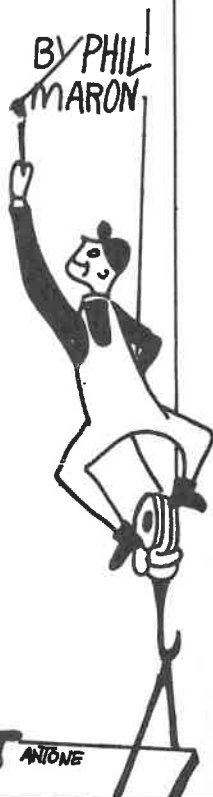

Let's Make IT a Week To Remember!

Square Dancers in the state of California will celebrate Square Dance Week September 6th thru the 12th in a variety of ways. The month of August would be an excellent time for clubs and/or Associations to set plans in anticipation of letting the public-at-large know the joy of participating in our hobby. A list of the media available to our groups into action must include:

1. Newspapers and Television.
 - a. Interviews to inform the public that a certain event is to take place which will be entertaining. ..Should not be missed.
2. Posters or flyers in store windows to announce a coming publicity event.
3. Street or shopping center dances. Include a few tips that necessitate going into the audience to get the non-dancer to participate in a beginner tip.
4. Fraternal orders, service clubs, city councils, city hall. Generally indoors, and permission is usually granted to perform for a tip or two. After

all, we are officially celebrating Square Dance Week!

5. Parades. Start out with a long or short parade, terminating in a shopping center for dancing.

There are, of course, many other ideas you'll have, but it should be born in mind that Beginner Classes are starting in September and October and these spectators or participants are likely candidates.

I believe that our activity in Northern and Central California is in a healthier aspect than seen for at least a decade, and it is possible we are on another upswing. While we certainly don't want square dancing to be a fad thing,, it's comforting to know that we are holding our own—number wise.

You might consider too, in conclusion, making your project a joint effort. This may involve Association Districts, several clubs within an area, or a group of callers banding together. Anyway, lots of good luck to you in your efforts, and help make this a week we may all remember.
