Dancing In The Rough

One of the first things a good square dancer notices, when he volunteers to help out with a Beginners' class, is that it is hard work. He is more tired at the end of an evening of "Circle left, circle right" than he would have been after a really fast dance. Part of it, of course, is from trying so hard to help other people understand what they are to do. But that part of it is mental. I think the physical strain comes largely from what I mean when I talk about 'rough dancing'. I mean bumping into each other, starting and stopping suddenly, jerking arms, pulling people around, and generally making you feel as if you had been put thru a wringer. From a Beginners' class, you expect this, and you brace yourself, trying to dance smoothly yourself so as to give them something to copy. You hope that in a few lessons they will improve, so you don't mind it so much.

My thesis today is, what about those people who never learn? What can we, as teachers and dancers and club members, do about those individuals who continue, year after year, to dance in such a way that you have to be ready, in the words of the referee, to 'defend yourself at all times.' ED GILMORE even gives a course in 'Jujitsu for square dancers', to teach you how to combat various dangerous types of dancers. It seems to me, however, that there ought to be some way to get it over to them that they ought to change their ways.

Of course, there is one type of rough dancer who probably never can learn, the guy who is just plain clumsy in everything he does. Dancing is out of his line anyhow, and he is lucky to be able to turn the right way and put out the right hand, without trying to do it gracefully. Those I think we'll just have to bear with-- they are such nice fellows we wouldn't want them to quit square dancing entirely. We really don't mind them too much - they can't help it.

The other extreme, of course, is the guy who wants you to be sure and realize that he dances with a very Advanced club, where they do all the extra twirls and spins, and if you don't know how to do all that sort of thing, he'll be glad to help you -- or rather, make you -- dance his way. A lot of ED's tricks come in very handy on him, because you don't care what happens to him. If he were a member of my own club, I'd tell him frankly what I thought of his methods -- somebody ought to. But as long as there are a few people who think he is tops, I don't suppose he'll change either. So use any methods that occur to you, to pin his ears back, and if you can turn the tables and sprain his arm, so much the better.

The only kind of rough dancer I think might be worth saving, by an educational campaign, is the really well-meaning fellow who simply has the whole square on his shoulders, and is so eager to help everybody, and make sure the other seven do everything right, that he nearly kills himself pushing and pulling and directing traffic, even in squares where none of it is needed. Usually this man (or this one might be a lady, and often is) was the quickest learner in his Beginners' class, and often found himself the only one in the square who knew what to do. The others were probably grateful for a shove in the right direction, and showed it. The only trouble is, these helpful souls don't know when to stop. From lending a hand, they go right on to doing the whole thing, and from helping someone who needs it, they progress to helping everybody, and taking the responsibility for the whole square themselves. Then they graduate and join a club, and the trouble begins.

I don't think the people who make themselves unpopular by this sort of dancing realize it themselves, and they are usually such good leaders, and such valuable people to have in clubs, that the ones they dance with hate to tell them and risk hurting their feelings. So, here are a few simple questions you ask yourself, which may help you to decide if possibly I could be talking about you.

Do you stand straight as you dance? If you find yourself crouching down, leaning forward, and reaching as far forward as possible for the next hand, in a Right and Left Grand, you are probably being too eager. You probably give each girl a jerk as you pull her by, instead of just touching hands, and if the floor is at all slick, you sometimes skid on the corner, because you take too long steps.

When you twirl a girl, do you grab her and wind her up? (When the caller tells you to 'Stir the bucket', he is not referring to your partner -- he is only telling you, in his picturesque language, to rotate.)

Do you jump the gun in a 'Four gents star', and plunge across the square ahead of the other three? Or, just as bad, do you shove the gent ahead of you to make sure he gets there in time? Relax -- if you simply fall in behind the fellow on your left, you'll both make it.

Do you insist that each lady you dance with get in all the styling you have been taught? Maybe you think she doesn't know enough to twirl when you meet her in a promenade. Did it ever occur to you that maybe she doesn't want to? Lots of men have no idea how hard it is to twirl on a very sticky floor. At least give her a choice -- she is the one who has to do the work.

Are you careful about where you end your swing? Do you always set your partner down on your right, or heading in the right direction? Or do you swing violently a couple of times and let her go -- or worse, let her go with a twirl, so that she ends up in the next square? Cheer up -- if you do this you are in good company. Some of the best 'high level' dancers I know have this one fault, and I hope they know who I mean.

Finally, are you always sure you know best? Did you ever force your partner to do a half sashay because she was on the wrong side, and then find out that the caller meant it that way? I thought so. You thought you knew and she didn't, so you made her do it your way, and you were wrong after all. See what I mean? Stop leading and start following -- the caller, I mean -- and let the others follow him too, in their own way, and you'll get along better with everyone.

In another part of this issue our publicity gal is filling you in on the final details and I'm certain you will agree that it should be a wonderful fun-filled weekend. Be sure and plan to be there.

BOB DAWSON

Bob Dawson began teaching his first beginner class of two squares in his home town Milwaukee, Wisconsin in November, 1949. The next ten years were busy ones for Bob and his wife, Shirley. Along with teaching

and calling they found time to organize and publish "Here 'Tis," a quarterly magazine for square and round dancers covering events and articles around the entire state. They started the Wisconsin Knothead movement. Bob appeared on a TV show once a week for three years with square dancers performing to his calls.

In March of 1959 Bob was invited on a calling tour of the state of Florida. From the wintery Wisconsin spring to sunny Florida and the enthusiastic reception wherever he called... it was inevitable that the Dawsons lost their hearts to Florida. September of that same year saw the Dawson family settled as permanent residents of Florida. For the next two years Bob traveled the U.S. and Canada filling calling engagements, our 10th Annual Golden State Round-Up being one of them.

In November of 1961 Bob decided to devote all of his time to teaching beginners and developing dances in Florida. He has held classes almost year-round since then and to date they have taught over 6,000 beginners along Florida's west coast.

Bob is author of "The Keys To Calling," a textbook for callers. He has recorded with Black Mountain and his "Veer To Donnegal" and "Summer Sounds" on MacGregor have gained considerable popularity. At present he is with Bruce Johnson's new Pulse label. His latest release with Pulse is "Lock My Heart."

Bob and Shirley have two children, a married daughter, Tracey, who presented them with a grandchild last year and a 15-year-old son, Clark, who attends the Florida Military School at DeLand, Florida.

Nylon has to breathe! Never store nylon slips in a plastic bag. Your slips can be vitalized after washing by dunking in a mixture of powdered milk (1 cup to 2 cups of cold water). Shake out and dry.

dry.
Back zippers installed so they go to the left aren't so readily opened when swinging.

Necklines will fit better if you dart the pattern.

Whip Cream material is easier to work with if the upper tension is looser than the bottom...don't baste...line with Dacron...pin both pieces together and treat as one.

It's easier to complete the top and the skirt separately before putting together.

Skirt weight will not pull the bodice out of shape so readily if bias cording is installed at the waistline.

Bees wax or kitchen parafin on thread will help to strengthen it and keep it from snarling - if you're going to sew by hand.

Your clothes dryer set at the coolest temperature is a good way to air out clothes or drapes which have become dusty from hanging.

MASHED POTATO CAKE

Mix together until creamed:

1-3/4 cup sugar 2 Eggs
3/4 cup shortening (1 1/2 sticks of Oleomargarine)

3/4 cup shortening (1½ sticks of Oleomargarine)

Sift together:

2 cups sifted flour (plain flour) 1 teaspoon soda
2 tablespoons Cocoa (rounded)

Put sugar, eggs and shortening creamed together with flour, soda and cocoa. Add $\frac{1}{2}$ cup sour milk, 1 cup hot mashed potatoes, 1 teaspoon vanilla, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup chopped nuts (optional). Bake at 350° - In layers takes 30 to 35 minutes; in Loaf takes 50 minutes.

Minute Mashed Potatoes maybe used. Directions for 2 servings will make 1 cup of hot mashed potatoes.
