show up at all?

4) Does 80 to 90 per cent of the club membership (regardless of club size) always turn out for club nights or does your caller often find himself calling for much less on any given club or workshop night?

5) Does the club often remember their caller in small ways, with or without a reason. Or during his birthday or anniversary or graduation of a class, or is the club attitude one of "he's paid to do his job" and is then treated only as an employee?

Now put yourself in your caller's shoes for the next few minutes and go back and re-read questions 1 through 5 above and then ask yourself "If I were calling for your club would I be happy or would I have cause to occasionally be moody or irritable?"

Most callers are fairly sensitive as to what goes on around them. When the caller is happy and in a good mood, the feeling is catching and very soon everyone has reached a peak of excitement. When the caller is feeling low, depressed or disgusted, so goes the dance.

If your club is occasionally beset by problems and everything seems to point to the caller, again picture yourself in his position and see if there is a mutual problem. Always try to get to the source of the problem and both club and caller will have many happy years together.

You're always right - everyone else makes mistakes, not you.

Square dancing is fun and also good exercise and these are the two points that we generally try to use when talking to our non-square dancing friends. They are usually quick to agree that square dancing is good fun and exercise but that they have other hobbies and recreations that are both of these things also. They are more than likely to be golf, bowling, horse back riding, swimming and so forth. There is, however, a benefit to be gained by square dancing that most of us have overlooked. I

have always had a theory that square dancing inasmuch as it teaches us to make quick decisions in following the callers commands tends also to sharpen our minds. The decisions made in a square are made under somewhat of a pressure situation, they must be made almost instantaneously and above all be accurate. To me these things could not help but keep a persons mind active and pliable. To make a long story short I now have some confirmation on this theory of mine. While attending the Clearlake Squares 6th Anniversary last month in Lake County I visited "Sparky" and Louise Sparks who are two of the nicest people in square dancing and during our conversation I learned something very interesting. Sparky teaches square dancing to a group of 4th, 5th and 6th graders at a Lake County school and the kids really love it. Of course kids learn to square dance in about one third of the time that it takes us adults and this is because their minds are used to absorbing what is being taught to them. The real eye opener though was the fact that the kids who were learning to square dance were getting better grades in their other subjects than comparable kids in the same grades in other Lake County schools. Sparky said that this was confirmed and documented by their report cards and that parents were getting upset if their children weren't in one of SPARKYS square dance classes. He has really started something up there in Lake County and I hope it keeps going. I'm happy to say though, that this will give us one more talking point to use when trying to interest new people in square dancing. Tell them it's not only good exercise but will keep their mind young and active. So until next month, all you sharp, smooth and young minded Square Dancers—
